Subject: Cutten Shooting Investigation

On April 25, 2024, at approximately 10:31 a.m., the Sheriff's Office Emergency Communications Center received a 911 call reporting a person had been shot in the 2400 block of Fern Street, Eureka. Deputies were immediately dispatched to the area. While deputies were enroute, it was learned that a White Male Adult walked up to a 75-year-old woman who was standing in front of her garage with her sister and shot at her multiple times. The woman was struck by gunfire, and the suspect fled on foot westbound on Fern toward Walnut Avenue.

Deputies arrived on the scene at approximately 10:38 a.m. and saw a subject matching the description of the suspect walking on Fern. Two deputies exited the patrol vehicle and contacted the suspect at gunpoint. The suspect refused commands and fled into a residence across the street from the location where the victim was shot. An additional deputy arrived on the scene, and the three deputies surrounded the residence while additional units responded to the scene. At approximately 10:40 a.m., the suspect exited the residence and walked toward the deputies' location, pointing a firearm in the direction of the deputies. The suspect refused commands, and one deputy shot the suspect. The suspect dropped the firearm and fell to the ground. Deputies secured the suspect in handcuffs, and emergency medical assistance was called to the scene. A hasty search was conducted inside the residence to ensure there were no other victims or suspects inside. The deputies then rendered medical aid to the suspect by packing his wounds and performing CPR. Paramedics arrived on the scene and took over the medical care of the suspect and the 75-year-old female victim. Both were subsequently transported to an area hospital where they are receiving treatment for their injuries.

The County Critical Incident Response Team (CIRT) protocol was implemented to investigate the shooting. The Humboldt County District Attorney and the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office are leading the investigation with other county law enforcement investigators. After CIRT investigators collect all the evidence and conduct all the interviews, more information will be released regarding this incident.

This case is still under investigation.

Subject: Officer Involved Shooting – Update

Update for Officer Involved Shooting on 04/25/2024, in the Cutten area of Eureka.

The Humboldt County Sheriff Deputy involved in the April 25, 2024 officer involved shooting is Lieutenant Conan Moore. Lieutenant Moore has over fifteen years of law enforcement service with the Sheriff's Office. Lieutenant Moore remains on paid leave.

On April 27, 2024, suspect Kevin Jeffrey Burks (DOB 06/30/1991) succumbed to the injuries he sustained during the critical incident. A forensic autopsy has been performed and Burk's immediate cause of death was due to a gunshot wound to the chest.

Immediately after the incident occurred, the involved 75-year-old female victim was transported to an out of the area hospital for treatment. She has since been released to the care of a rehabilitation facility where she is undergoing continued treatment.

This case is still under investigation by the Humboldt County Critical Incident Response Team (CIRT).

Affiant's name and agency: Detective Danielle Vickman, Humboldt County Sheriff's Office

Incorporation: The facts in support of this warrant are contained in the Statement of Probable Cause which is incorporated by reference. Incorporated by reference and attached hereto are Exhibit 1A, describing the place(s) to be searched; and Exhibit 1B, describing the evidence to be seized.

FOR THE FOLLOWING PROPERTY:

- 1) **Possessory rights**---Within the authorized search boundaries, any documents, writings, mailings, pictures, drawings, identification, official and legal documents, medical documents, pharmaceutical prescriptions, keys, address books, clothing with identifying names, cellular phones, COMPUTERS AND ASSOCIATED SOFTWARE AND ACCESSORIES; written documentation, whether typed or handwritten, including, but not limited to, computer manuals and instructions for the use of any computers and their accessories as well as documentation containing passwords. All electronic data processing and storage devices, computers and computer systems, such as central processing units, internal and peripheral storage devices such as fixed disks, internal and external hard drives, floppy disk drives and diskettes, tape drives and tapes, optical storage devices, dongles, encryption keys, personal data assistants (PDA's) or other memory storage devices; and any/all peripheral input/output devices such as keyboards, printers, video display monitors, optical readers and related communication devices such as modems, associated telephone sets, speed dialers, and/or other controlling devices, plotters, software to run programs, connecting cables and plugs, peripherals such as joysticks, mouse's, or other input devices, scanners, writing pads, manuals, connecting switches, telephones and telephone cables, and interface devices; system documentation, operating logs and documentation, software and instructional manuals. Computing or data processing software, stored on any type of medium such as: hard disks, floppy disks, CD-R's, CD-RW's, DVD's, cassette tapes, or other permanent or transient storage medium that tends to show possessory rights or privacy expectations within the authorized search boundaries. With respect to the items listed above, the searching Law Enforcement Officers are authorized to seize and book said items. If items capable of storing digital media are located, they will be seized and additional search warrants will be sought for each specific device in compliance with PC1546.
- 2) **TELEPHONES/Cellular phones**: Police officers may answer, record, monitor, note, and converse with callers who appear to be calling in regards to the case being investigated on any telephone or cellular phone within the location(s), vehicle(s), and/or person(s) to be searched without revealing the officers identity. If telephones capable of storing digital media are located, they will be seized and additional search warrants will be sought for each specific device in compliance with PC1546.
- 3) **Scene preservation**--- WITHIN THE AUTHORIZED SEARCH BOUNDARIES, LAW ENFORCEMENT INVESTIGATORS MAY PHOTOGRAPH, VIDEO RECORD, AUDIO RECORD OR MEASURE AS NEEDED TO MEMORIALIZE THE AUTHORIZED SEARCH LOCATION PRE SEARCH AND TO DOCUMENT THE SEARCH PROCESS.
- 4) **Evidence linkage**---within the authorized search boundaries, any evidence that may link the search area to the victim, suspect and any associated evidence that may prove or disprove victim death scenarios including human biological substances such as blood, human tissue, semen, urine, feces and saliva, searches for evidence of latent human blood using Luminal or Fluorescein, trace evidence such as hairs, latent or patent prints, of fingers, palms, feet, latent or patent prints of footwear tread patterns, latent or patent prints of tire patterns, material samples of any cloth material such as clothing, bedding, curtains, carpets, mattress covers, towels, furniture coverings, any vegetation, soil samples, wood, glass, metal or paint samples.
- 5) **Weapons** – Within the authorized search boundary, any item that could have been used to cause a specific wound which may include items of blunt force trauma such as baseball bats, clubs, crowbars, hammers or other tools, materials such as bricks, rocks, sticks or lumber products, constructions products metal products; items which may cause cutting or punctures such as knives, scissors, cutting and chopping instruments, glass or other hard sharp edged items or shard, pointed items such as spearing devices and arrows; items that cause gunshot wounds including firearms, ammunition, holsters, carry cases or bags, firearm manuals, purchase receipts or literature, firearm or ammunition packaging, evidence of fired ammunition such as shell casings, trace powder evidence, bullets, bullet fragments; and any type of lachrymatory item such as oleoresin capsicum spray and/or pepper spray.

- 6) **Surveillance video**---Any records, video files, or data located on game cameras or video surveillance systems that show the crime or parts of the crime or any other evidence associated with the crime whether stored in the allocated or unallocated space of the device hard drives. With respect to surveillance systems, the searching Law Enforcement Officers are authorized to seize and book said surveillance systems and any items listed above. If systems capable of storing digital media are located, they will be seized and additional search warrants will be sought for each specific device in compliance with PC 1546.
- 7) In exigent circumstances per 1546.1(c) your affiant requests he/she be able to access cellular phones and surveillance systems on scene at the premises to be searched as I know that information contained within these systems can lead to locating a suspect(s), coconspirator(s) and/or witnesses
- 8) **Vehicles**--- within the authorized search boundaries. Any vehicles located within any structure and/or any vehicle located on the property or nearby that can be connected to the Victim, Suspect, or involved party through investigative process such as DMV checks, Registration paperwork, keys located at the scene, and/or verbal statements of ownership.

It is further ordered that the peace officers executing this warrant be authorized, pursuant to Penal Code Section 1530, to bring onto the premises whatever professional or expert assistants or consultants that he/she considers necessary in order to., among other things; properly preserve the premises and physical evidence, conduct tests, experiments and re-enactments.

It is further ordered that the peace officers executing this warrant be authorized, pursuant to penal Code 1530, to bring onto the premises person knowledgeable about the premises and or its occupants, furnishing, and other items of personal property normally found within the premises, in order among other things, to determine if any items of personal property are missing or otherwise out of place.

It is further ordered that officers executing this warrant be authorized to conduct or order whatever expert analysis and evaluations are necessary and proper on items received. All such items shall thereafter be maintained and preserved in an appropriate manner according to commonly accepted policies, standards, and appropriate law.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

On 04/25/2024, at approximately 1031 hours, the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office Emergency Communications Center received an open 9-1-1 line with screaming heard in the background. The caller was determined to be (RP/V) 75-year-old [REDACTED] [REDACTED] told Dispatch she was shot twice by a male who walked into her driveway located at [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka (County of Humboldt). [REDACTED] indicated the male had a gun in his right hand and shot her with no warning. [REDACTED] advised the male fled on foot toward Walnut Drive (indicating he was westbound on Fern Street) and was described as wearing all black with some facial hair, possibly black curly hair shoulder length, and possibly wearing glass. [REDACTED] later advised Dispatch the [REDACTED] appeared younger and had a jacket that contained lettering on the back.

HCSO deputies promptly responded to the surrounding Fern Street area and informed Dispatch they thought they were out with the [REDACTED] at Cedar Street and Fern Street. Deputies then immediately communicated the [REDACTED] fled into a nearby residence located at [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka. Shortly after the deputies pursued the [REDACTED] a second reporting party called Dispatch to say they heard additional shots fired and believed the deputies shot the [REDACTED]. HCSO deputies then confirmed "shots fired" and that the [REDACTED] was down.

In reviewing the body worn camera of Deputy T. Rogers and Lt. C. Moore, I observed both deputies to have originally been located on the street in front of [REDACTED] Fern Street. Lt. Moore was armed with a department issued AR-style rifle and Deputy Rogers was armed with his department issued pistol. As both deputies were attempting to locate where the [REDACTED] went on the property, in which he was last seen running to the rear of [REDACTED] Fern Street (where units [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] are located), the [REDACTED] suddenly appeared on the front porch of Unit [REDACTED]. Both deputies can be heard yelling "show me your hands", however the [REDACTED] did not comply. Moments later, Deputy Rogers was heard saying, "He's got a gun!" followed by the sound of shots being fired and confirmation of an officer involved shooting with the [REDACTED] being down. Lt. Moore and Deputy Rogers can be seen approaching the injured [REDACTED], detaining him in handcuffs with the assistance of other deputies, and provided medical aid. A pistol was located near the [REDACTED] and later secured.

The scene spanning from the initial shooting of [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] Fern Street to the [REDACTED] perceived residence located at [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka, was immediately secured by law enforcement. Medical arrived on scene for both injured persons [REDACTED] and the unidentified male [REDACTED]. Preliminary information regarding the medical status of [REDACTED] is that she is in a stable condition and sustained at least one gunshot wound, possibly two; the male [REDACTED] sustained at least two gunshot wounds with one wound to the neck and the other to his hand.

Later, an unidentified female arrived on scene and advised she thought the male was her boyfriend, who had been discharged from St. Joseph's Hospital on this day after experiencing a concussion. The female said the male would still likely have a hospital wrist band on.

While at the hospital, HCSO deputies confirmed the male had a hospital wrist band still on his person, identifying him as [REDACTED] Kevin Burks. In conducting an NCIC/CLETS check of Burks, he has a DMV address registered as [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka. Additionally, Burks has the following firearm registered to him: a Glock, .40 caliber semi-automatic pistol [REDACTED]

It is my training and experiences the above-described property, or a portion thereof, is currently at the described premises and is necessary in proving the cause of death; the circumstance leading to the death; to establish or negate evidence of any possible defense that may be raised by the [REDACTED] and, to circumstantially identify the perpetrator of the crime. The type of assault leading to a homicide generally spawn the type of evidence requested, some of which may have come from the [REDACTED] some from the victim.

Based upon my training, experience and conversations that I have had with other Law Enforcement Officers and/or reports that I have read, I know that Peace Officer(s) or assigned representative(s) should videotape, photograph, and/or take digital images of the scene and surrounding areas during the service of this search warrant. The Peace Officer(s) or representative needs to take measurements and make sketches of the scene and adjacent areas; and seize weapons, bludgeons, and/or guns. They need to take suspected blood and other

physiological fluids; hair and fibers; fingerprints, footprints, and other impressions left at the crime scene. Gunshot residue; any and all instruments used to aid and abet in the commission of crime need to be located and seized. Clothing of the [REDACTED] and or victims(s); photos and film, developed and undeveloped; samples of paint, glass, and other fluids and solids that may have stained or adhered to the clothing and person of the victim(s) and/or [REDACTED] need to be located and seized from the scene.

Based upon my training, experience and conversations that I have had with other Law Enforcement Officers and/or reports that I have has read, I know that during the service of this search warrant there are many articles of personal and/or business property tending to establish the identity of persons who have dominion and control over the premises, business, vehicles, and/or items to be seized. I believe that these items will tend to connect the premises, locations, persons, and vehicle to be searched with the items to be seized and the case being investigated. It is my opinion that these types of items are usually present at the location sought to be searched by this search warrant

Based upon my training, experience and conversations that I have had with other Law Enforcement Officers and/or reports, that I have read, I request to search for and seize any weapons, spent casings, any miscellaneous gun/firearm pieces, ammunition, gun-cleaning items or kits, holsters, ammunition belts, original box packaging materials, clips and/or magazines, targets, expended pieces of lead/bullets, any photographs of firearms, or any paperwork showing the purchase, storage, disposition, and/or dominion and control over any guns, any ammunition, or any of the above items. I believe that whether or not the firearm(s) sought are recovered, the above items would tend to show that a firearm(s) existed and may have once been located in a place to which the [REDACTED] had access, and that these items would tend to connect the [REDACTED] with the weapon(s) sought. The above items are not normally disposed of after the commission of a crime, and they are therefore still likely to be found in any location or vehicles to be-searched, and/or on the person of any [REDACTED] to be searched pursuant to this search warrant. Your affiant knows that when a weapon is used during homicide ballistic evidence can be obtained from the firearm itself. Unique gun barrel characteristics and firing pin characteristics can be obtained by experts. These findings can then be compared to a bullet itself or used for DNA typing, or finger print identification. Your affiant knows that finger prints and DNA both from the [REDACTED] and the victim can be found on a weapon.

Your affiant knows that when a homicide occurs DNA evidence can be transferred from the victim to the [REDACTED] or vice versa via blood, other bodily fluids or trace evidence.

Based upon my training, experience and conversations that I have had with other Law Enforcement Officers and/or reports that I have read, it is my opinion that the persons mentioned and other unknown persons are engaged in a conspiracy to commit felony crimes and that such persons often communicate with each other and coordinate their illegal activities by telephone, cellular phone, and/or computer. The searching officers should be able to answer any telephones in the location(s) to be searched and conceal their identities; such conversations may constitute evidence of a felony and may identify other conspirators.

Based upon my training, experience and conversations that I have had with other Law Enforcement Officers and/or reports that I have read, I know that cellular phones computer and computer systems commonly consist of electronic data processing and storage devices, with central processing units, internal and peripheral storage devices such as fixed disks, external hard disks, floppy disk drives and diskettes, tape drives and tapes, optical storage devices, dongles or encryption keys, personal data assistants (PDA's) or other memory storage devices. They also consist of peripheral input/output devices such as keyboards, printers, video display monitors, optical readers and related) communication devices such as modems, associated telephone sets, speed dialers, or other controlling devices, plotters, software to run programs, connecting cables and plugs, peripherals such as joysticks, mouses, or other input devices, scanners, writing pads, manuals, connecting switches, telephones and telephone cables, and interface devices. There is system documentation, operating logs and documentation, software and instructional manuals for the computers and computer systems. Computing or data processing software, stored on any type of medium such as: hard disks, floppy disks, CD-Rs, CD-RWs, DVDs, cassette tapes, or other permanent or transient storage medium and other forms of magnetic media containing computer information. I request any records, whether stored on paper, on magnetic media such as tape, cassette, disk, diskette or on

memory storage devices such as optical disks, programmable instruments such as cell phones, telephones, "electronic calendar\address books" calculators, or any other storage media, together with indicia of use, ownership, possession, or control of such records. I know that accessing a cellular phone on scene at the premises to be searched can lead to locating a suspect(s), coconspirator(s) and/or witnesses. I request any written or computer communication in printed or stored medium such as E-Mail and Chat Logs whether in active files, deleted files or unallocated space on the hard drive, floppy drive or any data storage media. If systems capable of storing digital media are located, they will be seized and additional search warrants will be sought for each specific device in compliance with PC1546.

Your affiant seeks permission to remove all items described above for examination at the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office or other facility, because the contents of these items or containers are not readily apparent by visual inspection. The items may require the use, of special equipment to see if it contains material described in Exhibit 1A. In the event that one or more of the items described above are located, it would take hours or even days to go through on the premises. This would lead to undue interference with the place to be searched and would represent an undue interference with your affiant's other assigned duties.

