On October 3, 2007 at approximately 1220 hours, I was contacted at my residence by Detectives Schlesiger and Quenell. I was informed an Officer Involved Shooting had occurred on Pacific Lumber Company property near the McCann area. I was told Deputy Fulton was involved and was unharmed. I was told the [REDACTED] was deceased. Detective Schlesiger requested my assistance in processing the crime scene.

We traveled to Holmes Flat and crossed the Eel River summer bridge located on Larabee Ranch Rd. After crossing the railroad tracks, we turned north on Pacific Lumber Company Rd. We traveled approximately 13 miles to the location of the incident.

We arrived on scene at approximately 1515 hours. Sgt. Wayne Hanson, Deputy Todd Fulton, Deputy Cyrus Silva, Reserve Deputy Bruce Anfinson, Sgt. Phil Buihner, Sgt. Ken Swithenbank, and Deputy Allen Stockton were present upon my arrival. D.A. Chief Investigator Mike Hislop, D.A. Investigator Steve Dunn and D.A. Investigator Wayne Cox arrived shortly after. Refer to crime scene log for details.

Detective Schlesiger briefed me on the incident. I was told Deputies Fulton, Silva and Anfinson were in the area checking for a marijuana grow reported by Palco Security employees. I was told Deputies Fulton and Silva had traveled down a trail leading to an old logging road. Deputy Fulton had traveled into a wooded area where he had located what appeared to be a camp. Deputy Fulton followed a trail from the camp leading into a small ravine. Deputy Fulton encountered the [REDACTED] who raised a shotgun at him. Deputy Fulton fired his weapon hitting the [REDACTED]. I was told CHP arrived by helicopter to provide medical assistance and the [REDACTED] was pronounced deceased. I was told Deputy Silva was not in the immediate area during the incident. Refer to Detective Schlesiger's report for details.

I was told the location of the incident was approximately ¼ to ½ mile from where our vehicles were parked. I was told this was not the trail initially taken by Deputies Fulton and Silva. We followed an old logging road, which led us to an open landing area. I was

told this was where the CHP helicopter had landed. We noticed what appeared to be several marijuana plants located on the side of the road. The plants had been cut and the stems remained. We met with Deputies Fulton and Silva. Deputy Fulton showed me the trail they used to gain access to the area. I marked the bottom of the trail with a large branch. Deputy Fulton took us to the area where the incident occurred. The area was located down a short trail through vegetation and trees to the camp. We noticed what appeared to be three beds or tables located at the camp. The tables were made of branches laid out between the trees. The tables were located above the ground. I noticed several black plastic pipes in the camp area. There was a flow of water coming out of one of the pipes. Deputy Fulton took us through the camp to a trailhead. The trail was steep leading down to a ravine. The [REDACTED] was located at the bottom of the ravine. Deputy Fulton showed us where he was standing during the time the shots were fired. Using a Nikon digital camera, I took photographs of Deputy Fulton's position.

I proceeded to take photographs of Deputy Fulton and Deputy Silva. After photographing the deputies, we hiked back to the location of the vehicles. At approximately 1640 hours, I proceeded to swab Deputy Silva and Deputy Fulton's hands for possible gunshot residue. I was told Deputy Silva did not fire his weapon. I was told both deputies had fired their weapons on the previous day. Deputy Fulton informed me he had used an alcohol-based towelette on his hands after checking the [REDACTED] for a pulse. I did not notice any visible blood on the deputy's hands. I later booked 4 swabs into evidence.

I was told Deputy Fulton would be traveling back to the Sheriff's Office Main Station with Detective Nord. I was told Detective Nord would be examining Deputy Fulton's weapon and would be obtaining a blood sample. Refer to Detective Nord's report for details.

Per Detective Schlesiger, I traveled to the area of the trail used by Deputy Fulton and Deputy Silva to gain access to the suspected marijuana grow. I met with Sgt. Swithenbank, Deputy Stockton and Deputy Anfinson. Using an Olympus digital camera, I took photographs of the trailhead used by the deputies. Using Sgt. Swithenbank's GPS, I recorded the coordinates of the trailhead to be N 40 23.49 and W 123 52.54. I recorded the elevation to be approximately 1296 feet. Due to the steepness of this trail, it was not used by Investigators to gain access to the incident area.

I went back to the entrance of the old logging road and met with Detective Quenell. We traveled back to the incident location. Using an Olympus digital camera, I took photographs of the trail used by Investigators. I arrived back on scene and met with D.A. Chief Investigator Mike Hislop and D.A. Investigator Wayne Cox. Per Detective Schlesiger, Hislop and Cox were assigned to assist me in processing the scene. I was told they would be utilizing a Total Station diagramming instrument to document the scene. Due to the terrain and location of the incident, Hislop and Cox were unable to diagram the scene with their equipment.

Using a Nikon digital camera, I proceeded to take photographs. I continued to photograph throughout the search. Using a digital video recorder, I proceeded to take a video of the [REDACTED] body from the location where Deputy Fulton was standing during the incident. There was an expended cartridge case located on the ground near the area of Deputy Fulton's feet. The video file was later transferred to DVD and booked into evidence. I took a video from the area where Deputy Fulton was standing through the camp and back to the open landing area. The video file was later transferred to DVD and booked into evidence.

D.A. Investigator Cox and I proceeded to search the camp for possible evidence. The items to be collected were marked with numbered evidence markers. The camp was located in a flat area above the small ravine where the [REDACTED] was shot. The camp was surrounded by forest and covered by tree canopy. I noticed black plastic pipe, ropes and branches placed in a grid pattern above the camp. The area was damp. We noticed what appeared to be marijuana leaves on the three structures resembling tables. I noticed a growing marijuana plant and empty bags of fertilizer on the trail leading from the landing area to the camp.

A narrow foot trail led from the camp to the body located at the bottom of the ravine in a rock out cropping. The foot trail continued beyond the body and up the hill. I was told there were two additional camps that had been located up this trail. I was told several drying marijuana plants had been located in the additional camps. Refer to HCSO DEU Deputies reports for details.

D.A. Investigator Cox and I located a black plastic bag containing garbage inside the camp. Cox and I proceeded to search the bag for possible evidence. We located a white plastic grocery bag from "Lola's Market and Restaurant" with two addresses in Santa Rosa, CA. I photographed the bag. We located a white plastic grocery bag from "FoodMaxx". I photographed the bag. We located several "Reynolds Oven Bags Cooking Guides". I photographed these items. We did not collect any items from the black plastic bag.

We noticed clothing articles on the table located on the north side of the camp. We examined these items and found a pair of Levi Jeans, camouflaged t-shirt and socks. We did not locate any items inside the pockets. We located 3 empty Coca Cola cans on the southwest side of the camp near the trail. I marked these items with evidence marker #1. We located what appeared to be a grocery list written partly in Spanish and a piece of torn cardboard with the number "318464" on top of the table located on the north side of the camp. I marked these items with evidence marker #2. I noticed an electronic scale box located next to the grocery list. I photographed this item. We located a receipt from Lola's Market in Santa Rosa dated 09-15-2007 17:25:05. The receipt was located on the ground near the table on the north side of the camp. I marked this item with evidence marker #3. We located a Sauza Tequila bottle on the ground near the table located on the south east side of the camp. The bottle contained approximately 1 inch of liquid. I marked this item with evidence marker #4. We located a machete with a red and black handle on the trail approximately 4 feet above where Deputy Fulton was standing. I

marked this item with evidence marker #5. I marked the Winchester .40 S&W expended cartridge case, which was located near the position of Deputy Fulton's feet, with evidence marker #6. I marked the shotgun, located near the [REDACTED] body, with evidence marker #7.

After marking the items of evidence, I proceeded to take additional photographs. After photographing, I requested Detective Quenell clear the shotgun of any ammunition. Detective Quenell located 5 Remington 12 gauge 9 Pel. 00BK shotgun shells inside the magazine. Detective Quenell stated he did not locate a shotgun shell in the chamber of the weapon. I took possession of the 5 shotgun shells. The shotgun was a Mossberg 500A 12 gauge with serial number [REDACTED]. The stock was broken away from the weapon and held together with rope. The wood on the gun was painted green.

I was informed that the weapon was originally located next to the [REDACTED]. I was told deputies moved the weapon for safety reasons. Refer to Detective Schlesiger's report for details.