It is further ordered that the peace officers executing this warrant be authorized, pursuant to Penal Code Section 1530, to bring onto the premises whatever professional or expert assistants or consultants that he/she considers necessary in order to, among other things; properly preserve the premises and physical evidence, conduct tests, experiments and re-enactments.

It is further ordered that the peace officers executing this warrant be authorized, pursuant to penal Code 1530, to bring onto the premises person knowledgeable about the premises and or its occupants, furnishing, and other items of personal property normally found within the premises, in order among other things, to determine if any items of personal property are missing or otherwise out of place.

It is further ordered that officers executing this warrant be authorized to conduct or order whatever expert analysis and evaluations are necessary and proper on items received. All such items shall thereafter be maintained and preserved in an appropriate manner according to commonly accepted policies, standards, and appropriate law.

Therefore, based on my training, experience, and the above facts, I believe I have substantial cause to believe the property described in Exhibit 1B or a portion thereof will be at the premises described in Exhibit 1A when the warrant is served.

Described as a multi-family triplex home with three residences on one lot. Each of the three units share a connecting wall with another unit and are share common/communal ground, however, each unit is designated as a separate residence with specific unit numbers.

Each unit is described as being white in color with the main unit being plainly marked on the front of the residence with [REDACTED]. The unit [REDACTED] is closest to the Fern Street curb and points in a south facing direction and is surrounded by a waist high brown fence. Located in the front metal screen door of unit [REDACTED] is a bullet hole, and a second bullet hole located just to the left of its front door. Additionally, there is a "Ring" camera located on the front of unit [REDACTED].

To the east of the unit is a single car driveway leading to additional dwellings/units. On the driveway fence are unit numbers [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] plainly marked. In proceeding north on the driveway, the two additional units are on the left-hand side with their front doors facing east. A door which is marked as [REDACTED] contains stickers. Just to the north of [REDACTED] is another door, marked as [REDACTED] however the [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] numbers are missing but still contains the sticky residue where the numbers were once located.

This is to include any and all outbuildings, garages, shed, and vehicles located on the multi-family premises.

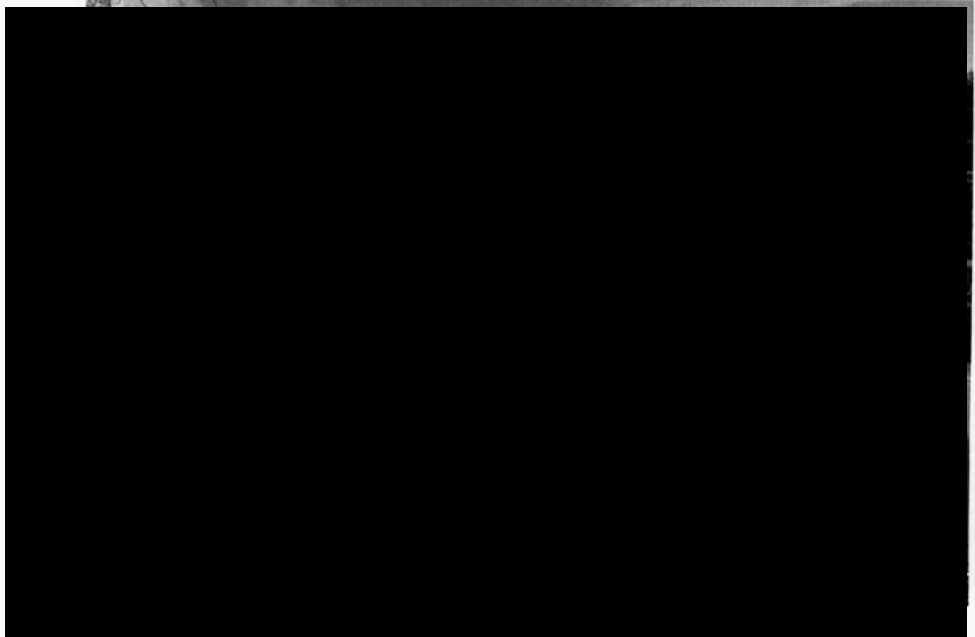
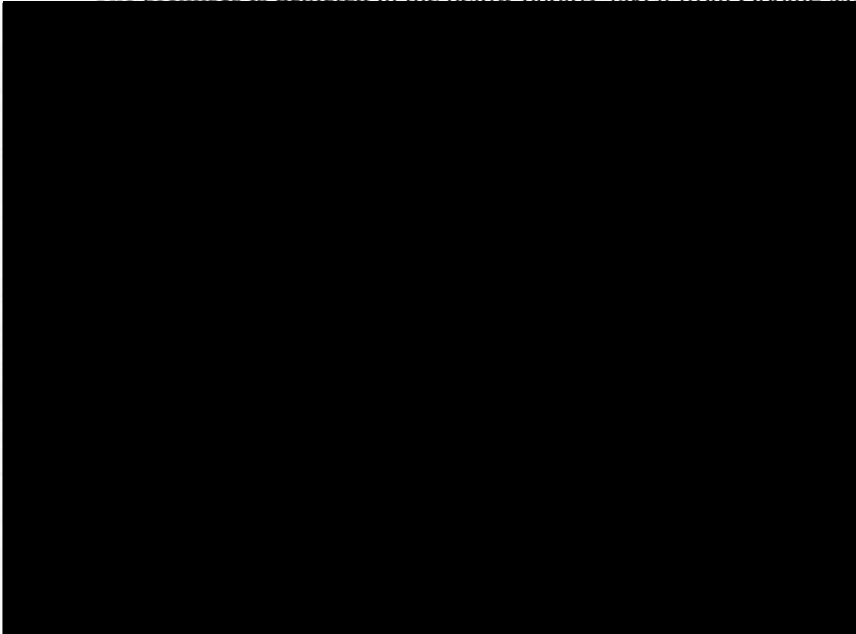

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

On 04/25/2024, at approximately 1031 hours, the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office Emergency Communications Center received an open 9-1-1 line with screaming heard in the background. The caller was determined to be (RP/V) 75-year-old [REDACTED] [REDACTED] told Dispatch she was shot twice by a male who walked into her driveway located at [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka (County of Humboldt). [REDACTED] indicated the male had a gun in his right hand and shot her with no warning. [REDACTED] advised the male fled on foot toward Walnut Drive (indicating he was westbound on Fern Street) and was described as wearing all black with some facial hair, possibly black curly hair shoulder length, and possibly wearing glass. [REDACTED] later advised Dispatch the [REDACTED] appeared younger and had a jacket that contained lettering on the back.

HCSO deputies promptly responded to the surrounding Fern Street area and informed Dispatch they thought they were out with the [REDACTED] at Cedar Street and Fern Street. Deputies then immediately communicated the [REDACTED] fled into a nearby residence located at [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka. Shortly after the deputies pursued the [REDACTED] a second reporting party called Dispatch to say they heard additional shots fired and believed the deputies shot the [REDACTED]. HCSO deputies then confirmed "shots fired" and that the [REDACTED] was down.

In reviewing the body worn camera of Deputy T. Rogers and Lt. C. Moore, I observed both deputies to have originally been located on the street in front of [REDACTED] Fern Street. Lt. Moore was armed with a department issued AR-style rifle and Deputy Rogers was armed with his department issued pistol. As both deputies were attempting to locate where the [REDACTED] went on the property, in which he was last seen running to the rear of [REDACTED] Fern Street (where units [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] are located), the [REDACTED] suddenly appeared on the front porch of Unit [REDACTED]. Both deputies can be heard yelling "show me your hands", however the [REDACTED] did not comply. Moments later, Deputy Rogers was heard saying, "He's got a gun!" followed by the sound of shots being fired and confirmation of an officer involved shooting with the [REDACTED] being down. Lt. Moore and Deputy Rogers can be seen approaching the injured [REDACTED] retaining him in handcuffs with the assistance of other deputies, and provided medical aid. A pistol was located near the [REDACTED] and later secured.

The scene spanning from the initial shooting of [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] Fern Street to the [REDACTED] perceived residence located at [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka, was immediately secured by law enforcement. Medical arrived on scene for both injured persons [REDACTED] and the unidentified male [REDACTED]. Preliminary information regarding the medical status of [REDACTED] is that she is in a stable condition and sustained at least one gunshot wound, possibly two; the male [REDACTED] sustained at least two gunshot wounds with one wound to the neck and the other to his hand.

Later, an unidentified female arrived on scene and advised she thought the male was her boyfriend, who had been discharged from St. Joseph's Hospital on this day after experiencing a concussion. The female said the male would still likely have a hospital wrist band on.

While at the hospital, HCSO deputies confirmed the male had a hospital wrist band still on his person, identifying him as [REDACTED]. In conducting an NCIC/CLETS check of [REDACTED] he has a DMV address registered as [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka. Additionally, [REDACTED] has the following firearm registered to him: a Glock, .40 caliber semi-automatic pistol (serial #: [REDACTED]).

It is my training and experiences the above-described property, or a portion thereof, is currently at the described premises and is necessary in proving the cause of death; the circumstance leading to the death; to establish or negate evidence of any possible defense that may be raised by the [REDACTED] and, to circumstantially identify the perpetrator of the crime. The type of assault leading to a homicide generally spawn the type of evidence requested, some of which may have come from the [REDACTED] some from the victim.

Based upon my training, experience and conversations that I have had with other Law Enforcement Officers and/or reports that I have read, I know that Peace Officer(s) or assigned representative(s) should videotape, photograph, and/or take digital images of the scene and surrounding areas during the service of this search warrant. The Peace Officer(s) or representative needs to take measurements and make sketches of the scene and adjacent areas; and seize weapons, bludgeons, and/or guns. They need to take suspected blood and other

physiological fluids; hair and fibers; fingerprints, footprints, and other impressions left at the crime scene. Gunshot residue; any and all instruments used to aid and abet in the commission of crime need to be located and seized. Clothing of the [REDACTED] and or victims(s); photos and film, developed and undeveloped; samples of paint, glass, and other fluids and solids that may have stained or adhered to the clothing and person of the victim(s) and/or [REDACTED] need to be located and seized from the scene.

Based upon my training, experience and conversations that I have had with other Law Enforcement Officers and/or reports that I have has read, I know that during the service of this search warrant there are many articles of personal and/or business property tending to establish the identity of persons who have dominion and control over the premises, business, vehicles, and/or items to be seized. I believe that these items will tend to connect the premises, locations, persons, and vehicle to be searched with the items to be seized and the case being investigated. It is my opinion that these types of items are usually present at the location sought to be searched by this search warrant

Based upon my training, experience and conversations that I have had with other Law Enforcement Officers and/or reports, that I have read, I request to search for and seize any weapons, spent casings, any miscellaneous gun/firearm pieces, ammunition, gun-cleaning items or kits, holsters, ammunition belts, original box packaging materials, clips and/or magazines, targets, expended pieces of lead/bullets, any photographs of firearms, or any paperwork showing the purchase, storage, disposition, and/or dominion and control over any guns, any ammunition, or any of the above items. I believe that whether or not the firearm(s) sought are recovered, the above items would tend to show that a firearm(s) existed and may have once been located in a place to which the [REDACTED] had access, and that these items would tend to connect the [REDACTED] with the weapon(s) sought. The above items are not normally disposed of after the commission of a crime, and they are therefore still likely to be found in any location or vehicles to be-searched, and/or on the person of any [REDACTED] to be searched pursuant to this search warrant. Your affiant knows that when a weapon is used during homicide ballistic evidence can be obtained from the firearm itself. Unique gun barrel characteristics and firing pin characteristics can be obtained by experts. These findings can then be compared to a bullet itself or used for DNA typing, or finger print identification. Your affiant knows that finger prints and DNA both from the [REDACTED] and the victim can be found on a weapon.

Your affiant knows that when a homicide occurs DNA evidence can be transferred from the victim to the [REDACTED] or vice versa via blood, other bodily fluids or trace evidence.

Based upon my training, experience and conversations that I have had with other Law Enforcement Officers and/or reports that I have read, it is my opinion that the persons mentioned and other unknown persons are engaged in a conspiracy to commit felony crimes and that such persons often communicate with each other and coordinate their illegal activities by telephone, cellular phone, and/or computer. The searching officers should be able to answer any telephones in the location(s) to be searched and conceal their identities; such conversations may constitute evidence of a felony and may identify other conspirators.

Based upon my training, experience and conversations that I have had with other Law Enforcement Officers and/or reports that I have read, I know that cellular phones computer and computer systems commonly consist of electronic data processing and storage devices, with central processing units, internal and peripheral storage devices such as fixed disks, external hard disks, floppy disk drives and diskettes, tape drives and tapes, optical storage devices, dongles or encryption keys, personal data assistants (PDA's) or other memory storage devices. They also consist of peripheral input/output devices such as keyboards, printers, video display monitors, optical readers and related) communication devices such as modems, associated telephone sets, speed dialers, or other controlling devices, plotters, software to run programs, connecting cables and plugs, peripherals such as joysticks, mouses, or other input devices, scanners, writing pads, manuals, connecting switches, telephones and telephone cables, and interface devices. There is system documentation, operating logs and documentation, software and instructional manuals for the computers and computer systems. Computing or data processing software, stored on any type of medium such as: hard disks, floppy disks, CD-Rs, CD-RWs, DVDs, cassette tapes, or other permanent or transient storage medium and other forms of magnetic media containing computer information. I request any records, whether stored on paper, on magnetic media such as tape, cassette, disk, diskette or on

memory storage devices such as optical disks, programmable instruments such as cell phones, telephones, "electronic calendar\address books" calculators, or any other storage media, together with indicia of use, ownership, possession, or control of such records. I know that accessing a cellular phone on scene at the-premises to be searched can lead to locating a [REDACTED] coconspirator(s) and/or witnesses. I request any written or computer communication in printed or stored medium such as E-Mail and Chat Logs whether in active files, deleted files or unallocated space on the hard drive, floppy drive or any data storage media. If systems capable of storing digital media are located, they will be seized and additional search warrants will be sought for each specific device in compliance with PC1546.

Your affiant seeks permission to remove all items described above for examination at the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office or other facility, because the contents of these items or containers are not readily apparent by visual inspection. The items may require the use, of special equipment to see if it contains material described in Exhibit 1A. In the event that one or more of the items described above are located, it would take hours or even days to go through on the premises. This would lead to undue interference with the place to be searched and would represent an undue interference with your affiant's other assigned duties.

Medical arrived on scene for both injured persons ([REDACTED] and the unidentified male [REDACTED]). Preliminary information regarding the medical status of [REDACTED] is that she is in a stable condition and sustained at least one gunshot wound, possibly two; the male [REDACTED] sustained at least two gunshot wounds with one wound to the neck and the other to his hand.

Later, an unidentified female arrived on scene and advised she thought the male was her boyfriend, who had been discharged from St. Joseph's Hospital earlier in the day (04/25/2024) [REDACTED]. The female said the male would still likely have a hospital wrist band on.

While at the hospital, HCSO deputies confirmed the male had a hospital wrist band still on his person, identifying him as [REDACTED]. Additionally, [REDACTED] had the following firearm registered to him: a Glock, .40 caliber semi-automatic pistol ([REDACTED]). On 04/25/2024, I authored a search warrant for APN [REDACTED], which was the lot where [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka, was located. On the same day, at 1440 hours, the Honorable Judge Steven Steward granted the search warrant (#: SW2400301). The search warrant was promptly executed upon the residence, wherein numerous evidentiary items were located. One item, a black and gray electronic video doorbell, was seen positioned outside of the residence, just to the east of the front door. This video doorbell, if in a functioning condition, would have undoubtedly captured video and/or audio of the officer involved shooting involving [REDACTED]. At the time, law enforcement left the video doorbell in place under the belief that it was a cloud-based service where a search warrant could later be sought for the electronic data. 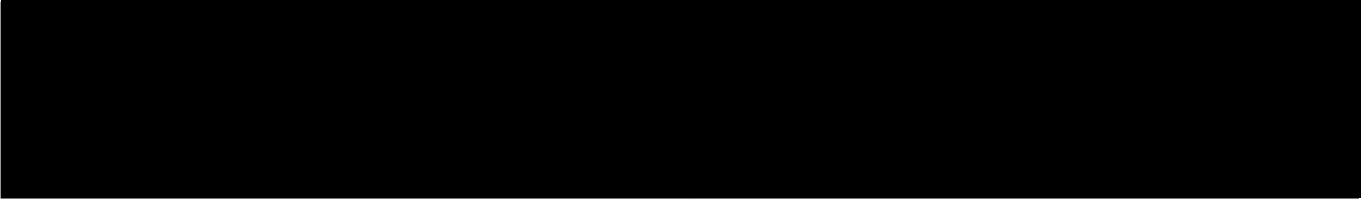

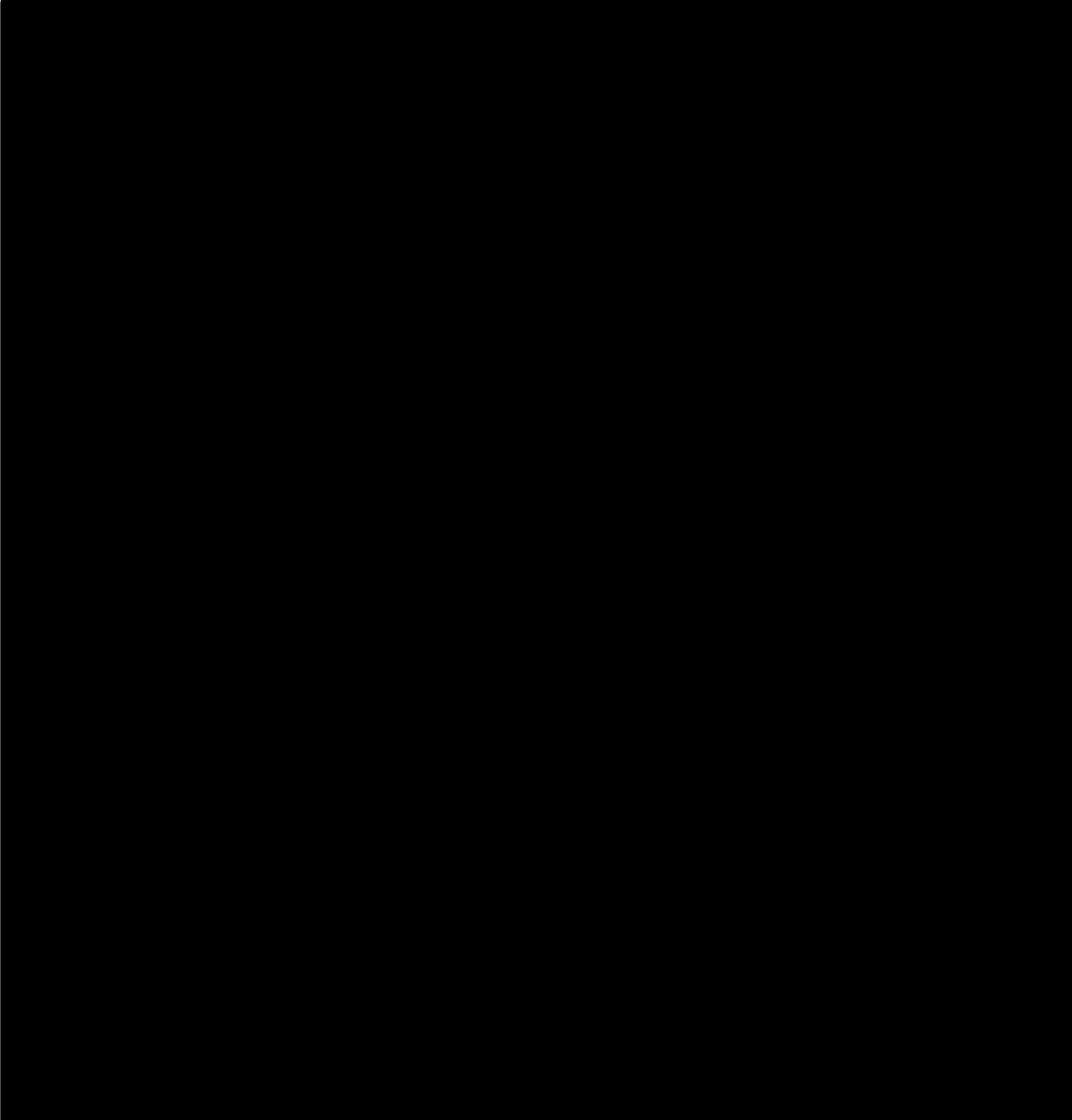

SUMMARY

The item 016 Glock pistol and the item 046 Colt rifle were both determined to be functional.

The item 031 expended cartridge case was fired in the item 016 Glock pistol. The items 013, 014, and 015 expended cartridge cases were fired in the item 046 Colt rifle.

Examination of the items 026 and 027 expended bullets was inconclusive. The bullets could have been fired from the item 016 Glock pistol or from any other firearm with similar class characteristics.

I generated the following evidence during examination of the pistol listed above on June 4, 2024:

- Item 016t: Three cartridge cases and three bullets test fired in the item 016 Glock pistol

EXAMINATION

The Glock pistol and related evidence

Item 016 is a Glock model 23 pistol marked with serial number [REDACTED]. The pistol was chambered for the 40 S&W cartridge and was fitted with a weapon-mounted light with an integrated aiming laser. I function tested and test fired the pistol three times using laboratory supplied ammunition and a laboratory supplied Glock pistol magazine. I determined that the item 016 Glock pistol was functional. Test-fired bullets and cartridge cases were retained as item 0016t.

EXAMINATION (continued)

Item 031 was identified as an expended 40 S&W cartridge case. The cartridge case was compared to the item 016t cartridge cases. Based on matching firearm-related class characteristics and significant correspondence of individualizing detail, I determined that the item 031 cartridge case was fired in the item 016 Glock pistol.

Items 026 and 027 were each identified as expended nominal 40 caliber bullets. Both bullets showed significant damage and had an undetermined number of right-hand twist polygonal rifling. While the visible firearm-related class characteristics were the same, damage to both bullets was significant enough that neither was suitable for microscopic comparison to bullets test fired from the item 016 Glock pistol. Therefore, the items 026 and 027 bullets could have been fired from the item 016 Glock pistol or from any other firearm with similar class characteristics.

Item 017 was not opened or analyzed.

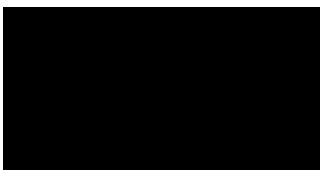
The Colt rifle and related evidence

Item 046 is a Colt model M4 Carbine rifle marked with serial number [REDACTED]. The rifle was chambered for the 5.56 NATO cartridge and capable of firing the 223 Remington cartridge. The rifle was fitted with a functional red-dot sight and flashlight. The rifle was semi-automatic only with a functional two-position safety selector switch on the left side of the lower receiver only. I function tested and test fired the rifle three times using laboratory supplied ammunition and a laboratory supplied AR-platform rifle magazine. I determined that the item 046 Colt rifle was functional. Test-fired cartridge cases were retained as item 0046t; bullets test fired in the rifle were not retained.

Items 013, 014, and 015 were each identified as expended 223 Remington cartridge cases. The cartridge cases were compared to the item 046t cartridge cases. Based on matching firearm-related class characteristics and significant correspondence of individualizing detail, I determined that each of the items 013, 014, and 015 expended cartridge cases were fired in the item 046 Colt rifle.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

On 04/25/2024, at approximately 1031 hours, the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office Emergency Communications Center received an open 9-1-1 line with screaming heard in the background. The caller was determined to be (RP/V) 75-year-old [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. The information entered into the call for service by Dispatch is as follows:

They've been shot. Transfer to medical for instructions. RP states they were shot twice. Male walked into the driveway, had a gun in the right hand and then shot her twice with no warning. RP is 75 years old and says it happened ten minutes ago. Can't see anything, says blood is everywhere.

As the incident progressed dispatch received a description of the [REDACTED]

10:33:02hrs. "[REDACTED] LSW all black, some facial hair, blk curly hair shoulder length. Poss wearing glasses"

10:34:49hrs. "[REDACTED] Appeared younger, LSW/jacket with lettering on the back." (lettering believed to mean lettering).

The address of the incident detailed above was [REDACTED] Fern St., in Eureka, CA. HCSO deputies responded to the surrounding incident area and informed dispatch they thought they were out with the [REDACTED] at Cedar Street and Fern Street. Deputies then immediately communicated the [REDACTED] fled into a nearby residence located at [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka. Shortly after the deputies pursued the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] sister ([REDACTED] [REDACTED] who was with [REDACTED] and on the line with dispatch said that she heard additional shots fired. [REDACTED] informed dispatch she believed the deputies shot the [REDACTED]. HCSO deputies then confirmed "shots fired" and that the [REDACTED] was down.

In reviewing the body worn camera of Deputy T. Rogers and LT. C. Moore, both deputies appeared to be located on the street in front of [REDACTED] Fern Street. This structure was later determined to be a tri-plex with each unit having a unique address on Fern St. LT. Moore was armed with a department issued AR-style rifle and Deputy Rogers was armed with his pistol. Both deputies were attempting to maintain sight of the entrance while directing responding units to establish a perimeter when the suspect exited Unit [REDACTED]. Both deputies can be heard yelling "show me your hands", however the [REDACTED] did not comply. Moments later, Deputy Rogers was heard saying, "He's got a gun!" followed by the sound of shots being fired and confirmation of an officer involved shooting with the [REDACTED] being down. LT. Moore and Deputy Rogers can be seen approaching the injured [REDACTED] detaining him in handcuffs with the assistance of other deputies, and providing medical aid. A pistol was located near the [REDACTED] and later secured.

Responding units were also directed to [REDACTED] Fern St. to contact [REDACTED] since the shooting of the [REDACTED] later identified as [REDACTED], occurred with the first units to arrive on scene.

It was determined [REDACTED] owned the residence located at [REDACTED] Fern St., and had arrived at the property to meet her adult nephew who was going to remodel the house. During that time [REDACTED] approached [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and the nephew twice. The first approach was in the driveway of [REDACTED] Fern St. and at that time, [REDACTED] asked the three if they remembered him. Neither [REDACTED] [REDACTED] or their nephew knew [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] left and then returned a little while later, shooting [REDACTED] twice. [REDACTED] fled the residence.

Later a search warrant was authored by HCSO Det. Vickman for [REDACTED] Fern St., which was authorized by Humboldt County Superior Court Judge Steven Steward.

[REDACTED] later identified Burks as the person who shot [REDACTED] in a double-blind photo lineup administered by HCSO Cpl. Anderson.

1 On 04/25/2024, I was working for the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office as a Patrol Sergeant in the Eureka area.
2 At approximately 1031 hours, I heard deputies being dispatched to a report of a gunshot victim at Fern
3 Street. I began responding code 3 from the Sheriff's Main Station.

4
5 While enroute, via radio and MDT updates, I learned that the [REDACTED] had fled on foot, wearing all black, some
6 facial hair, and black curly hair. At approximately 1038 hours, I heard over the radio, Lt. Moore broadcast he was
7 possibly out with the subject at Cedar and Fern Street. Moments later, I was updated via radio that the [REDACTED]
8 fled into [REDACTED] Fern Street.

9
10 As I was turning onto Fern St, I was updated by HCSO Dispatch that an additional reporting party was reporting
11 that shots were fired by law enforcement. I arrived on scene and parked next to a Sheriff's Office truck that I
12 recognized and Deputy Rogers. I unholstered my duty pistol and ran to the front walkway of the residence. I
13 could see Lt. Moore holding cover on a screen style front door with his rifle up. Sgt. Gomes and Deputy Truex
14 were covering the [REDACTED] who was on his back, with their rifles while Deputy Rogers rolled the [REDACTED] to his
15 stomach. I could see a large volume of blood on the [REDACTED] neck/head area and a pool of blood on the concrete
16 walkway. With assistance from Deputy Rogers, I detained the [REDACTED] in handcuffs.

17
18 I then linked up with Lt. Moore and Deputy Rogers to conduct a safety sweep of the residence. We announced
19 ourselves as Sheriff's Deputies and entered to clear the house. No additional persons were located.

20
21 Upon exiting the residence, I immediately began evaluating the [REDACTED] condition. I could see through and
22 through trauma to his left hand. I rolled him to his back and I could see a large amount of blood coming from his
23 neck. Deputy Truex had a med kit and had opened a pack of wound pack gauze. On the [REDACTED] neck, just left of
24 center, I could see a hole, consistent with a gunshot entry wound, actively bleeding. I took the wound pack from
25 Deputy Truex and began packing the wound track. While doing so, I unzipped the [REDACTED] zip-up style hoodie
26 and directed Deputy Truex to use med shears to cut the [REDACTED] shirt open. Once this was done, I was able to
27 observe no additional wounds. I continued to pack gauze into the [REDACTED] neck wound until the entirety of the
28 gauze was packed in. I maintained heavy pressure on the wound while monitoring for any sign of a pulse. I felt
29 several sporadic weak heartbeats on the [REDACTED] right carotid artery but then felt nothing further. I informed
30 Deputy Rogers of this and he began giving chest compressions. Deputy Rogers and I switched back and forth with
31 chest compressions until Humboldt Bay Fire and City Ambulance personnel arrived on scene and took over
32 lifesaving efforts. Prior to the [REDACTED] being loaded onto a gurney for transport, I removed my handcuffs at the
33 request of medical personnel. I secured my handcuffs in the trunk of my patrol vehicle so they could be
34 photographed due to having [REDACTED] blood on them.

35
36 Once the [REDACTED] was transported to the hospital, I directed incoming deputies to start canvassing the area for
37 any witnesses and/or cameras. At this time, Humboldt Bay Fire Battalion Chief Tim Citro returned to the scene to
38 provide me the names of fire personnel that were on scene with him. They are as follows:

4 Division (MCD) when I was notified an officer-involved shooting (OIS) had just occurred at [REDACTED] Fern Street,
5 Eureka (County of Humboldt). HCSO MCD Sergeant B. Massaro activated a Critical Incident Response Team
6 (CIRT) call-out. I was directed to respond to the HCSO MCD briefing room for a briefing and assignment to the
7 investigation.

8
9 **BRIEFING AT HCSO MCD:**

10
11 On 04/25/2024, HCSO Lieutenant K. Holt led the initial briefing and informed the CIRT (consisting of law
12 enforcement investigators, detectives, and evidence technicians from the HCSO, Eureka Police Department,
13 Arcata Police Department, Humboldt County District Attorney's Office, the California Highway Patrol and more)
14 of the following:

15
16 On 04/25/2024, at approximately 1031 hours, the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office Emergency
17 Communications Center received an open 9-1-1 line with screaming heard in the background. The caller
18 was determined to be (RP/V) 75-year-old [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] told Dispatch she was shot twice by a male
19 who walked into her driveway located at [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka (County of Humboldt). [REDACTED] indicated
20 the male had a gun in his right hand and shot her with no warning. [REDACTED] advised the male fled on foot
21 toward Walnut Drive (indicating he was westbound on Fern Street) and was described as wearing all
22 black with some facial hair, possibly black curly hair shoulder length, and possibly wearing glasses. [REDACTED]
23 later advised Dispatch the [REDACTED] appeared younger and had a jacket that contained lettering on the
24 back.

25
26 HCSO Deputies promptly responded to the surrounding Fern Street area and informed Dispatch they
27 thought they were out with the [REDACTED] at Cedar Street and Fern Street. Deputies then immediately
28 communicated the [REDACTED] fled into a nearby residence located at [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka. Shortly
29 after the deputies pursued the [REDACTED] a second reporting party called Dispatch to say they heard
30 additional shots fired and believed the Deputies shot the [REDACTED] HCSO Deputies then confirmed "shots
31 fired" and that the [REDACTED] was down.

32
33 The scene, spanning from the initial shooting of [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] Fern Street to the [REDACTED] perceived
34 residence located at [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka, was immediately secured by law enforcement. Medical
35 arrived on scene for both injured persons ([REDACTED] and the unidentified male [REDACTED] Preliminary
36 information regarding the medical status of [REDACTED] was that she was in a stable condition and sustained at
37 least one gunshot wound, possibly two; the male [REDACTED] sustained at least two gunshot wounds with
38 one wound to the neck and the other to his hand.

39
40 An unidentified female arrived on Fern Street and advised law enforcement she thought the male
41 [REDACTED] was her boyfriend, who had recently been discharged from St. Joseph's Hospital after
42 experiencing a concussion. The female said the male would likely still have a hospital wrist band on.