The [REDACTED] was lying on his back with his hands at his sides. His head was resting, to the side, on a large rock located behind his body. There was a baseball cap located on the ground near the [REDACTED] head. I noticed blood on the [REDACTED] shirt and pants. The [REDACTED] sweatshirt had been cut in the front and his shirt was unbuttoned. I was told CHP Officers had cut the clothing to administer medical aid. I was told the [REDACTED] had been moved from his original position during medical aid. I was told Deputy Silva had taken photographs of the [REDACTED] before he was moved.

While awaiting the Coroner's arrival, Hislop, Cox and I proceeded to collect the items of evidence. I later booked these items into evidence. I was later informed that the machete belonged to Deputy Fulton.

Deputy Coroner Charles Comer arrived at approximately 1800 hours. Refer to crime scene log for exact time. Deputy Coroner Comer and I took additional photographs of the [REDACTED] before he was moved. We noticed a wallet shaped object in the [REDACTED] left front pants pocket. Deputy Coroner Comer removed the item and found a stack of what appeared to be business cards held together with a rubber band. On the top of the stack we located a California State Benefits Card for [REDACTED] with a date of birth [REDACTED]. We located what appeared to be a portion of a copper jacket from a bullet. The metal fragment was lying in the [REDACTED] navel. Deputy Coroner Comer located what appeared to be a bullet hole in the [REDACTED] left chest above the nipple. Deputy Coroner Comer located additional shotgun shells in the [REDACTED] right front pants pocket. Per my request, those items were not removed.

Deputy Coroner Comer took possession of the body at approximately 1945 hours. Deputy Coroner Comer took possession of the baseball cap, the metal fragment and the stack of business cards to be transported with the [REDACTED] to the Humboldt County Coroner's Office.

Due to lighting conditions, Sgt. Buihner and Deputy Maus secured the scene for the night so processing could resume in the morning. The numbered evidence markers were left in place. We cleared the scene at approximately 2030 hours.

Using Detective Schlesiger's digital camera, Sgt. Hanson and I took a total of 44 digital photographs (PA030001-PA030030 [REDACTED] PA030031 – PA030044 Sgt. Hanson). The digital photographs were later transferred to CD ROM and booked into evidence.

On October 4, 2007 at approximately 1050 hours, I returned to the Summer Bridge location on Larabee Ranch Rd. and met with DOJ Criminalist [REDACTED]. Also present were D.A. Investigators Mike Hislop and Wayne Cox, Sgt. Hanson, Deputy Mark Peterson and Detective Marvin Kirkpatrick. We proceeded back to the scene and arrived at approximately 1150 hours. Sgt. Buihner and Deputy Maus were on scene.

D.A. Investigators Mike Hislop and Wayne Cox, DOJ Criminalist [REDACTED] and I proceeded to the incident location to process the scene for additional evidence. Other law enforcement personnel processed the marijuana located at the two additional campsites. Refer to HCSO DEU reports for details.

I briefed [REDACTED] on the previous items of evidence that were located on scene and collected on October 3. Using a metal detector, we proceeded to search for expended cartridge cases and fired bullets. I was told that Deputy Fulton had fired his weapon five times.

We searched the area where Deputy Fulton indicated he was standing. We were able to locate 4 Winchester .40 S&W expended cartridge cases just below and to the right of where Deputy Fulton was standing. The 4 cartridge cases were in close proximity to each other. I placed numbered evidence markers (numbered 8, 9, 10 and 11) next to each expended cartridge case.

Using a Nikon digital camera, I took photographs of the expended cartridge cases. We did not locate any further expended cartridge cases during our search. I collected the 4 expended cartridge cases and later booked them into evidence.

During our search, D.A. Investigator Cox located a copper jacketed fired bullet on the ground where the [REDACTED] body had been located. I marked this item with evidence marker #12. I took photographs of the fired bullet. I noticed what appeared to be fibers and foreign material on the bullet. I collected the fired bullet and later booked it into evidence.

Using a metal detector, DOJ Criminalist [REDACTED] searched the hillside east of the location of the [REDACTED] body. [REDACTED] located a lead metal fragment and a copper jacketed fired bullet in the dirt on the hillside. I placed numbered evidence marker #13 next to the lead fragment and numbered evidence marker #14 next to the copper jacketed fired bullet. I

took photographs of the metal fragment and fired bullet. I collected these two items and later booked them into evidence.

We did not locate any further evidence.

██████████ and I discussed options for diagrams and documentation of evidence positions. We used a range finder, tape measurer and measuring wheel to document the distances between items and places. We used GPS coordinates to document the open landing site west of the campsite and the bottom of the trail used by deputies to gain access to the area.

██████████ and I proceeded to document measurements. ██████████ recorded all of the measurements and GPS coordinates. We measured approximately 23 feet 6 inches from the trailhead located at the northeast corner of the campsite to Deputy Fulton's indicated position at the time of the shooting. We used Deputy Fulton's indicated position as a reference mark when measuring the items of evidence. All of the measurements are approximate. ██████████ and I took the following measurements from the reference mark using a measuring tape:

Item #11	Winchester .40 S&W expended cartridge case	8 feet 6 inches
Item #12	copper jacketed fired bullet ██████████ body	25 feet 8 inches

██████████ and I took the following measurements from the reference mark using a Nikon range finder:

Item #13	lead metal fragment	13 yards
Item #14	copper jacketed fired bullet	12.5 yards

Due to the terrain of the ravine, the measurements taken from Deputy Fulton's indicated position to items #7, #12, #13 and #14 were line of sight measurements.

██████████ and I measured approximately 181 feet from the campsite to the landing site located to the west. We recorded the GPS coordinates for the landing site to be N 40 22.585 W 123 47.194 (+/- 20 feet). We recorded the GPS coordinates for the bottom of the trail used by Deputy Fulton and Deputy Silva to be N 40 22.540 W 123 47.187 (+/- 44 feet).

At approximately 1450 hours, Detective Schlesiger, D.A. Investigator Steve Dunn and Deputy Fulton arrived on scene. Attorney ██████████ accompanied Deputy Fulton. Detective Schlesiger requested I take a video of Deputy Fulton's re-enactment of the incident. After the initial walk-through, I proceeded to take a video of the re-enactment. I took a total of 2 video files. The video files were later transferred to DVD and booked

into evidence. Deputy Fulton's re-enactment of the incident was consistent with the firearms evidence located at the scene. Refer to Detective Schlesiger's report for details.

We concluded our search and all Law Enforcement personnel cleared the scene.

I took a total of 154 digital photographs on October 3 and October 4. The digital photographs were later transferred to CD ROM and booked into evidence.

I later received 20 digital photographs from Deputy Silva that were taken on October 3. I later booked the CD ROM into evidence.

On October 5, 2007, D.A. Investigator Steve Dunn and I traveled to Sonoma County Coroner's Office to attend the autopsy of the [REDACTED] believed to be [REDACTED]. We arrived at the Coroner's Office at approximately 0800 hours and met with Forensic Pathologist Dr. [REDACTED].

Deputy Coroner Charles Comer transported the body from the Humboldt County Coroner's Office.

The autopsy began at approximately 0830 hours. Deputy Coroner Comer brought x-rays of the [REDACTED]. The x-rays revealed opaque objects in the torso region. Using a Nikon digital camera, I took photographs of the x-rays.

The body was encased in a red body bag. The bag contained a Humboldt County Coroner's Office identification tag with case number C179-07 and John Doe. I took photographs of the body bag prior to removal. I continued to photograph throughout the autopsy. Dr. [REDACTED] removed the body bag from the [REDACTED].

The [REDACTED] was fully clothed wearing blue jeans, a shirt, a sweatshirt, socks and shoes. The monitor pads, used by CHP Officers during medical aid, were still on the body. Dr. [REDACTED] proceeded to remove the clothing and items from the pockets. I took possession of the following items from Deputy Coroner Comer: A "Signature" brand, camouflage baseball cap, which was located on scene near the [REDACTED] head. A copper metal fragment, which had been removed from the suspect's naval. Miscellaneous cards and California State Benefits Card for [REDACTED] which had been removed from the [REDACTED] left front pants pocket. The stack of cards contained business cards, phone numbers, addresses and receipts. I later booked these items into evidence. I photocopied the indicia located in the [REDACTED] left front pants pocket. The photocopies will be stored with the original evidence booking report.

I took photographs of the personal items and clothing as Dr. [REDACTED] removed them from the body. I later took possession of the following items: Religious medallion and rope necklace located around the [REDACTED] neck; pack of Marlboro cigarettes and 1 green Bic lighter located in the left front shirt pocket; folding pocket knife, Mini Mag flashlight, 1 - \$1 bill, 4 red 12 gauge shotgun slug and 1 green Remington 12 gauge 00BK shotgun shell located in the right front pants pocket; 2 white socks; 2 brown "Itasca" hiking boots size

9; gray Hanes underwear size L; gray "Zipcode" brand hooded sweatshirt (cut in front); gray plaid "Knightsbridge" short-sleeve, button-up shirt; and blue jeans "Made in Mexico" size 38x30 with brown embroidered belt in belt loops. I later booked these items into evidence.

I proceeded to swab the [REDACTED] hands. I later booked 4 swabs into evidence. Dr. [REDACTED] collected fingernail clippings from the right and left hands. I took possession of the clippings and later booked them into evidence. Dr. [REDACTED] collected head hairs standards. I took possession of the head hair standards and later booked them into evidence.

Dr. [REDACTED] proceeded with the external portion of the autopsy. Dr. [REDACTED] documented three separate bullet wounds. Dr. [REDACTED] labeled the bullet wounds as follows: Wound #1 was to the [REDACTED] left chest; wound #2 was to the [REDACTED] left shoulder and wound #3 was to the [REDACTED] left elbow. Dr. [REDACTED] noted a grazing wound located on the [REDACTED] abdomen. Dr. [REDACTED] stated this wound might have been the bullet that traveled through the left elbow. The grazing wound was located above the naval where a portion of copper jacket had been found.

Dr. [REDACTED] placed probes into the shoulder and chest wounds. I took photographs of the probes in place.

Dr. [REDACTED] proceeded with the internal portion of the autopsy. Dr. [REDACTED] was able to recover two expended bullets from inside the body. Dr. [REDACTED] located an expended bullet from the gunshot wound to the chest and an expended bullet from the gunshot wound to the shoulder. Refer to Dr. [REDACTED] report for details. After photographing the expended bullets, I took possession of these items and later booked them into evidence.

The autopsy concluded at approximately 1100 hours. I took a total of 125 digital photographs. The digital photographs were later transferred to CD ROM and booked into evidence. A copy of the CD ROM will be forwarded to Dr. [REDACTED]

I requested Deputy Coroner Comer forward a set of rolled fingerprints from the [REDACTED]

On October 12, 2007 at approximately 0945 hours, I received a set of rolled fingerprints of the [REDACTED] from Deputy Coroner Comer. I entered the possible [REDACTED] name and date of birth [REDACTED] into the DOJ CLETS system. The CLETS system returned with a state identification number of [REDACTED]. I entered the state identification number into the Department of Justice Automated Archive system and retrieved a fingerprint chart for [REDACTED]. I compared the rolled fingerprints of the deceased [REDACTED] to the fingerprint chart for [REDACTED]. I was able to establish identification of the [REDACTED]. I informed Detective Schlesiger and the Deputy Coroner Comer of the identification. I later booked the fingerprint chart and the rolled fingerprints into evidence.

On November 16, 2007, I processed the Mossberg shotgun for latent prints. I was unable to obtain any latent prints with sufficient ridge detail for comparison. I informed Detective Schlesiger of the results.

Per Detective Schlesiger, I processed Deputy Fulton's clothing and equipment on December 10, 2007. I retrieved the clothing and equipment from the HCSO Property Evidence Room. The clothing and equipment were originally booked into evidence by Detective Nord on October 4, 2007. I performed a visual examination, ALS examination and performed presumptive tests for blood using Hemastix reagent strips. Using a Nikon digital camera, I took photographs during my examination. The following are results of my examination:

1 pen and 1 pencil in the left breast pocket (shirt was worn underneath
sweatshirt and vest)

No visible signs of blood

Hemastix test brown stain on rt breast pocket – negative

No additional stains located

Shirt was worn underneath sweatshirt and vest

Item #2 "Sheriff's Sweater" black sweatshirt w/ Sheriff's emblem, Jerzees brand
size LG (sweatshirt was worn underneath vest)

No visible signs of blood

Hemastix test right/left, interior/exterior cuffs - negative

Hemastix test brown stain on right sleeve near shoulder – negative

No additional stains located

Item #4 Green pants: "Horace Small" size 30 R 37U w/ black belt and Jaguar folding
knife in right front pocket

No visible signs of blood

Mud/dirt located in bottom of pant legs

Hemastix test right/left bottom of pant legs/hems, interior/exterior – neg

Hemastix blade/handle of knife – negative

Item #3 Black baseball cap w/embroidered Sheriff emblem

No visible signs of blood

Hemastix test brown stain center front – negative

Hemastix test white stains on left side – negative

Hemastix test white stain on right side – weak positive for blood

Item #8 tan work gloves from vest

Gloves are dirty throughout

No visible signs of blood

Hemastix test fingertips – negative

Item #6 Black Sheriff raid vest w/4 pens in left breast pocket

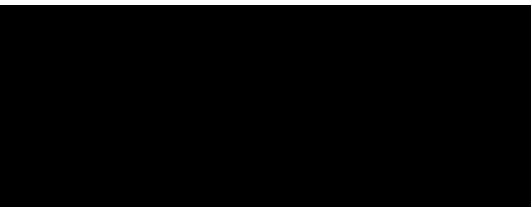
Dirt/mud throughout vest
No visible signs of blood
Item #6 con't. Black Sheriff raid vest w/4 pens in left breast pocket
Hemastix test white stain on right lower pocket flap – negative
Hemastix test white stain on right breast pocket flap – negative

Item #13 Glock 22 .40 caliber semi-automatic pistol [REDACTED]
No visible blood
Hemastix test barrel and grip – negative

The items were returned to the HCSO Property Evidence Room. Per Detective Schlesiger all items except the baseball cap and weapon will be returned to Deputy Todd Fulton.

I took a total of 29 digital photographs. The digital photographs were later transferred to CD ROM and booked into evidence.

Any further investigation will be a matter of report.

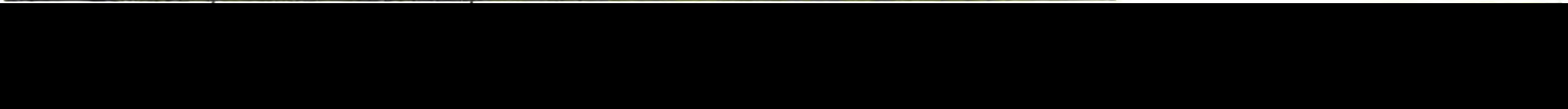

On September 23, 2007 at approximately 2110 hours, I was contacted at my residence by HCSO Detective Steve Quenell. Detective Quenell informed me that the California Highway Patrol was requesting my assistance in processing a scene, which involved an officer involved shooting incident. I was informed the incident had occurred in the Snow Camp area located east of Korb. I was instructed to meet Arcata Police Sgt. Dave Brown at the California Highway Patrol Office in Arcata. I was told CHP Officer Jeff Goodwin was involved and was standing by at the Arcata Office.

At approximately 2226 hours, I arrived at the CHP Office in Arcata. APD Sgt. Brown arrived shortly after. Sgt. Brown and I met with CHP Sgt. Rosendahl. Also present CHP Chief of the Northern Division Steven Bell. Sgt. Rosendahl informed us that other members of the California Highway Patrol were enroute to the office and we were instructed to stand by until their arrival.

At approximately 2323 hours, APD Sgt. Brown and I met with CHP Officer Jeff Goodwin and Officers from the CHP Investigative Services Unit in the CHP briefing room. CHP Investigator Jim Carter, APD Sgt. Brown and I proceeded to collect items of possible evidence from CHP Officer Goodwin. I collected a GSR Kit from Officer Goodwin's right and left hands. The GSR Kit was later booked into evidence at the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office. I was informed that Officer Goodwin had used an alcohol-based sanitizer on his hands following the incident.

Using a Nikon digital camera, I took photographs of Officer Goodwin. I noticed what appeared to be blood on Officer Goodwin's uniform pants and shirt. After photographing, I took possession of Officer Goodwin's uniform pants and shirt. I collected a pair of Sinatra Mfg. tan pants size 35 and an Elbeco tan shirt size 16 1/2 - 35. I later booked these two items into evidence at the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office. Per CHP Policy, Officer Goodwin retained his badge and nametag.