1 While at the hospital, HCSO Deputies confirmed the male had a hospital wrist band still on his person,
2 identifying him as [REDACTED]
3

4 Prior to being given CIRT assignments, CIRT reviewed the body worn camera available from HCSO Deputy T.
5 Rogers and HCSO Lt. C. Moore, who were first to arrive on scene and involved in the OIS. I observed both
6 deputies to have originally been located on the street in front of [REDACTED] Fern Street. Lt. Moore was armed with a
7 department issued AR-style rifle and Deputy Rogers was armed with a department issued pistol. As both
8 deputies were attempting to locate where the [REDACTED] went on the property, in which he was last seen running
9 to the rear of [REDACTED] Fern Street, the [REDACTED] suddenly appeared on the front porch. Both deputies could be heard
10 yelling something to the effect of: "Show me your hands". Moments later, Deputy Rogers was heard saying
11 something to the effect of: "He's got a gun!" followed by the sound of shots being fired and confirmation of an
12 OIS with the [REDACTED] down. Lt. Moore and Deputy Rogers could be seen approaching the injured [REDACTED]
13 detaining him in handcuffs with the assistance of other deputies, and providing medical aid. A pistol was located
14 near the [REDACTED] and later secured. It was confirmed on scene that Lt. Moore was the only deputy to have fired
15 his weapon, while Deputy Rogers was an active witness.
16

17 Based on the foregoing information, it was determined the CIRT team leader/co-leader were HCSO Investigator
18 D. Henderson and DA Investigator G. Hill. I was assigned to remain at the HCSO MCD Office and complete all
19 necessary search warrants for the crime scene.
20

21 **SEARCH WARRANTS AUTHORED:**

22
23 On 04/25/2024, based upon the foregoing information, I authored two search warrants: one (1) search warrant
24 for the OIS crime scene located at APN [REDACTED], [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka CA 95503; and one (1) search
25 warrant for the civilian shooting crime scene located at [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka CA 95503. At 1440 hours, the
26 Honorable Judge Steven Steward granted both search warrants: APN [REDACTED] (#: SW2400301) and [REDACTED]
27 Fern Street (#: SW2400302). I immediately called Inv. Henderson and advised him both search warrants were
28 granted and units on scene could execute them.
29

30 **RESPONSE TO FERN STREET CRIME SCENES:**

31
32 On 04/25/2024, at around 1524 hours, I responded to Fern Street and entered the crime scene areas. I brought
33 copies of the granted search warrants to be left at the respective crime scenes at the conclusive of their
34 execution.
35

36 While at [REDACTED] Fern Street, I assisted in attempting to locate two shell casings, presumed to have been left behind
37 by the [REDACTED] following him shooting [REDACTED] Based upon statements provided by [REDACTED] and other witnesses, it was
38 believed the [REDACTED] had stood at the edge of the driveway which met the public curb when he fired two shots.
39 Additionally, I observed two bullet holes in the garage door of the residence with a trajectory in a southern
40 direction. This information caused investigators to believe shell casings would be located near or in the grass of
41 the front yard. Due to an extreme overgrowth of vegetation and black berry bushes in the front yard, I, and
42 other investigators began removing vegetation from the area by hand. I was unable to locate any shell casings,

1 however, I was later notified one shell casing was located by CA Department of Fish and Wildlife Warden S.
2 Embry and his K9 (certified in firearms and ammunition detection).

3
4 While at [REDACTED] Fern Street, I acted only as an observant and witness to law enforcement's attempts (and later
5 success) at extracting a bullet lodged into the siding of the residence.

6
7 **FOLLOW-UP:**

8
9 On 04/26/2024, HCSO Investigator J. Taylor asked for my assistance in identifying the brand of a video doorbell. I
10 was previously aware there was a black and gray electronic video doorbell located on the front of the residence
11 at [REDACTED] Fern Street that had been left on scene under the belief that it was a cloud-based service where a search
12 warrant could later be sought for the electronic data. In conducting basic research of the video doorbell, I
13 learned there were dozens of different brands all appearing to be a similar video doorbell model. Additionally,
14 all various branded models indicated the devices' ability to have an SD card located within the device, meaning
15 electronic evidence was located on the device itself, and not in a cloud-based service as originally presumed.
16 Based upon the foregoing information, I authored a search warrant to return to [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka, to
17 physically seize the video doorbell. At 1100 hours, the Honorable Judge Steven Steward granted the search
18 warrant (#: SW2400304).

19
20 On 04/26/2024, at around 1130 hours, Investigator J. Taylor and I responded to [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka. I
21 knocked on the door and announced myself as HCSO executing a search warrant. No persons responded or
22 answered the door; Inv. Taylor and I observed the video doorbell affixed to the outside wall to the east of the
23 front door. We removed the video doorbell; I left a copy of the search warrant and its inventory form in between
24 the front door and the screen door. Upon returning to the HCSO Main Station, Inv. Taylor and I removed the
25 doorbell device screws and removed the battery to preserve any evidence that may have been recorded.
26 Underneath the battery, we located a 32 GB micro-SD card. Inv. Taylor provided the SD card to HCSO Forensic
27 Specialist [REDACTED] which was booked into the HCSO Property Division (826 4th Street, Eureka) under
28 evidence item #: 202401627-035.

29
30 On 05/01/2024, Inv. Henderson asked me to author a search warrant to view the electronic data contained on
31 the 32 GB micro-SD card, identified as HCSO Evidence Item #: 202401627-035. At 1315 hours, the Honorable
32 Judge Steven Steward granted the search warrant (#: SW2400312). I provided the search warrant to FS [REDACTED]
33 for execution.

34
35 **DISPOSITION:**

37 This supplemental report documents my involvement and assistance in this case. Any further follow-up will be
38 documented in a separate report.

1 On 04/25/24 at 1054 hours, a CIRT (Critical Incident Response Team) call out was initiated for an officer involved
2 shooting.

3
4 Members of the CIRT responded to HCSO (Humboldt County Sheriff's Office) to brief on the incident. Once the
5 team had arrived, I learned the following:

6
7 On 04/25/24, HCSO received a 911 call regarding an elderly female who was shot by an unknown male [REDACTED]
8 This incident occurred at the elderly females residence, located at [REDACTED] Fern Street in Eureka. A description of
9 the male [REDACTED] was given to responding deputies. Lt. Moore and Deputy Rogers arrived in the area and located
10 a subject matching the description of the male [REDACTED] Lt. Moore and Deputy Rogers attempted to contact the
11 male, but he eventually fled into a residence located at [REDACTED] Fern Street. Several minutes later, the male [REDACTED]
12 exited the residence with a firearm in his hand and Lt. Moore shot at the [REDACTED] with Deputy Roger's
13 department issued rifle. It was reported the [REDACTED] was "down" and had injuries. I learned the elderly female
14 and the male [REDACTED] were both transported to an area hospital for treatment.

15
16 Investigator Henderson and Humboldt County District Attorney Investigator Greg Hill were assigned as the lead
17 investigators for the case. I was assigned to respond to the incident location and assist with processing the
18 shooting scenes for evidence. Also assigned to assist me was Arcata Police Department Detective Sgt. Altizer and
19 HCSO Forensic Specialist [REDACTED]

20
21 I arrived on scene at about 1221 hours. Sgt. Altizer and I stood by while FS [REDACTED] processed the scene, which
22 included scanning the area, taking photographs and collecting evidence. FS [REDACTED] also arrived on scene and
23 assisted FS [REDACTED]

24
25 Items of note from [REDACTED] Fern: Three rifle casings were located in the roadway in front of the residence; a Glock
26 semi-auto handgun was located on the walkway near the front door of the residence; a suspected bullet hole
27 was located in the metal screen in front of the front door; a suspected bullet hole was located in the siding of the
28 south side of the residence (a projectile was subsequently located and collected from this area); a projectile was
29 located on the kitchen floor of the residence; two rifles were located in the driver seat and front passenger seat
30 of a patrol vehicle parked in front of the residence. It was later learned this was Deputy Truex's patrol vehicle and
31 the rifle located in the front passenger seat was Deputy Roger's department issued rifle that was used by Lt.
32 Moore and the rifle in the drive seat was Deputy Truex's department issued rifle.

33
34 Items of note from [REDACTED] Fern: Two suspected bullet holes were located on the garage door of the residence; two
35 projectiles were located inside the garage.

36
37 While on scene at [REDACTED] Fern, which is where the elderly female was shot by the male [REDACTED] we attempted to
38 locate shell casings in the driveway. After looking extensively, we were not able to locate any casings.
39 Investigator Henderson contacted Fish and Game Warden Embry and requested he respond to our location with
40 his K9 that is trained in locating guns and ammo. At about 1433 hours, Warden Embry arrived at our location.
41 After searching the area several times, cutting down grass and branches, Warden Embry's K9 located a single
42 shell casing on the east side of the driveway.

12 there was an Officer Involved Shooting (OIS), MCD Sgt. Massaro activated the Humboldt County Critical Incident
13 Response Team (CIRT). Due to the incident being located within the county's jurisdiction, along with a HCSO
14 deputy being involved, I was assigned as the lead investigator for the incident. Following CIRT policy, DAI Greg
15 Hill was assigned as my co-lead.

16
17 Prior to conducting a briefing of the incident, LT. Moore arrived at the Major Crime Division, accompanied by EPD
18 Sgt. Omey. LT. Moore was identified as the deputy who discharged his weapon. LT. Moore was visibly upset from
19 the incident, took off his leg holster and body armor, placing both of those items on the MCD briefing table. LT.
20 Moore and EPD Sgt. Omey then went into the FTO office located inside the HCSO MSP Office.

21
22 Once investigators from various law enforcement agencies arrived, we waited for LT. Holt to return from the
23 incident location and provide a briefing of the incident.

29 pistol. Both deputies were attempting to maintain sight of the entrance while directing responding units to
30 establish a perimeter at which time the [REDACTED] exited Unit [REDACTED] Both deputies can be heard yelling "show me
31 your hands." Moments later, Deputy Rogers was heard saying, "He's got a gun!" followed by the sound of shots
32 being fired and confirmation of an officer involved shooting with the [REDACTED] being down. Also in the footage
33 was a marked HCSO patrol vehicle. The patrol vehicle was facing in an easterly direction. LT. Moore and Deputy
34 Rogers could be seen standing next the passenger-front of the patrol vehicle. LT. Moore and Deputy Rogers can
35 be seen approaching the injured [REDACTED] the [REDACTED] was detained in handcuffs with the assistance of other

1 **SCENE:**

2
3 DAI G. Hill and I responded to the scene at approximately 1230hrs. The scene consisted of two locations. The
4 victim's location was [REDACTED] Fern St. and nearly across the street was the [REDACTED] location, which was in the yard
5 of [REDACTED] Fern St., on the sidewalk/entry way of the residence. This location was part of a tri-plex with each unit
6 having its own Fern St. address. [REDACTED] Fern St., was later determined to be [REDACTED] residence. Fern street is an
7 east/west residential roadway and [REDACTED] is located on the north side of Fern St., with the entrance facing Fern St.
8 The front of the residence was bordered by a lower fence/shrub line with a low gate/opening for a pathway
9 straight to the residence. A concrete pathway lead from the street sidewalk to the entrance of the residence.

10
11 Due to Fern St. being a dead-end street, law enforcement was able to contain both these locations in one scene.
12 The [REDACTED] later identified as [REDACTED] [REDACTED] had been transported by medical personnel prior to our arrival.
13 California Department of Justice was not available to respond for scene processing as is required by the
14 Humboldt County CIRT protocol.

15
16 While at this location, DAI Hill and I conducted a walk-thru of the scene. I saw a patrol vehicle in front of the
17 [REDACTED] residence, which corresponded with the patrol vehicle I had seen in the BWC footage I viewed at the
18 briefing. The vehicle was parked in front of [REDACTED] Fern St., slightly to the west of the pathway described above.
19 Behind this patrol vehicle was a marked HCSO patrol pickup truck. This vehicle was later determined to be the
20 assigned vehicle to Deputy Rogers.

21
22 Laying in the street, east of the patrol vehicle were three rifle brass casings that were marked and appeared to be
23 from the patrol rifle LT. Moore used. The scene was photographed, and 3D scanned by Forensic Specialist
24 [REDACTED] Refer to his supplemental report(s) for further details.

25 Near the front door to the residence was blood trauma, medical supplies and a Glock brand firearm laying on the
26 sidewalk.

27
28 I entered the residence and at that time the only thing of note that I saw were firearm containers in one of the
29 rooms. I directed F.S. [REDACTED] to that location to insure it was included in his scene photographs.

30
31 [REDACTED] Fern St. was located on the south side of the Fern St., with the entrance to the residence facing north. The
32 main entrance to the residence was accessed from the concrete driveway, which was located on the northeast of
33 the residence or the "front." In the driveway there were items that appeared to be from the victim lying on the
34 ground. The victim was later determined to be [REDACTED] [REDACTED] by other involved deputies. I did not enter this
35 residence or assist in evidence collection. Refer to the attached supplemental reports for further details.

36
37 Prior to entering the residences a search warrant was obtained for the locations by Det. Vickman. Refer to
38 supplemental report #6 for complete details.

39
40 During my time at the incident location, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] who identified herself as [REDACTED] girlfriend, was outside
41 the scene requesting to speak with investigators. DAI G. Hill and I spoke with [REDACTED] and that encounter was

1 documented in his report. A recording of this interview was attempted but inadvertently the recorder was not
2 properly activated. Refer to DAI G. Hill's report for details regarding this interview.

6 *****The following interview(s) are summarized below. Those summaries are written for reader comprehension
7 and not necessarily in the order the information provided. All interviews were recorded and copies of those
8 recordings were later booked into evidence unless otherwise noted. For further details please refer to those
9 recordings.*****

10

11 **During the interview neither Deputy Rogers nor LT. Moore referred to [REDACTED] by his name. I used [REDACTED] name
12 to identify who they were speaking about for reader clarity in the narrative.**

13

14 **LT. Moore did not know Deputy Truex's name and referred to him as "new deputy" in the interview. I
15 identified Deputy Truex by name for reader clarity.**

16

17 **HCSO Deputy Travis Rogers**

18

- 19 • **Hire date: 2008**
- 20 • **HCCF: 2008-2017**
- 21 • **HCSO Deputy: 2017-present**
- 22 • **Currently assigned: Special Services as the Boating Safety Deputy**
- 23 • **Deputy Rogers assignment is an uniformed position and his workstation is located the at the HCSO Myrtle Annex.**
- 24 • **Deputy Rogers' assigned vehicle is a HCSO marked 2019 F-250 and it is "Code-3" capable.**
- 25 • **Deputy Rogers last worked the night/morning before speaking with me on a search and rescue.**
- 26 • **Deputy Rogers got home at approximately 0330-0340hrs., on 04/30/2024.**
- 27 • **Deputy Rogers believed he had enough rest prior to this interview.**

28 On 04/30/2024, at approximately 0952hrs., DAI G. Hill and I spoke with Deputy Rogers inside the MCD
29 conference room. Deputy Rogers primary interview was conducted by EPD Det. Cosetti on the day of the
30 incident, 04/25/2024. Refer to that supplemental report for complete details.

31

32 When Deputy Rogers returned to the scene to collect his patrol vehicle on the day of the incident DAI G. Hill and I
33 were still on scene. Deputy Rogers indicated there were some things that he neglected to tell the other
34 investigators during his interview. I asked Deputy Rogers if we could speak to him in the future about those
35 things and he agreed.

36

37 The interview with Deputy Rogers was audio recorded and a copy of that recording was later booked into
38 evidence as item #63, code 1949-3.

39

40 I gave Deputy Rogers the beheler admonition and he elected to speak with us without a union representative or

1 attorney present on his behalf.

2

3 Deputy Rogers confirmed he had reviewed his BWC footage before speaking with me.

4

5 I also explained to Deputy Rogers this interview was not to go over what he had already told investigators. This
6 interview was for him to speak about anything he may have remembered since the incident occurred. It was also
7 to talk about what he mentioned to DAI G. Hill and I when he returned to the scene on 04/25/2024 that LT.
8 Moore had said during the incident. This interview was also to speak about his BWC footage, which he reviewed
9 prior to this interview.

10

11 I asked Deputy Rogers if his memory was refreshed after watching the BWC about anything he did not remember
12 during his first interview. Deputy Rogers explained there was nothing he remembered from just watching the
13 BWC footage.

14

15 I explained to Deputy Rogers that DAI G. Hill and I have not listened to the interview he gave to EPD Det Cosetti
16 or read a report and will not be asking questions about that interview.

17

18 During the interview, Deputy Rogers explained that he and LT. Moore responded "Code-3" from the Myrtle
19 Annex. Deputy Rogers was driving, and LT. Moore was riding with him. Deputy Rogers explained the information
20 they had was the [REDACTED] was on foot on Fern St. heading towards Walnut Dr. Deputy Rogers explained they
21 were the first units in the area. Deputy Rogers explained he traveled Walnut Dr. to, what he believed was
22 Arbutus St., and did not see the subject. Deputy Rogers explained he then "doubled-back" traveling Cedar St.
23 and once they got to the area of Fern and Cedar St., they saw a subject matching the description provided by the
24 victim, standing in front of a house near the corner of Fern and Cedar St.

25

26 Deputy Rogers explained the description provided by the victim as a male dressed in all black with small amount
27 of facial hair and white lettering on the back of his sweatshirt.

28

29 Deputy Rogers explained that when he returned to the scene, he told me that this incident "shook up" LT. Moore.
30 Deputy Rogers continued by explaining that when they were approaching [REDACTED] LT. Moore said something to the
31 effect, "Goddamn-it, why did you do it," which was directed to [REDACTED] Deputy Rogers stated while they were
32 clearing the residence, LT. Moore said, "why'd he have to fuckin' do it?" Based upon Deputy Rogers description, I
33 believed LT. Moore was referring to [REDACTED] behavior.

34

35 Deputy Rogers explained he thought LT. Moore was questioning why this incident had to happen.

36

37 I asked Deputy Rogers if he knew LT. Moore well enough to say that that wasn't a normal character trait of LT.
38 Moore or that LT. Moore felt remorse for the incident based upon what LT. Moore said listed above. Deputy
39 Rogers stated that was correct.

40

41 Deputy Rogers explained that he was on scene with LT. Moore during LT. Moore's previous OIS (04/18/2023)
42 within one minute of the shooting and this time (4/25/2024) LT. Moore was more "emotional." Deputy Rogers

1 explained that what happened on 04/25/2024, no one wanted to happen, and LT. Moore was questioning why
2 [REDACTED] had to do "this" and they (LT. Moore and Deputy Rogers) gave [REDACTED] every opportunity no to do "it." Based
3 upon the conversation, I believed Deputy Rogers meant "this" and "it" in reference to [REDACTED] pointing a firearm at
4 both of them.