CHP Investigator Jim Carter and I proceeded to process Officer Goodwin's duty belt and equipment for possible evidence. Investigator Carter recorded the information from Officer Goodwin's bulletproof vest. The vest was not collected. Refer to Investigator Carter's report for details. Using a Nikon digital camera, I took photographs of the duty belt and equipment. I examined the following items on the duty belt for possible blood: expandable baton, can of pepper spray, gun holster, hand held Motorola HT1000 radio [REDACTED] 2 firearm magazines and Peerless handcuffs [REDACTED]. We deployed the expandable baton and I noticed a red stain. I swabbed the stain and later booked the swab into evidence. I noticed red stains on the Peerless handcuffs. I took possession of the handcuffs and later booked them into evidence. We removed the cartridges from the two magazines. We counted 11 Speer .40 S&W cartridges in each magazine. The magazine and cartridges were photographed. I did not notice any visible blood on any of the additional items examined.

I took possession of Officer Goodwin's duty weapon. We took photographs of the weapon and performed a check on the cartridges. The weapon was a Smith & Wesson 40 Tactical semi-automatic pistol model 4006TSW. The weapon contained CHP# 5158 and [REDACTED]. There was one Speer .40 S&W cartridge that had been removed from the chamber. We checked the magazine and found 8 Speer .40 S&W cartridges. I later booked the weapon, magazine and cartridges into evidence at the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office.

I took possession of a Bersa Thunder 380 DLX semi-auto pistol with 1 magazine from CHP Officer Cipriano. The pistol contained no ammunition and the serial number had been filed off. I was told the weapon had been taken off of the [REDACTED]. I later booked the weapon, magazine and original evidence packaging into evidence at the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office.

We concluded our processing at approximately 0013 hours. Per Detective Quenell, I started enroute to the scene.

At approximately 0200 hours, I arrived on scene and met with DA Chief Investigator Mike Hislop and HCSO Detective Quenell. Agents from the California Highway Patrol, Humboldt County Sheriff's Office and the District Attorney's Office were also on scene. Refer to CHP Crime Scene Log for details.

DA Chief Investigator Hislop briefed me on the incident. Inv. Hislop told me CHP Officer Goodwin was on a traffic stop in Blue Lake when a citizen informed him that there was a possible intoxicated driver at the Blue Lake 76 Gas Station. Officer Goodwin located the driver and attempted a traffic stop. The driver failed to yield and a pursuit ensued. Officer Goodwin pursued the vehicle on Snow Camp Rd. to High Prairie Rd. The pursuit ended at a gate on High Prairie Rd. I was told Officer Goodwin had exited his vehicle and the [REDACTED] was backing his vehicle towards Officer Goodwin. I was told Goodwin had fired at the vehicle hitting [REDACTED] in the right shoulder. I was told [REDACTED] was transported, via helicopter, to Redding for medical

treatment. I was instructed to process the crime scene for possible evidence and assist the CHP M.A.I.T. Investigators who would be constructing a diagram on the scene.

Using a Nikon digital camera, I took photographs of the scene prior to my initial walk through with Inv. Hislop. The scene was secured with crime scene tape. Hislop showed me three expended cartridge cases that had been marked prior to my arrival. There was an orange cone and paint marking each of the three cases. There were two orange cones marking the tire impressions made by CHP Sgt. Larsen's vehicle when he arrived to assist Officer Goodwin. Sgt. Larsen's vehicle had been moved prior to my arrival. Officer Goodwin's patrol vehicle (California Exempt license plate number [REDACTED] and the [REDACTED] vehicle (California license plate number [REDACTED] were facing with the front of the vehicles towards the gate. I noticed the passenger door of the [REDACTED] vehicle was open. The left rear tire of the [REDACTED] vehicle was flat. I noticed a pair of boots and medical equipment located on the ground near the rear of the [REDACTED] vehicle. I noticed a wallet and its contents were located on the trunk of the [REDACTED] vehicle. I noticed shoe impressions on the ground near the rear of Officer Goodwin's patrol vehicle. I noticed the dirt was disturbed near the [REDACTED] vehicle's driver's door. I noticed several shoe impressions on the ground in this same area. Inv. Hislop told me there was a struggle between the Officer's and [REDACTED] in this area. I noticed what appeared to be a handprint in the dust on Officer Goodwin's patrol vehicle. This was located on the trunk on the right side of the vehicle. I noticed what appeared to be a shoeprint on the left rear bumper of the vehicle. Officer Goodwin's vehicle was covered with a layer of dust.

After my initial walk through, CHP M.A.I.T. Investigator Simon Hamann and I recorded the following GPS coordinates: back of the patrol vehicle N 40 degrees 49.342 W 123 degrees 47.841; gate N 40 degrees 49.344 W 123 degrees 47.820 (+/- 18 feet).

I proceeded to place numbered evidence markers on the three expended cartridge cases. Additional numbered evidence markers were placed on possible items of evidence as they were located. I took additional photographs and continued to photograph throughout the search. Using a digital video camera, I proceeded to take a video of the area. The video file was later transferred to DVD and booked into evidence.

Investigator Hamann and I proceeded to locate tire impressions related to this incident. The tire impressions were marked with orange paint and photographed.

At approximately 0405 hours, HCSO Sgt. Buihner informed us that Judge Cissna had signed the search warrant for the vehicle. Due to lighting conditions, the search warrant on the vehicle was not served at this time.

Investigator Hamann and I continued to locate, mark and photograph tire impressions related to this incident. At approximately 0430 hours, I collected 3 Speer .40 S& W expended cartridge cases that were previously marked and photographed. I placed 3 quarters in the location of the 3 expended cartridge cases for diagramming purposes. The 3 expended cartridge cases were later booked into evidence at the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office as item #'s 1, 2 and 3.

I proceeded to take an additional video of the scene. The video file was later transferred to DVD and booked into evidence at the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office.

At approximately 0730 hours, D.A. Investigator Stone served search warrant #6378 on the [REDACTED] vehicle. D.A. Investigator Stone and I proceeded to process the vehicle for possible evidence. The vehicle was a blue 1986 Cadillac with California license plate number [REDACTED]. I was informed the vehicle was registered to [REDACTED]. I took photographs of the additional evidence located outside the [REDACTED] vehicle which consisted of the following items: #4 pair of Timberland lace-up boots located on the ground near the rear of the [REDACTED] vehicle; #5 brown wallet engraved with the initials [REDACTED] containing 8 - \$100 bills, 1 - \$5 bill, 5 - \$1 bills, \$3.60 in change, Coast Central Credit Union transaction receipt 09-11-2007 [REDACTED] showing a balance of \$13,883.09, Coast Central Credit Union balance receipt 09-21-2007 total balance \$6,772.02 [REDACTED] Certificate of Title [REDACTED] signed by [REDACTED], Motel 6 receipt [REDACTED] 09-16-2007 Room 134, [REDACTED] and miscellaneous I.D. and business cards located on the trunk of the [REDACTED] vehicle; and #7 oxygen mask with possible blood used by ambulance personnel located on the ground near the left rear tire of the [REDACTED] vehicle. I later collected these items and booked them into evidence at the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office.

While searching the outside of the [REDACTED] vehicle, I noticed what appeared to be an expended copper jacketed bullet inside the rim of the flat left rear tire. This item was marked with numbered evidence marker #6 and photographed. This item was later collected and booked into evidence at the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office along with the items collected from inside the [REDACTED] vehicle.

D.A. Investigator Stone and I proceeded to search the interior of the vehicle. I took photographs throughout the search. I took photographs of the apparent bullet hole located in the left rear passenger window. The hole measured approximately 2.2 centimeters in length by 1.4 centimeters in width. The hole was located approximately 3 centimeters up from the bottom frame of the window. The hole was elliptical in shape indicating the bullet entered at an angle. We searched the interior and exterior of the vehicle but did not locate any evidence of further bullet damage. At the time of the search, I was unable to determine the trajectory of the bullet. I was told the vehicle was moving when CHP Officer Goodwin fired his weapon. I did not know the exact location of the vehicle or CHP Officer Goodwin when the bullet entered the window. I did not know the exact location on the body where the [REDACTED] had been struck by the bullet or the position of the [REDACTED] when he was struck.

The vehicle was found with the gearshift in the "Park" position. The light switch was off. I noticed that the ignition mechanism had been removed. The vehicle contained personal items, clothing, garbage and food items. I noticed the right rear passenger window was broken and contained tape. The driver and front passenger seat backs were in the reclined position. Upon further examination, we found that the driver's seat back was broken and could not be put in the upright position. The driver's seat back was at

approximately a 45-degree angle. I did not notice any areas of possible blood on the interior or exterior of the vehicle.

While searching the ground near the [REDACTED] vehicle's driver's door, I noticed what appeared to be blood in the dirt. This was the area of numerous shoe impressions and the area of the altercation between the Officer's and the [REDACTED]. Using Hemastix reagent strips, I performed a presumptive test for blood. The test was positive for the possibility of blood. I placed numbered evidence marker #8 near the area tested. After photographing, I collected a sample of the dirt with possible blood. I noticed 1 penny and 2 quarters in this same area. I collected the change. These items were later booked into evidence at the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office.

D.A. Investigator Stone and I collected the following items of evidence from inside the vehicle: clear plastic bag 6 1/2" x 4" containing [REDACTED] marijuana (GFW 11.0 grams) located in the center console; clear plastic bag 6 1/2" x 4" containing [REDACTED] marijuana (GFW 10.6 grams) located in the center console; 39 "Power 7's" California scratcher lottery tickets located in the center console; 2 "\$50,000 Poker" California scratcher lottery tickets located in the driver's floorboard; 76 Gas Station plastic grocery bag located on the driver's floorboard; suspected marijuana cigarette (GFW .8 grams) located on the driver's floorboard; plastic bag imprinted with WWW.GTBAG.COM containing 1 plastic bag imprinted with WWW.GTBAG.COM with white crystal substance (GFW 3.1 grams), 4 clear plastic bags approximately 1 3/8" x 1 1/8" with white crystal substance (1 - GFW .2 grams, 2 - GFW .3 grams and 1 - GFW .4 grams), 3 clear plastic bags approximately 1 5/8" x 1 1/4" with white crystal substance (2 - GFW .3 grams and 1 - GFW .4 grams) and 1 empty clear plastic bag; ignition button and hazard button located on the right rear floorboard; Coast Central Credit Union transaction receipt 09-21-2007 [REDACTED] located on the right rear floorboard; LG cell phone with [REDACTED] located inside the glove compartment; 4 white round tablets imprinted with "K38" later determined to be Acetaminophen located inside the glove compartment; 1 clear straw located on the right rear floorboard; white plastic grocery bag containing 238 small plastic bags (empty), 1 digital scale, 2 glass smoking pipes, 2 straws, 2 plastic bags approximately 1 1/2" x 1 1/8" with white crystal substance (GFW .3 grams each), 2 key chains, 4 candy bars and miscellaneous newspaper ads located on the right rear floorboard; Camel cigarette box containing glass smoking pipe, 2 straws, clear plastic bag with white residue located under the front passenger seat; and Remington folding knife, blade approximately 4" long located in the trunk. All of these items were later booked into evidence at the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office.

I examined the left rear (flat) tire for possible bullet holes. The tire was pumped with air and we noticed a hole located in the tread portion of the tire. The tire and rim were removed from the vehicle. I later booked this item into evidence at the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office.

We did not locate any further bullets or possible evidence inside the vehicle. D.A. Investigator Stone filled out the Search Warrant Inventory Form. Refer to his report for details.

After our search, the CHP M.A.I.T. Investigators continued with crime scene and vehicle measurements. I took additional photographs of tire impressions located by the Investigators. Refer to the M.A.I.T. diagram for details.

I took a total of 180 digital photographs. The digital photographs were later transferred to CD ROM and booked into evidence at the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office.

I cleared the scene at approximately 1300 hours and started enroute to the Arcata CHP Office.

At approximately 1440 hours, I arrived at the Arcata CHP Office and met with CHP Officer Neitske and Arcata P.D. Sgt. Brown. Sgt. Brown had collected the clothing and a blood sample obtained from [REDACTED]. Sgt. Brown informed me he had taken photographs of the clothing. Refer to Sgt. Brown's report for details. I took possession of the following items from Sgt. Brown: blood sample from [REDACTED] receipt from Shell on 5th Street, belt buckle (cut), key imprinted with "1", watch style money clip, watch band, 2 pockets cut from clothing, 1 needle cap, 12 quarters, 21 pennies, 9 nickels and 20 dimes; section of brown leather jacket (left side only, cut); red shirt with original packaging from hospital; green shirt and Old Navy jeans w/belt (cut). I later booked these items into evidence at the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office.

CHP Officer Neitske informed me he had obtained a video surveillance tape from the Blue Lake 76 gas station. I took possession of the tape and later booked it into evidence at the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office.

I cleared the Arcata CHP Office and transported the evidence to the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office Evidence/Property Room.

On September 26, 2007, I retrieved the left rear tire and rim obtained from the [REDACTED] vehicle on September 24, 2007 and transported this item to the Humboldt County Vehicle Maintenance Building located on Jacobs Ave. in Eureka.

Using a Nikon digital camera, I took photographs of the tire and rim. With the assistance of County Vehicle Maintenance employees, we removed the tire from the rim. Inside the tire, I located a copper colored metal fragment and pieces of black rubber. I later booked these into evidence at the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office as a separate item from the tire/rim. I was able to locate two hole in the tire which appeared to be an entrance hole located on the tread portion of the tire and an exit hole in the tire located in the area of the imprinted tire size. I placed a probe through the two holes and took photographs.

The tire was placed back on the rim and transported back to the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office Evidence/Property Room.

I took a total of 28 digital photographs. The digital photographs were later transferred to CD ROM and booked into evidence.

On this same date, I contacted the California Lottery Commission to determine the origin of the lottery tickets obtained from the [REDACTED] vehicle. The origin can be determined by a series of numbers located on the back of the tickets. I was told the 39 "Power 7's" lottery tickets were sold to Blue Lake 76 Gas Station and the 2 "\$50,000 Poker" lottery tickets were sold to Texaco Station on Broadway in Eureka. - 2-16 One fired copper jacketed lead hollow point bullet
- 4-1 Smith & Wesson Model 4006TSW pistol [REDACTED] chambered for .40 S & W cartridges issued to Officer Goodwin
- 4-2 One Speer .40 S & W cartridge (removed from chamber of 4-1)
- 4-3 Magazine and eight loose Speer .40 S & W cartridges
- 4-4 Officer Goodwin's handcuffs with suspected bloodstains.
- 4-5 Swab of suspected blood on an expandable baton
- 4-6 Officer Goodwin's uniform pants with suspected bloodstains
- 4-7 Officer Goodwin's uniform shirt with suspected bloodstains

The following evidence was received at the laboratory from [REDACTED] of the Humboldt Co. Sheriff's Office on October 11, 2007:

EXAMINATION:

Officer Goodwin's pistol (4-1) is a Smith and Wesson Model 4006TSW pistol chambered for the .40 S & W cartridge. The pistol is double action only, semi automatic with the capacity to contain a maximum of eleven cartridges in its magazine with one cartridge in the chamber for a total of twelve cartridges. The weapon was determined to be in good condition and functioned properly during test firing. The trigger pull was measured to be 7 pounds. The magazine safety and hammer de-cocking lever activated safety mechanisms both functioned properly.

Four cartridges selected from the ammunition submitted (4-3) were test fired in the pistol (4-1). Toolmarks on the bullets and cartridge cases recovered from the test firings were microscopically compared to toolmarks on the evidence bullets and cartridge cases.

The test fired cartridge components had similar class characteristics as those present on the evidence bullet (2-16 and the evidence cartridge cases (1-1, 1-2, and 1-3). Sufficient corresponding, unique consecutively matching striated toolmarks were present on the test fired cartridge cases and the evidence cartridge cases and the test fired bullets and the evidence bullet to conclude that they were all fired in the same weapon, Officer Goodwin's pistol (4-1).

Item 2-15a consisted of a single fragment of apparent copper and several particles of a rubber-like material. The fragments appearance was consistent with bullet jacketing. The fragment had no potential for comparison.

The findings of the examination of Officer Goodwin's uniform, handcuffs, and the baton will be issued in a separate report.

DISPOSITION:

All submitted evidence and laboratory generated evidence will be held at the laboratory pending return by normal business practice.