5
6 I asked Deputy Rogers what he saw with the subject when lethal force had to be applied. Deputy Rogers
7 explained that when they initially contacted the subject he ran into a house and they set-up in front of the
8 house. Due to Deputy Rogers being doubled with LT. Moore, I did not ask Deputy Rogers to clarify who he meant
9 by "they" and believed he was referring to himself and LT. Moore as "they." Deputy Rogers explained they took
10 cover behind Deputy Truex's patrol vehicle, while Deputy Truex was sent to the rear to assist Sgt. Gomes.

11
12 Deputy Rogers stated he and LT. Moore both heard the door to the residence open. Deputy Rogers stated he
13 took two steps forward to get around LT. Moore. Deputy Rogers saw [REDACTED] walking toward them. [REDACTED] had a
14 pistol in his right hand raised towards Deputy Rogers and LT. Moore. Deputy Rogers explained he told [REDACTED] to
15 "drop the fucking gun." Deputy Rogers also described that he yelled at LT. Moore that [REDACTED] had a gun.

16
17 Deputy Rogers then described not having a sight picture on [REDACTED] and moving around behind the patrol vehicle.
18 Deputy Rogers continued by explaining that he had last known [REDACTED] to be advancing on them and Deputy
19 Rogers was moving to a position to get a "shot" if needed. Deputy Rogers described as he was making the lateral
20 movement behind the patrol vehicle is when he heard LT. Moore fire the patrol rifle.

21
22 Referring back to the comments Deputy Rogers heard LT. Moore make after the shooting, I asked Deputy Rogers
23 how long after the last shot was fired did LT. Moore make those comments. Deputy Rogers guessed a minute or
24 less.

25
26 Next, DAI G. Hill asked Deputy Rogers some questions.

27
28 Deputy Rogers was asked if [REDACTED] said anything when he was first contacted on the street. Deputy Rogers
29 described the subject turned and either "giggled" or had a "smirk/smile" on his face. After that, [REDACTED] ran into
30 the house.

31
32 Deputy Rogers did not see a weapon in [REDACTED] hands at the time, but did not know if [REDACTED] had anything in his
33 hands.

34
35 Deputy Rogers described that he would have used lethal force on [REDACTED] if he was able to do so when [REDACTED] was
36 pointing a firearm at them, because Deputy Rogers was in fear that [REDACTED] was going to shoot them (he and LT.
37 Moore).

38
39 Deputy Rogers did not believe they had an opportunity to use other force options.

40
41 I asked Deputy Rogers if a walk through of the scene would be of benefit and he declined.

1 In closing, Deputy Rogers added that he believed [REDACTED] entered the residence to retrieve a firearm and came
2 outside to kill him and LT. Moore.

3
4 Deputy Rogers also added that he could not be certain [REDACTED] did not have the firearm in his possession when he
5 ran into the residence when first contacted.

6
7 The interviewed concluded without incident.

8
9 **HCSO LT. Conan Moore**

- 10 • **LT. Moore has worked in law enforcement for 15 years, all of which have been with HCSO.**
- 11 • **LT. Moore's current assignment was the Lieutenant for the Humboldt County Marijuana Enforcement**
- 12 **Team and the Humboldt County Drug Task Force.**
- 13 • **LT. Moore's current assignment is an non-uniformed position with a work schedule of Monday-Friday**
- 14 • **Jonathan Murphy**
 - 15 ○ **LDF Attorney representing LT. Moore was present during the interview**
- 16 • **Prior to the interview LT. Moore reviewed his and Deputy Rogers' BWC footage.**
- 17 • **LT. Moore declined to do a scene walk-thru**
- 18 • **Towards the end of the interview, LT. Moore was asked about his training and experience with the**
- 19 **department long gun.**
 - 20 ○ **LT. Moore explained there is yearly training with the long gun.**
 - 21 ○ **Currently everyone shoots the same firearm platform**
 - 22 ■ **This was not always the case**
 - 23 ○ **LT. Moore was using Deputy Rogers' gun and explained that since they are set-up the same,**
 - 24 **everyone knows how to operate/manipulate it and how everything works on them.**
 - 25 ○ **LT. Moore has an issued patrol rifle but did not have an opportunity to get his and that is why**
 - 26 **he was using Deputy Rogers' patrol rifle.**
 - 27 ○ **LT. Moore did not manipulate the firearm in any other way except placing it on safe and setting**
 - 28 **on the passenger seat of the patrol vehicle after the shooting.**
 - 29 ○ **LT. Moore became a firearms instructor between 8-10 years ago for HCSO.**
 - 30 ○ **LT. Moore described being very familiar with the department patrol rifle.**

31
32
33 05/01/2024, 1355hrs. LT. Moore provided a voluntary statement regarding this incident. I told LT. Moore he was
34 free to leave at anytime, did not have to answer any questions if he didn't want to, could consult with his
35 attorney at anytime and that he could stop the interview at anytime. I asked LT. Moore if he had any questions
36 about any of these things and he stated no.

37
38 During the day of the incident, 04/25/2024, LT. Moore and I had met in my office at MCD prior to this incident
39 happening. LT. Moore explained that after speaking to me regarding a different case he left the Main Office of
40 HCSO, 826 4th St., in Eureka in his department issued patrol truck and went to his office at the Myrtle Annex. LT.
41 Moore continued by explaining as soon as he sat down at his desk, he heard a call for service be broadcast that a

1 white female was shot on Fern St. and a white male adult was walking away. LT. Moore walked out of his office
2 and saw Deputy Rogers walking towards him. LT. Moore explained he told Deputy Rogers "lets go." LT. Moore
3 described taking his duty jacket, that had HCSO shoulder patches, he issued vest, and got into the passenger seat
4 of Deputy Rogers' vehicle. As Deputy Rogers was backing out of the Myrtle Annex, LT. Moore turned on his BWC
5 and made sure Deputy Rogers turned on his BWC.

6
7 LT. Moore described the route from the Myrtle Annex Deputy Rogers drove "code-3" as follows:
8
9 Myrtle to Hubbard, Hubbard to Harris code three. While responding LT. Moore heard dispatch say over the radio
10 that the [REDACTED] was a white male adult, that he was wearing dark clothing, had facial hair, and there was
11 lettering on the back of his jacket. LT. Moore explained once they reach Dolbeer St., he took Deputy Rogers
12 patrol rifle out of the gun rack and loaded a round in the chamber. LT. Moore continued by explaining once they
13 reached Walnut Dr., he turned the siren off on the patrol truck, because the [REDACTED] was last seen walking
14 towards Walnut Dr. on Fern St. and LT. Moore did not know if the [REDACTED] was going to ambush them.

15
16 LT. Moore described that he and Deputy Rogers continued on Walnut Dr., drove past Fern St., and turned on the
17 next street, which LT. Moore thought was Arbutus St. They then drove towards Fern St. on a street LT. Moore
18 could not remember the name of. I believe LT. Moore was referring to Cedar St. based upon his description.

19
20 LT. Moore described that they saw a subject matching the description standing on the corner of the intersection.
21 LT. Moore did not provide the street names of this intersection, but based upon his description, I believe he was
22 referring to the intersection of Fern and Cedar St.

23
24 LT. Moore stated Deputy Rogers turned the patrol truck and LT. Moore got out of the vehicle. LT. Moore described
25 pointing the rifle at the [REDACTED] and yelling "Sheriff's Office, stop, show me your hands." LT. Moore explained the
26 [REDACTED] took one-to-two steps backwards, turned and ran into a [REDACTED]-colored house.

27
28 LT. Moore described that Deputy Rogers pulled his patrol vehicle up and that the residence had shrubs in front of
29 it. LT. Moore described there was cover for him in front of the house. LT. Moore explained that the house
30 windows did not have blinds on them, but he could not see inside through the windows. LT. Moore remembered
31 seeing the reflection of the street in the windows, so he could not tell where the [REDACTED] was or if he was moving
32 around in the house.

33
34 Next, LT. Moore explained that a brand-new deputy that he did not know (Deputy Truex) pulled up and LT. Moore
35 told him to pull his car up so LT. Moore and Deputy Rogers could have cover.

36
37 LT. Moore described going to the passenger side of Deputy Truex's patrol car and opening the door. While doing
38 this LT. Moore saw Sgt. Gomes driving towards him on Fern St. LT. Moore explained he motioned to Sgt. Gomes
39 to go towards the back of the residence.

40
41 Next, LT. Moore detailed standing at the "A" pillar of the patrol vehicle, while directing Deputy Truex to the rear
42 of the residence to establish a perimeter to keep the [REDACTED] contained.

2 LT. Moore explained that Deputy Rogers was on his right side, when the door to the residence opened and the
3 [REDACTED] came out and "he's not running, but he's not, it's a real fast walk I guess, he just comes straight out,
4 Travis yells gun, gun, gun. I see him, he has his arm up and is pointing, me and Travis are standing right next
5 together he's pointing the gun right at us I hear Travis move in behind me yelling gun I have the red dot on his
6 top of his chest right at his throat and I touch two rounds because I thought he was going to kill me and Travis
7 so..."

8

9 I asked LT. Moore what happened next, and he explained [REDACTED] "went down instantly." LT. Moore explained they
10 moved up and he requested medical "code-3" and he thought Deputy Rogers transmitted "shots fired, [REDACTED]
11 down."

12

13 LT. Moore described keeping an eye on the firearm [REDACTED] had either in his right hand or his right side as he and
14 Deputy Rogers approached. LT. Moore described that getting the gate to the yard open took some time and
15 when they were finally able to open the gate LT. Moore and Deputy Rogers moved up to the [REDACTED] location.
16 While moving up to [REDACTED] LT. Moore told Deputy Rogers to move [REDACTED] firearm. Next, LT. Moore described
17 "they" cuffed [REDACTED] *From my review of the BWC other deputies who had arrived cuffed [REDACTED] while LT. Moore
18 stood in the threshold of the doorway to the residence providing cover.

19

20 LT. Moore explained that at that time he did not know who else was inside the residence, because LT. Moore told
21 me when he heard the call for service it sounded like an active-shooter, "basically a random guy walking down
22 the street shooting random people."

23

24 Next, LT. Moore described that he had Sgt. Gomes and Deputy Truex stay with [REDACTED] while he, Deputy Rogers and
25 Sgt. Leipzig went into the house to clear the residence of other [REDACTED] victims or anyone else. LT. Moore
26 described calling out "Sheriff's office, search warrant" before entering the residence.

27

28 Once the house was cleared, LT. Moore exited, saw Sgt. Gomes and told Sgt. Gomes he was the shooter. LT.
29 Moore then placed the patrol rifle in the passenger seat of Deputy Truex's vehicle.

30

31 Next, LT. Moore saw U.S. Braud walking down the street and told U.S. Braud he needed to be taken to the office.
32 LT. Moore described that U.S. Braud had EPD Sgt. Omev, who was on scene, take LT. Moore to the office. LT.
33 Moore responded to the MCD where I saw him.

34

35 Once LT. Moore was finished telling DAI G. Hill and I what had happened, we asked him some follow-up
36 questions. The answers are detailed below.

37

- 38 • When Deputy Rogers turned onto Walnut Dr. the code-3 siren was turned off, but the overhead lights
- 39 were still on.
- 40 • While traveling south on Walnut Dr., LT. Moore described looking in all directions since they did not know
- 41 where the [REDACTED] was.
- 42 • Once they drove past Murphy's Market, 4020 Walnut Dr., Deputy Rogers and LT. Moore turned east on

- 1 the next street. This street is believed to be Arbutus St., based upon the description provided.
- 2 • Deputy Rogers and LT. Moore then turned north of Cedar St. LT. Moore did not know the name of this
- 3 street, but Arbutus dead-ends or "T" intersects with Cedar St. Therefore, they were traveling south on
- 4 Cedar St.
- 5 • LT. Moore described that [REDACTED] was initially located at the northeast corner of the Fern/Cedar St.
- 6 intersection.
- 7 • [REDACTED] was looking at Deputy Rogers and LT. Moore when they located him at the intersection
- 8 • Once seeing [REDACTED] Deputy Rogers stopped the patrol truck and LT. Moore opened the passenger door
- 9 and had [REDACTED] at gun point. LT. Moore then yell "Sheriff's Office, Stop, Show me your hands."
- 10 • LT. Moore was shown a picture of [REDACTED] Fern St. and confirmed that was the residence [REDACTED] ran into. LT.
- 11 Moore marked the map with a red marker. That photograph was a Google Maps printout and was later
- 12 booked into evidence.
- 13 • [REDACTED] went through the gate at [REDACTED] Fern St., followed the foot path which runs straight to the front
- 14 door of the residence.
- 15 • [REDACTED] went out of LT. Moore's view when he entered the residence.
- 16 • The residence had a security screen on the front door, which prevented LT. Moore from seeing if the
- 17 main door to the residence was closed after [REDACTED] enters.
- 18 • While standing in the "A" pillar of the passenger side of Deputy Truex's vehicle, LT. Moore was directly in
- 19 front of the door to the residence.
- 20 • LT. Moore remembered hearing Deputy Rogers say "gun, gun, gun" and then seeing the gun.
- 21 • LT. Moore did not know the [REDACTED] and or if he lived at the Fern St residence.
- 22 • [REDACTED] Fern St. was searched for additional [REDACTED] or victims since nothing about the [REDACTED] was
- 23 known.
- 24 • When LT. Moore saw [REDACTED] at the Fern/Cedar St. intersection he did not see anything in [REDACTED] hands. LT.
- 25 Moore remembered [REDACTED] wearing dark clothing, having facial hair and estimated his age to be in the
- 26 20's to 30's. LT. Moore believed he matched the
- 27 description provided by dispatch. When [REDACTED] turned to run LT. Moore saw lettering on his back and
- 28 knew [REDACTED] was the [REDACTED] that was reported to dispatch. LT. Moore believed [REDACTED] matched the
- 29 description they were provided, exactly.
- 30 • After [REDACTED] ran into the residence, LT. Moore wanted to establish a perimeter to keep [REDACTED] contained so
- 31 CNT or something similar could be called to the scene.
- 32 • LT. Moore did not know where the victim was located up to this point in the incident.
- 33 • LT. Moore did not think there were any other option then to shoot [REDACTED] LT. Moore thought [REDACTED] was
- 34 going to kill him or LT. Moore "would be going to a deputies funeral, either Travis or the new deputy."
- 35 • LT. Moore did not think he had an opportunity to negotiate or deescalate with [REDACTED] LT. Moore
- 36 explained again his hope was to get a perimeter setup so he could get CNT, MIST or whomever else there
- 37 so [REDACTED] could be talked "down or out."
- 38 • LT. Moore described the incident happening so fast they could not get a perimeter established.
- 39 • LT. Moore estimated he was approximately 40-50 feet away from [REDACTED] when he first saw [REDACTED] had a
- 40 firearm.
- 41 • LT. Moore described [REDACTED] as not running towards him when he exited the house, but "he was moving
- 42 with a purpose."
- 43 • LT. Moore described [REDACTED] as having a serious look on his face when he came out of the house.
- 44 • LT. Moore explained that when [REDACTED] came out of the house, he was wearing the same clothing and did

1 not change his appearance at all.
2 • LT. Moore did not realize until after the residence was cleared and medical aid was being administered to
3 [REDACTED] that the victim was across the street and "one house down."

4 During the review of the BWC footage LT. Moore could be heard making comments after the incident was over
5 and I asked him to explain those comments to me. Comments similar to "...Why did he have to do that, why'd he
6 try to get us..." Refer to the BWC footage for complete dialogue. LT. Moore explained that he was very upset the
7 incident had to end this way, ([REDACTED] being shot). LT. Moore was upset that [REDACTED] did not give up when he was
8 first contacted on the corner and that [REDACTED] fled, went into the house and came out with a gun. LT. Moore
9 explained that with the state of where we live [REDACTED] would have only been in jail for a little while but it's "not the
10 end of it." I believed LT. Moore was explaining that he believed [REDACTED] would have served prison time, but that it
11 wouldn't have been the end of [REDACTED] life. With additional questioning LT. Moore confirmed there was no need
12 for [REDACTED] to come out of the house with a firearm. LT. Moore described that [REDACTED] could have given up and he
13 and Deputy Rogers could have cuffed him. LT. Moore explained there was no need for [REDACTED] to come out and try
14 to kill them (LT. Moore and Deputy Rogers).

15
16 Once DAI G. Hill and I were finished, LDF Attorney [REDACTED] asked LT. Moore some questions. The
17 details of those questions/answers are listed below.

- 18
- 19 • The [REDACTED] appeared to be holding a firearm, "yes a Glock."
- 20 • The firearm appeared to be real.
- 21 • In LT. Moore's training and experience a firearm is a tool that can be used to cause death or serious
- 22 bodily injury.
- 23 • [REDACTED] was holding the firearm with his hand.
- 24 • [REDACTED] appeared to be in control of his arm and hand.
- 25 • [REDACTED] was moving his body like he was in control of his own body.

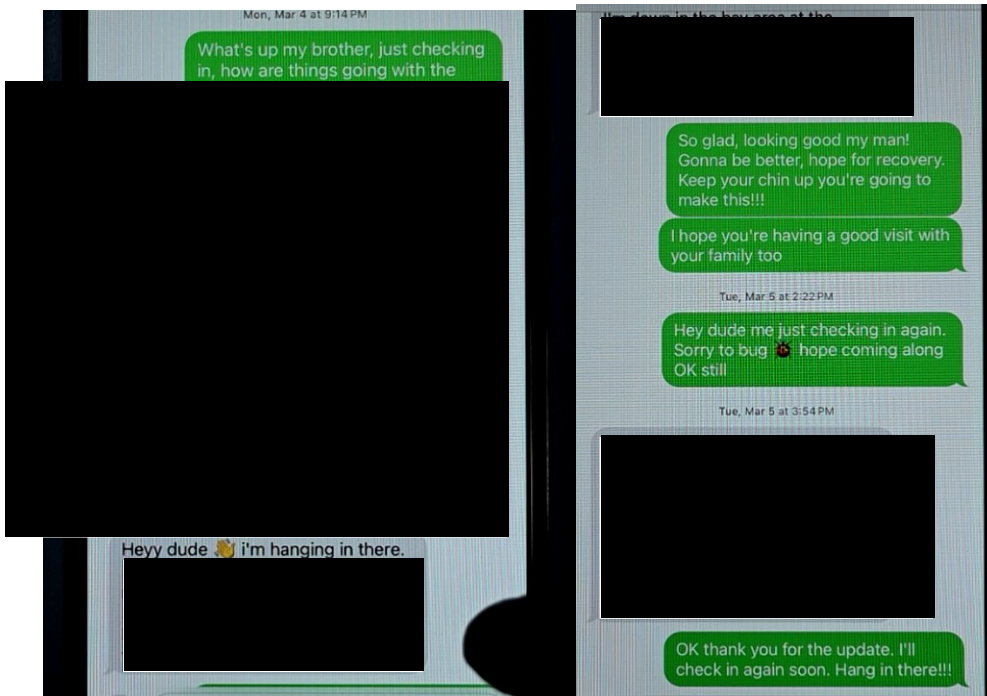

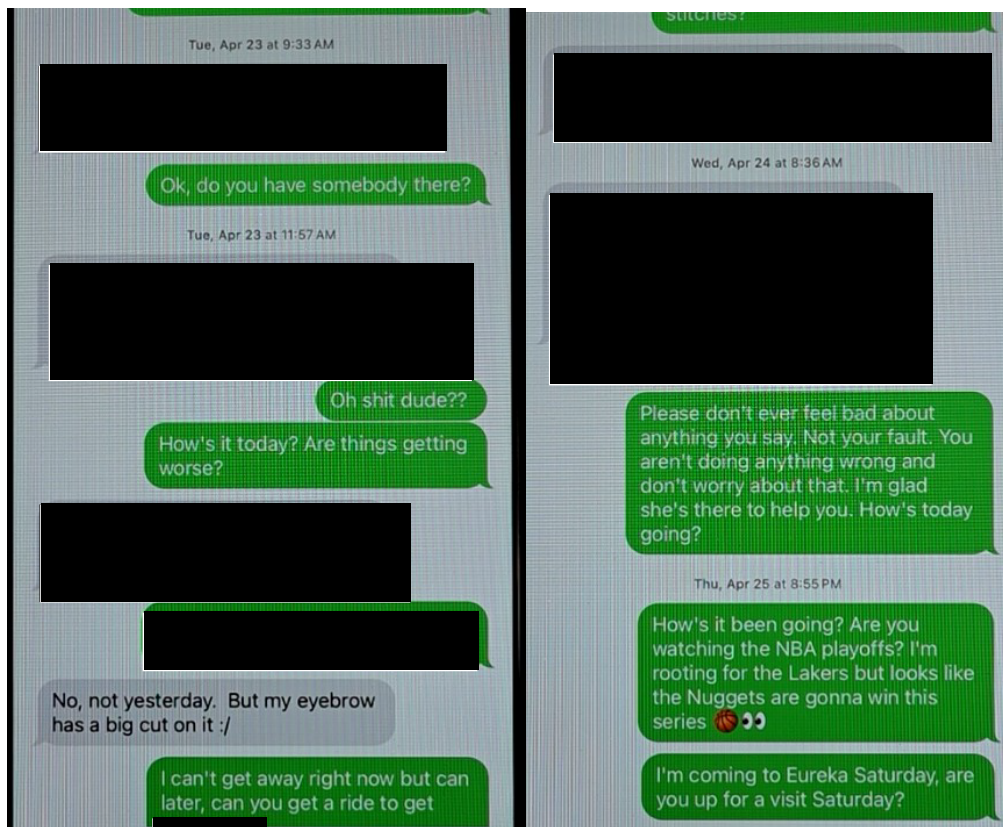

1 On 04/25/2024 at approximately 1032 hours, I was working patrol for the Hoopa Valley Tribal Police Department
2 (HVTPD) as a cross-deputized Humboldt County Sheriff's Office (HCSO) Deputy. I was wearing my department
3 issued uniform and driving a marked patrol vehicle partnered with Corporal Cumbow.

4
5 I was dispatched to [REDACTED] Fern Street located in Eureka, the call consisted of someone screaming and saying they
6 have been shot twice by an unknown male with a gun. I advised dispatch we were en route code 3 from
7 Broadway St. in Eureka.

8
9 At approximately 1041 hours, I arrived at the location of [REDACTED] Fern Street and observed a male, who was later
10 identified as [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] laying on his stomach and placed in handcuffs. At approximately 1043 hours,
11 Corporal Cumbow and I located the victim, (RV) [REDACTED] [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] Fern Street. [REDACTED] was found in her
12 driveway positioned on her right side on the ground in front of the garage door, and appeared to be in agony.
13 [REDACTED] sister and neighbor covered [REDACTED] with a blue blanket to help keep her warm. I attempted to access her
14 injuries and observed what appeared to be a gunshot wound approximately three eighths of an inch in size
15 located beneath [REDACTED] left arm next to her "armpit".

16
17 [REDACTED] nephew ([REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED]) arrived at the scene and [REDACTED] explained that he stopped by [REDACTED]
18 house to help her clean and work on the house. [REDACTED] stated that he seen [REDACTED] out on the driveway staring at
19 the house and told him to leave and [REDACTED] left, shortly after [REDACTED] left [REDACTED]

20
21 [REDACTED] made no further statement to me regarding why [REDACTED] returned to [REDACTED] after his departure.

23 Humboldt Bay Fire and Medical assistance arrived at our location and rendered medical assistance to [REDACTED]
24 Corporal Cumbow and I followed the ambulance (*The name of the ambulance company is unknown*) that
25 transported [REDACTED] to St. Joseph's Hospital located at 2700 Dolbeer Street in Eureka.

27 At approximately 1101 hours, Corporal Cumbow and I arrived at the hospital and waited to collect evidence.
28 When feasible I collected [REDACTED] bloodied blue blanket as evidence from room 20. As I exited the hospital to
29 store the evidence I collected in Corporal Cumbow's patrol vehicle, Deputy Truex handed me a single bag of
30 evidence that he collected to store in Corporal Cumbow's vehicle.

32 At approximately 1300 hours, an investigator from the District Attorney's Office, Investigator Tim Marsolan,
33 spoke with both Corporal Cumbow and I. Investigator Marsolan stated that he needed to collect the evidence
34 (two items of evidence) from Corporal Cumbow's patrol vehicle to photograph and be placed into his custody.
35 We gave Investigator Marsolan a key to Corporal Cumbow's vehicle to collect the evidence, Investigator
36 Marsolan returned the key to Corporal Cumbow and advised us that the evidence is now in his custody.

1 On 04/25/2024, I (Lt. K. Holt) was working in an on-duty capacity as an Operations Lieutenant specifically
2 assigned to the HCSO Major Crimes Division (MCD). At around 1040 hours, I was notified an officer-involved
3 shooting (OIS) had just occurred at [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka (County of Humboldt). I directed/authorized HCSO
4 MCD Sergeant B. Massaro to activate a Critical Incident Response Team (CIRT) call-out regarding the incident.

5
6 I then responded to the scene and met with other HCSO Administrators. I was briefed on the known aspects of
7 the incident and conducted a walk through of the scene in order to better understand the anticipated complexity
8 of the associated investigation, as well as identify any specific equipment and personnel needs that may assist
9 the impending CIRT investigation.

10
11 Prior to leaving the scene, specific administrative duties were assigned regarding this incident. Undersheriff J.
12 Braud was assigned as the on-scene Incident Commander, Lieutenant J. Taylor was assigned as the Involved
13 Agency Administrative Lead, and I was assigned as the CIRT Incident Commander.

14
15 I then responded the HCSO Eureka Main Station and led an investigative briefing to CIRT personnel comprised of
16 law enforcement investigators, detectives, and evidence technicians from numerous agencies including but not
17 limited to the HCSO, Eureka Police Department, Arcata Police Department, Humboldt County District Attorney's
18 Office and California Highway Patrol. The following information was presented during the briefing:

19
20 On 04/25/2024, at approximately 1031 hours, the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office Emergency
21 Communications Center received an open 9-1-1 line with screaming heard in the background. The caller
22 was determined to be (RP/V) 75-year-old [REDACTED] [REDACTED] told Dispatch she was shot twice by a male who
23 walked into her driveway located at [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka (County of Humboldt). [REDACTED] indicated the
24 male had a gun in his right hand and shot her with no warning. [REDACTED] advised the male fled on foot toward
25 Walnut Drive (indicating he was westbound on Fern Street) and was described as wearing all black with
26 some facial hair, possibly black curly hair shoulder length, and possibly wearing glasses. [REDACTED] later
27 advised Dispatch the [REDACTED] appeared younger and had a jacket that contained lettering on the back.

28
29 HCSO deputies promptly responded to the surrounding Fern Street area and informed Dispatch they
30 thought they were out with the [REDACTED] at Cedar Street and Fern Street. Deputies then immediately
31 communicated that the [REDACTED] fled into a nearby residence located at [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka. Shortly
32 after, a second reporting party called Dispatch to report they heard additional shots fired and believed
33 the deputies shot the [REDACTED] HCSO deputies then confirmed "shots fired" and that the [REDACTED] was
34 down.

35
36 The scene, spanning from the initial shooting of [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] Fern Street to the [REDACTED] perceived
37 residence located at [REDACTED] Fern Street, Eureka, was immediately secured by law enforcement. Medical
38 arrived on scene for both injured persons ([REDACTED] and the unidentified male [REDACTED] Preliminary
39 information regarding the medical status of [REDACTED] was that she was in a stable condition and sustained at
40 least one gunshot wound, possibly two; the male [REDACTED] sustained at least two gunshot wounds with
41 one wound to the neck and the other to his hand. Both subjects were separately transported via
42 ambulance to St. Joseph's Hospital in Eureka.

An unidentified female arrived on Fern Street and advised law enforcement she thought the male [REDACTED] was her boyfriend who had recently been discharged from St. Joseph's Hospital [REDACTED]. The female said the male would likely still have a hospital wrist band on. While at the hospital, HCSO deputies confirmed the male had a hospital wrist band still on his person, identifying him as [REDACTED]

Prior to being given CIRT assignments, CIRT personnel in attendance at the briefing also reviewed the body worn camera available from HCSO Deputy T. Rogers and HCSO Lt. C. Moore, who were first to arrive on scene and involved in the OIS. I observed both deputies to have originally been located on the street in front of [REDACTED] Fern Street. Lt. Moore was armed with a department issued AR-style rifle and Deputy Rogers was armed with a department issued pistol. As both deputies were attempting to locate where the [REDACTED] went on the property, in which he was last seen running to the rear of [REDACTED] Fern Street, the [REDACTED] suddenly appeared in the area of the front exterior door. Both deputies could be heard issuing surrender commands and yelling something to the effect of: "Show me your hands". Moments later, Deputy Rogers was heard saying something to the effect of: "He's got a gun!" followed by the sound of shots being fired and confirmation of an OIS with the [REDACTED] down. Lt. Moore and Deputy Rogers could be seen approaching the injured [REDACTED] detaining him in handcuffs with the assistance of other deputies, and providing medical aid. A pistol was located near the [REDACTED] and later secured. It was confirmed on scene that Lt. Moore was the only deputy to have fired his weapon, while Deputy Rogers was an active witness.

Based on the foregoing information, HCSO Investigator D. Henderson was assigned as the CIRT lead investigator and DA Investigator G. Hill was assigned as the co-lead investigator. Other CIRT personnel received assignments and direction regarding their investigative responsibilities.

At the conclusion of the briefing, I responded back to the scene while other CIRT personnel responded to the location of their assigned responsibilities. While on scene, I supervised CIRT personnel and provided direction regarding the coordination of investigative resources.

At about 1809 hours, Undersheriff Braud cleared from the scene, and I absorbed the Incident Commander responsibilities to include management of the crime scene log. I maintained this log for the duration of time that CIRT personnel were on scene. I later provided the crime scene log to HCSO Investigator J. Taylor who scanned the log into RIMS as an attachment and booked the original into evidence. (Refer to Investigator Taylor's supplemental report for additional detail.)

Any/all additional information will be documented in an additional supplement report.

1 On Thursday April 24, 2024, I was working as a Sergeant assigned to the Special Services Division. I was wearing
2 a HCSO uniform and driving a marked patrol truck. At about 10:32 hours, I saw a call for service on our CAD
3 system for a gunshot victim at [REDACTED] Fern Street in Eureka. I reviewed the call for service that stated:

5 OPEN LINE WITH SCREAMING NOTHING ELSE HEARD . RP SAYING THEY'VE BEEN SHOT. UNK WHERE ON THE
6 BODY THEY'VE BEEN SHOT. TRANSFER TO MEDICAL FOR INSTRUCTIONS. RP STATES THEY WERE SHOT TWICE.
7 MALE WALKED INTO THE DRIVEWAY, HAD A GUN IN THE RIGHT HAND AND THEN SHOT HER TWICE WITH NO
8 WARNING.
9 RP IS 75 YEARS OLD AND SAYS IT HAPPENED TEN MINUTES AGO. CAN'T SEE ANYTHING, SAYS BLOOD IS
10 EVERYWHERE.

11
12 I responded to the area code 3 (emergency lights and siren) and arrived in the area at about 10:38 hours. As I
13 turned onto Fern Street from Walnut, I heard Lt. Moore state they were out with the [REDACTED] and the [REDACTED]
14 fled into a residence. I knew that Lt. Moore was a doubled unit with Deputy T. Rogers. I saw they were parked in
15 front of a residence on Fern Street, so I turned N/B onto Cedar Street and parked on Cedar Street near an alley
16 behind where the [REDACTED] entered the residence to set up a perimeter and contain the [REDACTED] I deployed my
17 department issued patrol rifle. I then heard some yelling and shots being fired. I ran from my patrol truck to Lt.
18 Moore and Deputy T. Rogers, who were parked in front of [REDACTED] Fern Street. Lt. Moore stated the [REDACTED] was
19 down in front of the house. Lt. Moore, Deputy Rogers, Sgt. Leipzig, Deputy Truex and I moved up to the gate and
20 entered the yard. The [REDACTED] was lying on his back and I could see a Glock pistol near his right hand. Deputy T.
21 Rogers slid the firearm back to me with his foot and I stood by the firearm, while the [REDACTED] was handcuffed. I
22 told Deputy Truex to get a Medical kit from his patrol vehicle. Deputies cleared the residence and Deputy Rogers
23 and Sgt. Leipzig started to perform medical aid and CPR to the [REDACTED] I instructed all other deputies to respond
24 to the victim's residence at [REDACTED] Fern Street. I also saw shell casings in front of [REDACTED] Fern Street. Due to medical
25 personnel having to drive to both residences, I took two large traffic cones from across the street and placed
26 them near the shell casings to preserve the evidence. I also radioed to dispatch that the [REDACTED] was detained
27 and to have medical respond code 3 to both residences.

28
29 Medical arrived on scene and later transported the [REDACTED] and victim to St. Joseph's Hospital. I later
30 transported Deputy T. Rogers to the Eureka Police Department for an interview. I later transported Deputy T.
31 Rogers back to Fern Street to retrieve his patrol truck. I then cleared the scene.