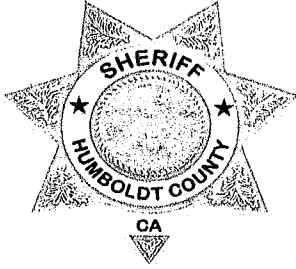

On 09/21/07 at approx. 1830 hrs. Lt. Cavinta contacted me at my residence via phone regarding a C.I.R.T. call-out. He said that a Calif. Highway Patrol Officer had been involved in a shooting and a [REDACTED] had been shot. He requested that I respond to the Blue Lake Police Dept. and meet with other C.I.R.T. team members at that location. Lt. Cavinta said that Det. Ben Nord was also enroute to assist me. Lt. Cavinta said that he wanted me to be the Lead Investigator from our department. He said that Humboldt County District Attorney Chief Investigator Mike Hislop and D.A. Investigator Mike Stone were also enroute. Lt. Cavinta said that a Blue Lake Police Officer would meet us at their Police Dept. and lead us to the incident location. After a brief stop at Blue Lake Police Dept., approx. 2025 hrs. the assigned C.I.R.T. team members proceeded to Snow Camp Road.

At approx. 2100 hrs. we arrived at a location on Snow Camp Road just west of the incident location. We met with C.H.P. Sgt. Matt Larsen, C.H.P. Sgt Hal Rosendahl. They were in the process of briefing us about the shooting incident, when C.H.P. Lt. Adam Jaeger arrived. Sgt. Rosendahl was on his cell phone and told Chief Hislop and I that C.H.P. Division requested that the Humboldt County District Attorney's Office take the lead on this investigation. We were told that C.H.P. Officer Jeff Goodwin was the Officer

that was involved in the shooting and the [REDACTED] was [REDACTED]. We were told that the [REDACTED] had been transported by helicopter to Mercy Medical Center in Redding for treatment. I contacted Lt. Cavinta via cell-phone to advise him about C.H.P.'s decision to have the D.A.'s Office lead this investigation. Lt. Cavinta told me to assist in the investigation and to keep him informed.

Chief Hislop and I were told by the C.H.P. personnel that were present that they did not want to get the Dept. of Justice Crime Lab to get involved due to them being a State agency. They requested that I make arrangements to have the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office Evidence Tech. process the crime scene. I phoned Humboldt County Sheriff's Evidence Tech. [REDACTED] and requested that she respond to our location.

At approx. 2105 hrs. the Highway Patrol units directed us to the incident scene. We arrived at 2115 hrs. The distance from Blue Lake police dept. to the scene was approx. 16.9 miles. At the scene I contacted Humboldt County Sheriff's Sgt. Sylvia and C.H.P. Officer Cornwell. Sgt. Sylvia was standing by assisting with scene security. D.A. Investigator Mike Stone later interviewed him; refer to his report for details of Sgt. Sylvia's involvement. C.H.P. Officer Cornwell was scribing, keeping track of anyone coming or going from the crime scene. C.H.P. Sgt. Greg Ziegler arrived and he is the Supervisor for the C.H.P.'s Northern Division Officer Involved Shooting Team.

Det. Ben Nord and D.A. Investigator Mike Stone interviewed C.H.P. Sgt. Matt Larsen; refer to their report for details regarding his statement. Chief Investigator Hislop and I looked at the scene from outside of a taped off barrier as to not disturb the crime scene. We could see that a C.H.P. unit was within the taped off barrier. We were told that the unit was the one that C.H.P. Officer Goodwin had been driving when the incident occurred. We also noticed an older model Cadillac within the barrier tape that the [REDACTED] had been driving when the incident occurred. Refer to Chief Investigator Hislop's report for complete details of crime scene.

Humboldt County Sheriff's Sgt Phil Buihner arrived at hrs. with a generator and floodlights to assist in processing the crime scene. Chief Hislop and I were directed to a C.H.P. unit that was parked outside of the crime scene barrier tape. We were told that the passenger of the [REDACTED] vehicle was inside of the C.H.P. unit. The passenger had been identified as [REDACTED]. Chief Hislop asked [REDACTED] if she would sit inside of his car for a taped interview regarding this incident. She told him that would be alright.

Chief Investigator Hislop and I interviewed [REDACTED] inside of Chief Hislop's car. C.H.P. Sgt. Greg Ziegler sat in on the interview, but didn't ask any questions. Chief Hislop recorded the interview on his digital recorder; refer to his report for details of the interview. At the end of the interview, at approx. 2257 hrs. Sgt. Sylvia transported [REDACTED] home.

Chief Hislop and I left the scene and drove to the C.H.P. Office in Arcata to interview C.H.P. Officer Goodwin. We arrived and started our interview at 0335 hrs. Chief Hislop

recorded the interview on his digital recorder; refer to his report for details regarding the interview. Also present during the interview were C.H.P. Sgt. Ziegler and Officer Goodwin's Union Representative, Officer Jim Claus.

On 09/24/07 at approx. 0930 hrs. Arcata Police Sgt. Dave Brown, Arcata Police Capt. Chapman, C.H.P. Officer Nietzke, Chief Hislop, Det. Ben Nord and I met at the Arcata C.H.P. Office to discuss this case and assignments.

Chief Hislop and I drove back to the scene and received updated information regarding crime scene processing. Refer to Chief Hislop's report for the updated information. Once the scene processing was complete I drove Officer Goodwin's patrol unit back to the C.H.P. office in Arcata. Chief Hislop followed me to the C.H.P. office. After we arrived at their office we checked to see if the units emergency lights and siren were in working order. The C.H.P. vehicle maintenance personnel checked the unit's emergency equipment in our presence and it was in working order.

On 09/25/07 at 1350 hrs. Chief Hislop and I responded to the Humboldt County Correctional Facility to interview [REDACTED] regarding this case. Prior to the interview we talked to the Correctional Facility Charge Nurse, [REDACTED]. We asked him if he thought that [REDACTED] was well enough to talk with. [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] was not on any pain medication and appeared to medically alright to talk to. It should be noted that a card was located inside of [REDACTED] wallet from booking that indicated [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was booked into the Humboldt County Correctional Facility on 09/24/07 at approx. 0312 hrs. He was lodged into the medical secure area of the facility due to his gunshot wound.

We contacted [REDACTED] inside of his cell. I told him that we wanted to talk with him about why he was in jail. I read him his Miranda rights from a card I carry with me. [REDACTED] said that he understood his rights and would talk to us. I recorded our conversation with [REDACTED] on my digital recorder that I later transferred to a CD-rom. The CD was turned over to Chief Hislop after it was summarized. Refer to transcribed tape for complete details of the interview.

It should be noted that we had a difficult time understanding [REDACTED] at times we had to ask him to repeat himself throughout our interview with him. [REDACTED] said that he had a [REDACTED] [REDACTED] wanted to know what his charges were, so Chief Hislop told him what the charges were. I asked [REDACTED] why he ran from the Cops and he said because he knew that he didn't have a valid driver's license.

I asked [REDACTED] if he could tell me what the Cop car looked like that he was running from and he said green and white. I asked him if he remembered being in Blue Lake and he said not really. I asked him what car was he driving when the Cops were chasing him and he said that it was the car that he had bought for [REDACTED]. I asked him to describe the car for me. He said that it was a 1968 Cadillac, light blue in color. He said

that he had originally bought the car from some girl. I asked him who was in the car when the Cop was chasing him and he said just [REDACTED] and himself.

I asked [REDACTED] who was driving the car when the Cops pulled it over. He said that he was and then he said that he didn't know. I asked [REDACTED] how he knew the Cops wanted him to pull over. He said, because he turned on his red lights. I asked him if he heard a siren and he said, "no". [REDACTED] said that he didn't hear a PA system either. I asked [REDACTED] how far was he followed before he pulled over, he said just a few miles.

I asked [REDACTED] if he was familiar with the area that he was being chased through. He said that he was not familiar with the area. I asked [REDACTED] how fast he was driving when the Cops were chasing him. He said that he was not going very fast. I asked him how fast, he said between 20-40 mph. I asked [REDACTED] how long was the pursuit, he said that he didn't know. I asked him if he was under the influence of anything during the pursuit, he said, "beer". [REDACTED] said that he drank a six-pack of beer. He said that he bought it somewhere in Blue Lake. I asked him if he would consider himself drunk when he was driving the car, his reply was unintelligible.

I asked [REDACTED] if he remembered coming to a gate while the Highway Patrol was following him. He said, "Yeah, then I backed up and down". He said that there was a car parked there. [REDACTED] said he was sitting over there, and shot three times. [REDACTED] said that he was shot in the back and then there was a lot of Cops there.