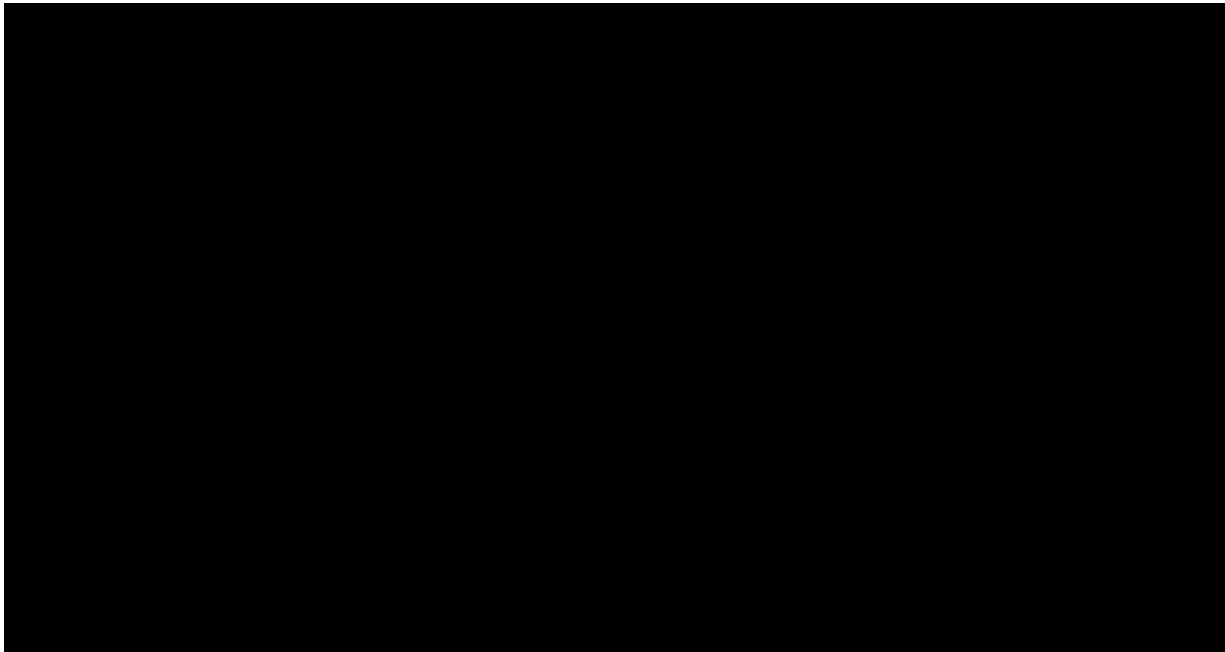
1 On 04/25/2024, I became aware of an officer involved shooting (OIS) in the area of [REDACTED] Fern st. Prior to

10 I responded to [REDACTED] Fern St to assist with processing the scene of the OIS and attempted homicide. I
11 arrived at approx. 12:23 PM. See Crime scene log for all others present. Fern St had been closed off with crime
12 scene tape at Cedar St to the West and Harrison Ave to the East. Crime scene tape had also been placed in front
13 of the driveway to the residence at [REDACTED] Fern. Crime scene tape had been placed in front of the driveway of the

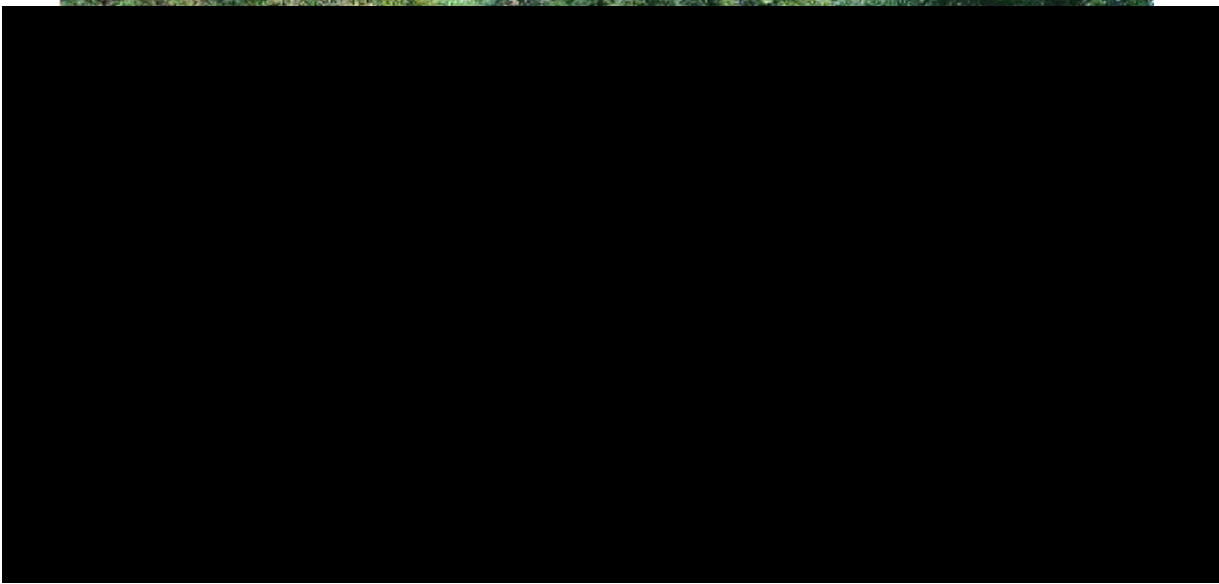

1 On 04/25/2024, at approximately 1033 hours, I was working for the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office Civil
2 Division. I was wearing a distinctly marked HCSO patrol uniform and operating a marked HCSO patrol vehicle. I
3 overheard Dispatch broadcast shots were fired, and the [REDACTED] was fleeing on foot from Fern Street, Eureka
4 towards Walnut Drive, Eureka, I responded Code 3 from Humboldt Hill, Eureka, California.

5
6 I arrived on scene at approximately 1047 hours, once on scene I was directed by Sergeant Gomes to assist
7 Corporal Cumbow securing the scene at the victim's residence. I spoke with (W) [REDACTED] and the
8 following is her statement:

9
10 [REDACTED] stated she and her sister (RV) [REDACTED] [REDACTED] were leaving and she was locking the door when she saw
11 the same man, later identified as [REDACTED] [REDACTED], from an earlier occurrence standing just past the sidewalk in her
12 driveway. [REDACTED] saw [REDACTED] point what she believed to be a revolver towards [REDACTED] and she heard two shots.
13 [REDACTED] quickly went back inside the residence and called HCSO Dispatch. [REDACTED] watched [REDACTED] walk across the
14 street. [REDACTED] stated while she was speaking with Dispatch she heard "some more gunshots" and believed the
15 [REDACTED] had been shot by responding deputies. This concluded my conversation with [REDACTED]

16
17 I was then directed by Undersheriff Braud to notify all residents in the area to shelter in place until the scene was
18 clear. During the notifications, I spoke with (W) [REDACTED] [REDACTED] who was sleeping in his van, CA Lic# [REDACTED],
19 at the end of Fern Street, Eureka. [REDACTED] stated he heard what he thought were gunshots, so he exited his van.
20 [REDACTED] observed a male walking across the street and later saw patrol cars arrive on scene. [REDACTED] then saw
21 deputies exit their patrol cars with rifles and then heard "a few more shots." [REDACTED] stated he then sat back
22 inside of his van for his safety. This concluded my conversation with [REDACTED]

23
24 I completed the notification for the surrounding residences and assisted Deputy Mathieson with securing the
25 area with caution tape. I was then directed by Undersheriff Braud to remain at the end of Fern Street, Eureka
26 while the scene was being processed. At approximately 1808 hours, I was released from the scene.

SUPPLEMENT 14 - Officer Processing

1 On 4-25-2024, I was working as a Detective for the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office (HCSO) assigned to the
2 Major Crimes Division (MCD). I was the HCSO training facility in Eureka, when I was made aware of an officer
3 involved shooting (OIS) that just occurred. I left training and responded back to the MCD for a CIRT briefing.
4

5 At the briefing, I was teamed up with Detective (Det) Ray Nunez with the Eureka Police Department (EPD) and
6 Evidence Technician (ET) [REDACTED] [REDACTED] with the Arcata Police Department (EPD). We were assigned to officer
7 processing.
8

9 After the briefing, we set up in the MCD conference room. The CIRT Officer Processing form was completed and
10 later booked into evidence. Deputies are processed independently of one another and no questions pertaining to
11 the incident were asked. Overall photographs were taken of each Deputy in the gear they were wearing at the
12 time of the incident. For a detailed list of equipment, please refer to the CIRT Officer processing form. Listed
13 below is the ammunition round count and firearms.
14

15 LT. Moore, was transported to the HCSO MCD by John Omev with EPD. When LT. Moore arrived, he placed his
16 body armor, and sidearm (in holster) on the meeting table in MCD. The gear he placed on the table was left in
17 place until a member of the DA's office arrived for transparency purposes. Forensic Specialist [REDACTED]
18 (HCSO) took overall photographs of the gear as it was placed. The body worn camera was removed and I logged
19 out of BWC application to prevent accidental activation. The gear was then stored in FS [REDACTED] office until we
20 processed LT. Moore.
21

22 First processed was acting Lieutenant Conan Moore. For a full list of equipment carried, refer to the CIRT Officer
23 Processing Form.
24

25 LT. Moore's gear was placed on the table, and he confirmed it was the gear he was wearing at the time of the
26 incident.
27

28 LT. Moore was in possession of his department issued Glock 17 G5 (Serial# [REDACTED]). The Glock was loaded with
29 a round chambered, and a magazine (17-RD cap) which contained 18 rounds for a total of 19 rounds. Through
30 BWC footage review, it was determined LT. Moore did not discharge this firearm. After confirming this theory
31 with the round count, this firearm was released to LT. Moore.
32

33 LT. Moore had two spare Glock magazines affixed to his plate carrier (17-RD cap); one with 17 rounds, the other
34 with 18. All above mentioned ammunition was 9mm Luger Hornady. Additionally, this firearm was outfitted with
35 a Holosun open reflex sight and a Streamlight TLR-1 weapon mounted flashlight.
36

37 LT. Moore also had a spare rifle mag also affixed to his plate carrier (30-RD cap PMAG) loaded with 31 rounds.
38 Photographs of LT. Moore's gear and his person were taken. This magazine was loaded with the following
39 ammunition: 5-LCO7, 9- Hornady, 17- .223 REM FC.
40

41 Due to the circumstances, LT. Moore's overall photographs were taken without his plate carrier and sidearm.
42 These items were photographed separately.

2 Our team then responded to the incident location to assist where needed. My team was tasked with removing
 3 and documenting the patrol rifles left in a patrol car in front of the Officer involved shooting location. ET [REDACTED]
 4 took overall photos, refer to her report for further.

5

6 First, I removed the patrol rifle from the passenger seat. The safety was in the "safe" position. I removed the
 7 loaded magazine. The firearm was loaded, with a round in the chamber, the round ejected and fell to the
 8 passenger seat and was photographed by ET [REDACTED]. The chambered round was kept separate from the loaded
 9 magazine and rifle and placed in unsealed evidence packaging for later processing. Refer to ET [REDACTED] report for
 10 chain of custody.

11

12 Next, I removed the patrol rifle from the driver's seat. ET [REDACTED] took overall photos, refer to her report for
 13 further. The safety was in the "safe" position. I removed the loaded magazine. The firearm was loaded with a
 14 round in the chamber, the round ejected and fell to the ground and was photographed by ET [REDACTED]. The
 15 chambered round was kept separate from the loaded magazine and rifle and placed in unsealed evidence
 16 packaging for later processing. Refer to ET [REDACTED] report for chain of custody. I took note of apparent blood
 17 transfer on this rifle.

18

19 After securing the firearms, my team was tasked to respond back to the HCSO MCD to process Deputy Truex.
 20

21 Deputy Truex was initially interviewed by Det. Nunez and I. Based on that conversation, we determined Deputy
 22 Truex to not be in the immediate vicinity of the incident therefore we did not fully process Deputy Truex. Refer to
 23 Det. Nunez's report for further.

24

25 Deputy Truex did however, render medical aid to the [REDACTED]. During that time, blood was transferred from the
 26 victim to Deputy Truex's uniform shirt, lapel mic, and department issued patrol rifle. During our conversation
 27 with Deputy Truex, he advised us he eventually placed his rifle on the driver's seat of his patrol car and when he
 28 did so, he noticed another rifle on the passenger seat. As a result of the blood transfer, we took his shirt, lapel
 29 mic, rifle, and bloody gloves used on scene as evidence. Refer ET [REDACTED] report for further.

30

31 After speaking with Deputy Truex, I responded back to the incident location to assist where needed. While on
 32 scene, I assisted in searching for shell casings at the victims residence located at [REDACTED] Fern Street. When I arrived
 33 on scene, a majority of the area had been searched and a large amount of brush had been removed from the
 34 property and placed on the roadway. I searched the brush removed from the area and didn't locate anything.
 35 While I was doing a secondary search, a single shell casing was found on the left (East) side of the victim's
 36 driveway by Department of Fish and Wildlife Warden Shane Embry and his K9. Refer to his report for further.

37

38 Shortly after the shell casing was found, I was temporarily reassigned to a difference case.

39

40 On 4-30-2024, ET Cosetti responded to the HCSO MCD and assisted, FS [REDACTED] and I with processing the rifles
 41 from the patrol car. We first processed the patrol rifle from the passenger seat. The rifle was a Colt M4 Carbine
 42 (serial [REDACTED]). The rifle was equipped with an Aimpoint Patrol Rifle Optic (PRO) which was switched on,

1 illuminating the red dot. The rifle was also equipped with a Streamlight TLR-1 weapon mounted flashlight and
2 VTAC sling. The rifle, previously unloaded, had a round in the chamber and an AR-15 style magazine (30-RD CAP)
3 loaded with 24 rounds. The ammunition loaded in the firearm was all Hornady .223 REM. Overall photos were
4 taken, and the firearm was booked into evidence by FS [REDACTED] I spoke with HCSO armorer, Tim Jones. Tim
5 advised me this firearm was department issued to Deputy Travis Rogers.

6
7 Next, we processed the firearm from the driver's seat. The rifle was a Colt M4 Carbine (serial# [REDACTED]). The
8 rifle was equipped with an Aimpoint Patrol Rifle Optic (PRO). The rifle was also equipped with a Streamlight TLR-
9 1 weapon mounted flashlight and VTAC sling. The rifle, previously unloaded, had a round in the chamber and an
10 AR-15 style magazine (30-RD CAP) loaded with 26 rounds. The ammunition loaded in the firearm was all Hornady
11 .223 REM. Overall photos were taken, and the firearm was booked into evidence by FS [REDACTED] I spoke with
12 HCSO armorer, Tim Jones. Tim advised me this firearm was department issued to Deputy RJ Truex.

13
14 I then used my notes to complete a PDF Version of the CIRT Officer Processing Forms and attached them to this
15 case.

16
17 This report is to document my efforts and duties for this investigation, any further information will be provided
18 via supplemental report at a later time.

1 On 04/25/2024, at approximately 1040 hours, an officer involved shooting had just occurred in the city of
2 Eureka and a Critical Incident Response Team (CIRT) call out was initiated. I responded to the HCSO conference
3 room to brief on the incident along with other CIRT members. After Lieutenant Holt briefed us on the incident,
4 Investigator Henderson assigned us a task. I was tasked with hospital processing along with District Attorney
5 Investigator Tim Marsolan and Eureka Police Department Detective Donald Bailey.

6 At approximately 1220 hours, we arrived at Saint Joseph's Hospital and spoke with hospital staff. They
7 informed us [REDACTED] was currently in surgery and (V) [REDACTED] was in the emergency room in stable
8 condition. When we entered the victim's room, she was alert, responsive and surrounded by two family
9 members. Detective Bailey asked [REDACTED] if she was willing to talk about the incident, allow me to photograph her
10 wounds and collect any items of evidentiary value. [REDACTED] agreed and began speaking with Detective Bailey. After
11 Detective Bailey finished his investigation, I began photographing her wounds. [REDACTED] had a gunshot wound in the
12 right side of her chest that exited just below her left armpit. She had another gunshot wound in her right elbow
13 that was bandaged with purple surgical tape. I asked [REDACTED] if she had any other injuries from the waist down and
14 she stated, "no."

15 When I was done photographing the victim, I proceeded to the intensive care unit (ICU) where the
16 [REDACTED] was being treated. I was not able to photograph the [REDACTED] or collect any potential evidence from him
17 due to hospital policies and the lack of a search warrant at the time. After some time had passed, hospital house
18 manager [REDACTED] arrived and granted DA Investigator Marsolan permission to take a clear plastic bag that had the
19 [REDACTED] blood soiled clothes inside. I secured this bag in my evidence truck.

20 At approximately 1320 hours, DA Investigator Marsolan and I retrieved some evidence that was in the
21 backseat of Corporal Cumbow's patrol vehicle. The first evidence bag read "04/25/24 11:24 victim's blanket w/
22 blood" and the second bag read "11:31 [REDACTED] RM19." While searching [REDACTED] belongings, I located his wallet and
23 cellphone in his pants pockets. I secured these items in my evidence truck.

24 Sometime after 1400 hours, I responded to the incident location at [REDACTED] Fern Street and [REDACTED] Fern
25 Street, in Eureka. Refer to lead Investigator Henderson's report for the synopsis of this incident. When the search
26 warrant was granted, I assisted Forensic Specialist [REDACTED] in processing both scenes. FS [REDACTED]
27 photographed both crime scenes while I assisted with the Leica 3D scanner, search, and collection of evidence.

28 As I approached the [REDACTED] residence at [REDACTED] Fern Street, I observed three Hornady .223 Remington
29 bullet casings in the roadway. Before I entered the home, I noticed a black Glock 23 handgun (s/n: [REDACTED])
30 resting on the walkway and a pool of blood nearby. When the handgun was rendered safe, Forensic Specialist
31 [REDACTED] and I processed the firearm. There was a Blazer 40 S & W live round inside the chamber of the gun and
32 ten Blazer 40 S & W live rounds inside the magazine. During the search of the residence, we located two
33 projectiles. One projectile was lodged in the siding of the home and the second projectile was on the kitchen
34 floor. Based off the bullet's trajectory, it appeared that the second bullet entered the home near the front door.
35 From there it traveled through the living room piercing through a sweater that was hanging on a clothes rack.
36 The projectile then entered through a dividing wall, striking the edge of the countertop before landing on the
37 kitchen floor. During the search of the master bedroom, I located a loaded Glock magazine that was sitting on top
38 of a nightstand. FS [REDACTED] and I processed the magazine and located seven Blazer 40 S & W live rounds within
39 the mag. Additional items of evidentiary value were located and seized from the residence.

40 When I approached the victim's residence at [REDACTED] Fern Street, I observed two bullet holes in the garage
41 door and some blood soiled clothing nearby. While searching the garage we located two projectiles; one was
42 lodged in an easy up tent and the other projectile was located at the bottom of a dryer. Several law enforcement

1 personnel and I began removing the vegetation to locate any shell casings, but we were unsuccessful. When I
2 was assisting law enforcement with recovering a projectile at [REDACTED] Fern Street, I learned that one shell casing
3 was located by Fish and Wildlife Warden Embry and his K9. The K9 specializes in firearms and ammunition
4 detection. I was not present during the collection of this item.

1 On 04/25/2024 I was working as the on call Deputy Coroner. At about 1106 hours I was contacted by Peer
2 Support Leader Matt Helm requesting that I assist as a peer support member as there was an officer involved
3 shooting. I advised that I was available but advised that there could be potential conflict if the [REDACTED] who was
4 shot died, as I was the Coroner on Duty. I reviewed the RIMS call and observed that involved parties were [REDACTED]
5 [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] [REDACTED] which I recognized as my dads cousins through family events through the years. I
6 informed Sgt. Barney of the family connection and advised that I felt that I could be impartial through my
7 investigation as they were distant family which I had probably not seen or spoke to directly in 10 years. I
8 observed that the [REDACTED] in the shooting was 32 year old [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was still armed as law
9 enforcement arrived and he was shot by law enforcement during the response. [REDACTED] was transported to the St.
10 Joseph's Hospital.

11
12 On 04/26/2024 at about 1000 hours, I spoke with [REDACTED] of Donor Network West about the possibility of
13 [REDACTED] being declared brain dead and the possibility of him becoming an organ donor, Sgt. Barney was present
14 during this conversation. I requested that early admission blood be retained, and advised that I would be
15 speaking with my chain of command. Between several conversation with Leo, his supervisor [REDACTED], Sgt.
16 Barney, Sgt. Massaro, and Lt. Holt it was determined to simplify communication Lt. Holt would communicate
17 directly with [REDACTED]

18
19 I was forwarded relevant medical records by Donor Network which I shared with investigating Deputies and
20 Officers as well as forwarded to Forensic Pathologist [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was declared brain dead on 04/27/2024
21 at 1926 hours. [REDACTED] did not object to organ harvest and requested that Donor Network not harvest Neck,
22 Skin, and the Right Lung.

23
24 On 05/03/2024 at 1457 hours It was requested by Investigator Hill that I respond to the hospital. I arrived at the
25 hospital at about 1510 hours. With assistance [REDACTED] body was placed in a new body bag and I was provided
26 with some blood samples which were drawn during the procedure. I left the hospital about 1532 hours arriving
27 at the Coroner's Office at about 1538 hours. [REDACTED] was logged and booked and placed in secure cold storage.

28
29 I completed a release of medical records form for [REDACTED] and faxed it to the hospital. I later received the medical
30 records documenting past incidents via fax. I later received a digital file for [REDACTED] from the incident on
31 04/25/2024 till his date of death. The digital records were added to the Coroner Drive. I later requested and
32 received medical Records from [REDACTED] The records were shared with Detective Henderson

33
34 On 05/09/2024 at about 1345 hours, I removed [REDACTED] from cold refrigeration and placed him on an x-ray table
35 where I conducted x-rays at the Coroner's Office using a Carestream DRX-1 System. These files were downloaded
36 to CD format and were also retained on the devices drive for viewing for the pathologist. At the completion of
37 the x-rays I placed [REDACTED] back into cold storage and downloaded the x-ray images to CD format. I downloaded
38 the X-ray images to the Coroner Secure Drive and then booked the CD in as evidence placing the CD in Coroner
39 Evidence Locker #A2.

40
41 I scheduled an autopsy for [REDACTED] with Forensic Pathologist [REDACTED] on 05/10/2024. Sgt. Barney briefed Dr.
42 [REDACTED] about this case. Volunteer [REDACTED] and Volunteer [REDACTED] assisted with the autopsy.

1 Arcata Police Department Evidence Tech [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Arcata Police Department PSO [REDACTED] and
2 Humboldt County District Attorney Investigator Greg Hill observed and documented the autopsy. At the
3 completion of the autopsy [REDACTED] advised that [REDACTED] cause of death was due to a Gunshot wound of Chest,
4 and Sgt Barney signed the death certificate with the information provided and determined that the manner of
5 death was a Homicide. At the completion of the autopsy I collected the sign in log was collected.

6
7 A DNA card was collected and retained at the Coroner's Station.

8
9 [REDACTED] was fingerprinted after the autopsy and the prints were electronically sent to the Federal Bureau of
10 Investigations (FBI) and the California Department of Justice (DOJ). A reply from each agency advised that the
11 person who was fingerprinted was not recognized as being in their database.

12
13 On 05/14/2024 [REDACTED] body was released to [REDACTED] of Ayres Family Cremation and a signed release to
14 handle disposition was provided at the time of release.

15
16 I later responded to the St. Joe's lab and advised that there was no blood held for [REDACTED] I can speculate that all
17 initial samples were used for testing purposes as [REDACTED] was hemorrhaging blood when admitted and transfusions
18 needed to be done. I reviewed medical records and observed that a "urine tox" screen was positive for cannabis
19 only upon admission. Due to [REDACTED] blood which was drawn at organ harvest being from more than a week after
20 the incident where he was shot I did not elect to sending his blood in for toxicology.

21
22 All photographs were downloaded onto the Coroner's 'P' drive.

23
24 All documents are in a file located at the Coroner's Station listed under this case number.

3 On 5/1/2024, I was working patrol for the Humboldt County Sheriffs Office (HCSO). I was wearing a distinctly
4 marked HCSO uniform and was driving marked HCSO patrol vehicle

5
6 On this day, HCSO Major Crimes Division (MCD) Investigator Henderson requested I conduct a photo-line up with
7 (W) [REDACTED] [REDACTED] due to me having no intimate knowledge of this case nor had I previous seen, personally or
8 depicted in any photograph or other media, the [REDACTED] in this case.

9
10 At approximately 1633 hours, [REDACTED] arrived at the HCSO Main Station Patrol Headquarters. I met [REDACTED] in

I then concluded this interview and provided MCD Investigator Henderson with the HCSO Photo Line Up Admonition form and photo line-up packet.

1 I, Justin Braud, have been a full time peace officer in the State of California since December of 2002. I am
2 currently employed by the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office (HCSO), holding the rank of Undersheriff.

3
4 On 04/25/2024, I was on duty, in my office at the Eureka Main Station, wearing a distinctly marked law
5 enforcement uniform. At approximately 1032 hours, I heard deputies being dispatched to a report of a an
6 elderly female gunshot victim at [REDACTED] Fern Street. I ran outside, entered my distinctly marked law enforcement
7 vehicle, and began responding code 3. The following is, to the best of my recollection, a summary of my
8 involvement from this point forward:

9
10 While en-route, via radio broadcasts from HCSO Dispatch, I learned that the [REDACTED] had fled on foot, wearing all
11 black, having black curly shoulder length hair with some facial hair, and possibly wearing glasses. Additional
12 description was the subject was younger looking, last seen wearing a jacket with lettering on the back.

13
14 Emergency Medical Services (EMS) were also dispatched to the scene to stage.

15
16 During my response I heard Lieutenant Moore, Deputy Rogers, Deputy Truex, and Sergeant Gomes arrive in the
17 area of the call for service.

18
19 At approximately 1038 hours, I heard someone broadcast over the radio that they were possibly out with the
20 subject at the intersection of Cedar Street and Fern Street. Moments later, I heard via radio that the [REDACTED] fled

20 --**Complex:** Limited data, predominant ambiguity, difficult to demonstrate.

21 **Evaluation Conclusions:**

22 --**Identification:** is the conclusion reached when an examiner determines two friction ridge impressions are in agreement and that the friction ridge impressions originated from the same source.

24 --**Exclusion:** The determination by an examiner that there is sufficient quality and quantity of detail in disagreement to conclude that two friction ridge impressions did not originate from the same source.

26 --**Inconclusive:** An inconclusive decision occurs when an examiner is unable to identify or exclude the source of a impression because the corresponding areas of friction ridge detail are absent or unreliable.

2 The Humboldt County Sheriff's Office (HCSO) conducts digital forensic examinations utilizing licensed Cellebrite
 3 UFED 4PC software (version 10.2) and Cellebrite UFED Physical Analyzer (PA) software (version 10.2). The UFED
 4 platform allows for data extractions from mobile devices (phones, tablets), Subscriber Identity Modules (SIM),
 5 external media cards (SD/Micro-SD, USB flash drives) and some sUAS (drones). The software can perform logical,
 6 file system and physical data extractions and can include deleted information. The software has the capability of
 7 bypassing many locked (password protected/pattern locked) devices. The extraction, decoding and analysis of
 8 data can include call logs, phonebook, text messages (SMS), pictures, videos, audio files, and more from
 9 BlackBerry, Windows, Android, and iOS devices. Extractions and generated reports are stored on remote flash
 10 drives that have been forensically sterilized.

11 I hold certifications from Cellebrite in mobile Forensic Fundamentals, Certified Operator, Certified Physical
 12 Analyst and Cellebrite Advanced Smartphone Analysis.

2 **Summary/Results of Examination:** I received a signed HCSO consent to search form for item #1. I received
3 administrative approval for the examination of items #2 and #3. A signed Superior Court of California, County of
4 Humboldt search warrant was received for items #4-7. A second signed Superior Court of California, County of
5 Humboldt search warrant was received for item #8.

6 **Item #1 (iPhone XR):** The phone was on and charged. It was locked with a 6 digit pass code. I unlocked it with the
7 pass code [REDACTED] provided to me by Investigator Henderson. I attempted to utilize UFED 4PC to perform a chat
8 capture, however, the phone would not connect to UFED. I manually took a video of the SMS conversation
9 between the owner of the phone and the native contact [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] I provided the video to Investigator
10 Henderson.

11 **Item #2 (Samsung Galaxy Xcover):** This phone is Deputy Rogers' work phone. The phone was off. I charged the
12 phone and powered it on. I placed the phone in airplane mode. The phone was locked with a 4 digit pass code. I
13 unlocked the phone with the pass code [REDACTED] provided to me by Deputy Rogers. I set the lock screen to none. I
14 enabled developer options and USB debugging. I disabled verify apps over USB. I utilized UFED 4PC to perform a
15 file system and logical extraction on the phone. I utilized PA to parse the data and generate a Cellebrite report for
16 data from 04/25/2024. I briefly reviewed the Cellebrite report. I did not see anything of evidentiary value.

17 **Item #3 (Samsung Galaxy Xcover):** This phone is Lt. Moore's work phone. The phone was on and fully charged. It
18 was locked with a 4 digit pass code. I placed the phone in airplane mode. I unlocked the phone with the pass
19 code [REDACTED]" provided by Lt. Moore. I set the lock screen to none. Developer options were enabled. USB
20 debugging was enabled. Verify apps over USB was disabled. I utilized UFED 4PC to perform a file system and
21 logical extraction on the phone. I utilized PA to parse the data and generate a Cellebrite report for data from
22 04/25/2024. I briefly reviewed the Cellebrite report. I did not see anything of evidentiary value.

23 **Item #4 (Galaxy A03s):** This phone is [REDACTED] [REDACTED] work phone. The phone was on and fully charged. I removed
24 the SIM card. The phone was locked with a 6 digit pass code. I unlocked the phone with the pass code [REDACTED]
25 provided by [REDACTED] IT disabled the MDM running on the phone. I enabled developer options, stay awake,
26 USB debugging and disabled verify apps over USB. I utilized UFED 4PC to perform a partial advanced logical
27 extraction on the phone. The file system extraction failed. I utilized PA to parse the data from the extraction and
28 generate a Cellebrite report. I briefly reviewed the report. I did not see anything of evidentiary value.

29 **Item #5 (HP Chromebook):** The computer was off. I powered on the computer. The computer was locked with a
30 password. The user name was [REDACTED]. A phone number of [REDACTED] was next to the login

1 information. I removed a 256GB Samsung Evo select micro SD card from the computer. I utilized UFED 4PC to
2 perform a file system extraction on the SD card. I utilized PA to parse the data from the extraction and generate a
3 Cellebrite report. I briefly reviewed the Cellebrite report. I did not see anything of evidentiary value. The
4 computer was sent to Sac Valley Hi Tech for further analysis.

5 **Item #6 (Fire HD 8):** The tablet was off. I charged the tablet and powered it on. It was not locked. I placed it in
6 airplane mode. I enabled developer options, stay awake, and USB debugging. I utilized UFED 4PC to perform a
7 file system and partial advanced logical extraction. I utilized PA to parse the data and generate a Cellebrite
8 report. I briefly reviewed the Cellebrite report. I did not see anything of evidentiary value.

9 **Item #7 (XPS Laptop):** The laptop was on and locked. [REDACTED] restarted the laptop and provided the login including
10 the password for the laptop. Investigator Henderson manually inspected the contents of the laptop while it was
11 connected to the [REDACTED] network. I copied a small number of files from the laptop to a flash drive that Investigator
12 Henderson found to be of interest. I provided the flash drive to him.

13 **Item #8 (Bell J1):** The camera was off. The batteries had been removed to prevent data being overwritten on the
14 internal 32GB micro SD card. I removed the micro SD card from the camera.
15 I utilized a write blocker to attempt to view the files on the SD card. The files were in a folder labeled 2021. The
16 video files were in a .dat file format and I was unable to view the files. I utilized UFED 4PC to perform a file
17 system extraction on the SD card. PA is unable to fully parse the data of the .dat files for viewing the video,
18 however, the metadata data for the files was parsed and showed modified dates for the files as all being in 2021.
19 The camera is capable of sending data to the cloud through the Cloudedge application on a phone. Crime Analyst
20 [REDACTED] attempted to access item 202401627-12 (Black Samsung cellphone) with Cellebrite premium, however,
21 she was unsuccessful. This item was located in the pants pocket of [REDACTED] and we believed it may possibly contain
22 the CloudEdge application linked to the camera. I downloaded and set up a CloudEdge account and linked my
23 account to the camera in an attempt to view the video files on the SD card through the CloudEdge application. I
24 was unable to see saved video through the CloudEdge application. The application does provide cloud storage
25 for a monthly price. I utilized PrismVideoConverter software to convert copies of some of the .dat files from the
26 SD card to an mp4 file type to allow them to be viewed with VLC media player. I was able to see a time stamp on
27 the video from one of the files that corresponded to the date 2021-07-24 , all the data files were in folders dated
28 2021. This leads me to believe that the SD card was full and new videos were not overwriting old files. Therefore,
29 there was no video of the incident stored to the SD card. It is unknown if [REDACTED] had a cloud account with the
30 Cloudedge application to store video to from the camera. Hangzhou MEARI technology Co., LTD, the seller of the
31 CloudEdge application is a Chinese company which may complicate attempts to gather potential cloud video
32 data from them through legal process such as search warrants.

10 **Logical Extraction:** Performed through Application Programming Interface (API). Contains SMS, contacts, call
11 logs, media and app data.

12 **System File Extraction:** Device-specific methods to copy the file system. Contains, SMS, contacts, call logs,
13 media, app data, files and hidden files.

14 **Physical Extraction:** (full flash image, most data) extracts a bit by bit binary image of the flash memory. Has file
15 system, user data, and unallocated space (deleted files), can contain passwords.

16 **Image Hash Verification:** Conducting pre and post examination hash verification is considered best practice in
17 digital forensics. A hash value is the outcome of a mathematical algorithm, used to uniquely identify the content
18 of a file. It shows that the data was not altered after the initial extraction.

19 **Verification:** Verification of findings can be done through hand scrolling, third party tools, or database
20 verification and analysis. All three methods can prove the extracted information is true and accurate.

21 **Sterilized media:** All bytes on a drive are replaced with a known value.

22 **Decoding:** Translates the RAW data within a database file to a recognizable format.