I asked [REDACTED] why he was backing up from the gate. He said so he could get around the Cop and get out of there. [REDACTED] said that he had stopped his car and put it into park, and then he was shot. I asked him how many shots he heard and he said that he heard three. I asked him if he remembered what shot hit him and he said that he didn't remember. I asked him if the C.H.P. Officer gave him any orders. [REDACTED] said that he told him to get out of the car and get down on the ground. I asked him if he got down on the ground, he said sort of on the ground. [REDACTED] said that then the Cop started putting the handcuffs on him. I asked [REDACTED] if any words were exchanged between him and the Cop that was handcuffing him, he said "no". [REDACTED] said that he really wasn't sure about what was going on. I asked [REDACTED] what happened next and he said that he started beating the shit out of me; he put my arm around my back.

I asked [REDACTED] about the Highway Patrolman putting handcuffs on him. I asked him if there was any type of struggle, he said that there were three of them. Maybe four or five, he said that he didn't know. [REDACTED] said that there were three Cop cars. I asked him what color were the Cop cars and he said there were three to five Cops. I asked [REDACTED] what were the Cops doing to him, he said shooting him in the back. I asked him if anyone had administered first aid to him. [REDACTED] said that they just put me in a car and brought me here.

I asked [REDACTED] if he remembered riding in a helicopter, he said "not really". I asked him again if he remembered riding in a Cop car and coming to the jail, he said "yeah". I

asked [REDACTED] about his black eye and bruised cheek and how it happened. He said he got kicked in the face. I asked [REDACTED] if he got kicked in the face when they were trying to put the handcuffs on him. He said that it was after he was handcuffed. I asked [REDACTED] if he knew that for a fact and he said that it was all a little foggy.

I asked [REDACTED] what about the pistol that was found on him during the struggle. He said that he didn't know what I was talking about. I asked him how he felt right now; he said that he was sore. I asked him if he was given any pain pills, he said that he had been given some white and green pills. I asked [REDACTED] if he knew where he was right now, he said [REDACTED] or jail. I told him that he was at the Humboldt County Correctional Facility. I asked him what month it was and he said August or September. I asked [REDACTED] what year it was and he said "2007".

I told [REDACTED] that for clarification purposes, when did he first see the Cop car, he said that he didn't know. I asked him if he remembered being in Blue Lake and he said that he didn't recall Blue Lake. I asked him if he remembered driving on the mountain road, he said that he did remember that. I asked him if the Police have their red light on when they were following him, he said "yeah". He said that [REDACTED] was telling him to be careful. I asked [REDACTED] why he didn't pull over and he said that he had a suspended license and no registration. I asked him if he had any meth or speed prior to driving the car. [REDACTED] didn't answer. I asked him that if he blood was tested, if it would show a positive trace for meth, he said that he didn't think so.

I asked [REDACTED] if he recalled a gun, he said that he didn't recall any gun. I asked [REDACTED] if a Cop was following him while he was driving and they turned on their red light, what was he suppose to do, he said that you are suppose to stop. I asked him if he did that and he said that he couldn't understand.

Chief Hislop asked [REDACTED] if he had been coming from McKinleyville, a back way to Blue Lake. He said that he didn't remember doing that. Chief Hislop asked [REDACTED] if he remembered doing speed with [REDACTED] he said "no". He asked [REDACTED] if he remembered going to the Blue Lake Mini Mart 76 Station. [REDACTED] said for a six-pack, two Pepsi and lottery tickets, he thought it was the 76 Station. Chief Hislop asked him if he won anything, I couldn't understand his reply.

Chief Hislop asked him that when he pulled out of the 76 Station, if that was when he saw the red light. [REDACTED] said that he didn't think so; he thought that it was 3 miles away when he saw the red light. He said that he didn't hear a siren. I asked [REDACTED] if the Cadillac that he was driving had a stereo and it was up too loud to hear a siren. He said that it wasn't playing loud. [REDACTED] was asked if he always wore his seatbelt, he said yeah. He thought that [REDACTED] had hers on. He then said that he couldn't remember whether he had his seatbelt on or off. [REDACTED] said that he didn't remember seeing anyone else on the road. He said that the sun was out and it wasn't cloudy. I asked him if the air conditioning was on inside of the car, he said that it wasn't charged. I asked him if the windows were down, he said no, "this is Humboldt County". I asked him if he had anything else to add to what we had been talking about.

I asked him if he had ever been to [REDACTED] and he said along time ago. I asked him if he recalled why and if it was for [REDACTED]. He wanted to know why I was asking. I told him that I was just trying to understand. I asked him if he was supposed to be taking any medication. He said that he was supposed to be taking two pills for [REDACTED]. I asked him what type of [REDACTED] he had. He said [REDACTED]. He said that he hadn't been taking his medicine. I asked [REDACTED] what happens if he doesn't take his medication, he said nothing. I asked [REDACTED] if he had any prior run-ins with Cops, he said local Cops. I asked him if he had ever been to prison, he said three years ago.

Chief Hislop asked [REDACTED] if he remembered driving up a dirt road with the Police Officer behind him with his red light on and seeing anyone else on the road, he said "no". Chief Hislop asked him that after he came to the gate, was he asked to get down on the ground. He asked him if there was a struggle during the time that they were putting the handcuffs on him. He asked [REDACTED] if the Officer was asking him to do certain things and he was resisting. [REDACTED] said that he didn't know what was going on. Chief Hislop asked him if he was pulling away from them a little bit. He asked him if [REDACTED] was telling him to pull over. He said that it was a possibility. I asked [REDACTED] if he remembered asking [REDACTED] if she was still going to marry him, he said yeah, when the Cops were behind us.

Chief Hislop asked [REDACTED] if he was resisting during the time that the Officers found the handgun. He said no way; they did not find a handgun in my waistband. Chief Hislop asked him if it was in his pocket and he said, there was not a gun. He then asked [REDACTED] if the gun was loaded and he said "no", it never was loaded.

[REDACTED] said that he was backing up, there was a Cop car there, and so he backed up and stopped, put it into park. [REDACTED] said that the only one that got hurt was me. Chief Hislop told [REDACTED] that he just wanted to confirm that the gun wasn't loaded. [REDACTED] said, right it wasn't loaded. Chief Hislop asked him why would he be carrying an unloaded gun. [REDACTED] said, I don't know what you're talking about. [REDACTED] denied having the gun. [REDACTED] told Chief Hislop that he was just saying that, so someone else would have to put the gun in his waistband.

Chief Hislop asked [REDACTED] about the gate that he drove up to and when he put it into reverse, if he hear a Cop tell him to pull over and stop. [REDACTED] said "yeah". He then asked [REDACTED] why he put it into reverse and back up. [REDACTED] said that he didn't see the Cop for a moment while he first started backing up. Chief Hislop asked him if he was backing toward the Officer's car, he said "no". [REDACTED] said that he was going to back up and go around his car. [REDACTED] said that he had stopped before the shots were fired. I asked [REDACTED] if he had ever resisted any Cops in the past, he said that he may have got a little belligerent in the past somewhere. I asked him if he was under the influence of anything right now. He said green and white pills. Chief Hislop told him that the Jail nurse had told us that the pills that he was taking were anti-bacterial pills. [REDACTED] said that the last time he was in [REDACTED] was over a year ago.

Chief Hislop asked [REDACTED] what he was going to do the next time a Cop turned his red light on him, he said that he was going to stop. I asked [REDACTED] what would have prevented this entire incident, he said " If I would have just pulled over and stopped". I made a copy of the CD rom for Chief Hislop for transcribing purposes and booked the original into evidence.

On September 23, 2007 at about 1830 hours, I received a telephone call from the Humboldt County Communication Center. They told me that a California Highway Patrol (C.H.P.) officer was involved in an officer involved shooting. The Critical Incident Response Team (C.I.R.T.) was requested to respond and assist in the investigation regarding the circumstances surrounding the shooting.

I cleared my residence about twenty minutes later and responded to the Blue Lake Police Department where I met with Det. Steve Quenell, D.A. Chief Investigator M. Hislop and D.A. Investigator M. Stone. We discussed the case briefly and responded approximately 17 miles from the Union Gas Station to Snow Camp Rd. When we arrived on scene, C.H.P. Officer Cornwell had secured the scene with crime tape.

I walked up to the scene and saw two vehicles within the tape. The first vehicle was a marked "flattop" C.H.P. patrol vehicle. The vehicle was facing S/W along the same path of the road. Approximately thirty feet in front of the vehicle was a large steel gate. The second vehicle was parked facing west. It appeared that the right rear tire was flat and that the rear drivers' side window was shattered. I saw five cones to the right of the patrol car in the middle of the road. Upon closer inspection, I saw that three areas where it was spray-painted. Within the spray painted circles were three spent shell casings.

C.H.P. Sgt. Matt Larson was present on scene and he relayed the following information to me:

He was in the C.H.P. Arcata office when he heard that C.H.P. Officer J. Goodwin was a pursuit in the Blue Lake area. Sgt. Larson left his office and responded "Code 3" to his location. Based on Officer Goodwin telling C.H.P. dispatch the location of the pursuit, Sgt. Larson maintained about a two-mile difference between him and the pursuit while they were on Snow Camp Rd. Over the radio, he heard Officer Goodwin say that shots had been fired. Sgt. Larson estimated that he arrived on scene about one to two minutes later.

Sgt. Larson observed that Officer Goodwin was out of his patrol car and was struggling with the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] near the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] side door. The vehicle was a black older model Cadillac. Officer Goodwin was striking [REDACTED] in the leg area with his ASP and telling [REDACTED] to stop resisting arrest. Sgt. Larson went to Officer Goodwin's location to give aid. Sgt. Larson took out his ASP and used it as wedge so that they could get [REDACTED] into handcuffs. While they were attempting to place him into handcuffs, the passenger of the vehicle, [REDACTED] was telling [REDACTED] to stop resisting.

After [REDACTED] was in handcuffs, he stopped being combative. Sgt. Larson then conducted a felony extrication of [REDACTED] from the Cadillac. [REDACTED] complied and she was detained without incident. She was sat up, patted down for weapons and was placed in the right rear of Officer Goodwin's vehicle.

[REDACTED] was patted down for weapons. Officer Goodwin located a Simi-auto .380 pistol with the serial numbers

ground away in his right front jacket pocket. Officer Goodwin and Sgt. Larson cleared the weapon and discover that there was no ammunition in the magazine. Furthermore, when Sgt. Larson moved the slide backwards dust came out from inside the chamber. There was not a round in the chamber. They checked [REDACTED] for injuries and discovered that he had a gun shot entry wound into his right rear shoulder under approximately three layers of clothing. There was not an exit wound.

C.H.P. Officer Cronwell and Sgt. [REDACTED] rendered first aid. They cut his shirt and placed 4X4 pads on the wound and gave him oxygen. Additional aid, California Department of Forestry and Blue Like Fire volunteers, arrived on scene to assist. A helicopter arrived and flew [REDACTED] to Willow Creek. A second helicopter flew [REDACTED] Mercy Medical Airport, Redding.

Officer Goodwin told Sgt. Larson the following information after the scene was secured. While Officer Goodwin was writing a traffic citation, an unknown citizen approached him and told him that the driver of a Black Cadillac was driving under the influence. Officer Goodwin finished the citation and observed the vehicle leaving the gas station. He attempted to make a traffic enforcement stop on the vehicle for possible driving under the influence and multiple equipment violations. The vehicle failed to yield to his emergency lights and sirens. A pursuit was initiated. It lasted 17 miles and reached speeds up to fifty miles an hour. The pursuit took about a half an hour due the length and condition of the road.

When the road came to locked gate, the Cadillac stopped. Officer Goodwin stopped, got out his patrol car and began to make a felony traffic enforcement stop. However, [REDACTED] continued to look over his shoulder in an attempt to locate Officer Goodwin. Officer Goodwin went behind his car for greater cover and concealment. [REDACTED] put the car in reverse and began to back up at a high rate of speed in the direction of Officer Goodwin. Officer Goodwin was in fear for his safety and fired three shots into the driver's side area of the vehicle.

After hearing this, Sgt. Larson realized that his patrol car might be on the spent shell casings. He moved his patrol car, and located three spent casings. He then secured the scene with crime tape. Officer Cornwell kept a

log of all the personnel that entered and left the scene. Sgt. Larson did not hear any spontaneous statements from [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]

The interview lasted approximately 30 minutes. It was digitally recorded and was later electronically transferred to CD-R. The CD-R is attached to this report.

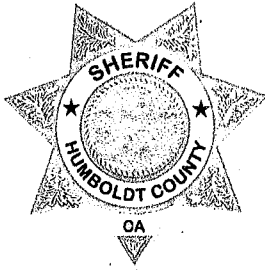

Furthermore, he did not assist other than standing by at the location.

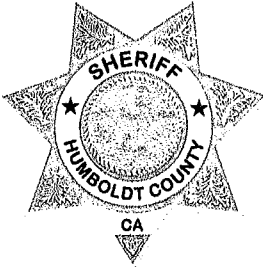

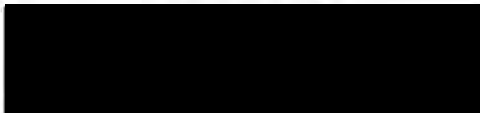

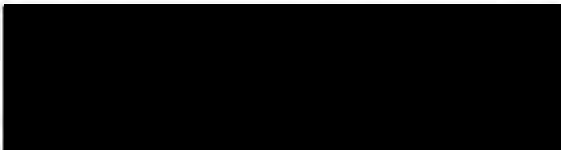

Officer Goodwin's pistol (4-1) fired the bullet (2-16) and three cartridge cases (1-1 through 1-3).

EVIDENCE:

The following evidence was received at the laboratory from [REDACTED] of the Humboldt Co. Sheriff's Office on October 11, 2007:

- 1-1 One Speer .40 S & W fired cartridge case
- 1-2 One Speer .40 S & W fired cartridge case
- 1-3 One Speer .40 S & W fired cartridge case
- 2-15a Fragment of apparent copper and particles of rubber from tire
- 2-16 One fired copper jacketed lead hollow point bullet
- 4-1 Smith & Wesson Model 4006TSW pistol [REDACTED] chambered for .40 S & W cartridges issued to Officer Goodwin
- 4-2 One Speer .40 S & W cartridge (removed from chamber of 4-1)
- 4-3 Magazine and eight loose Speer .40 S & W cartridges
- 4-4 Officer Goodwin's handcuffs with suspected bloodstains.
- 4-5 Swab of suspected blood on an expandable baton
- 4-6 Officer Goodwin's uniform pants with suspected bloodstains
- 4-7 Officer Goodwin's uniform shirt with suspected bloodstains

The following evidence was received at the laboratory from [REDACTED] of the Humboldt Co. Sheriff's Office on October 11, 2007:

EXAMINATION:

Officer Goodwin's pistol (4-1) is a Smith and Wesson Model 4006TSW pistol chambered for the .40 S & W cartridge. The pistol is double action only, semi automatic with the capacity to contain a maximum of eleven cartridges in its magazine with one cartridge in the chamber for a total of twelve cartridges. The weapon was determined to be in good condition and functioned properly during test firing. The trigger pull was measured to be 7 pounds. The magazine safety and hammer de-cocking lever activated safety mechanisms both functioned properly.

Four cartridges selected from the ammunition submitted (4-3) were test fired in the pistol (4-1). Toolmarks on the bullets and cartridge cases recovered from the test firings were microscopically compared to toolmarks on the evidence bullets and cartridge cases.

The test fired cartridge components had similar class characteristics as those present on the evidence bullet (2-16 and the evidence cartridge cases (1-1, 1-2, and 1-3). Sufficient corresponding, unique consecutively matching striated toolmarks were present on the test fired cartridge cases and the evidence cartridge cases and the test fired bullets and the evidence bullet to conclude that they were all fired in the same weapon, Officer Goodwin's pistol (4-1).

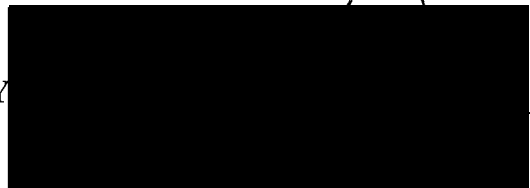
Item 2-15a consisted of a single fragment of apparent copper and several particles of a rubber-like material. The fragments appearance was consistent with bullet jacketing. The fragment had no potential for comparison.

The findings of the examination of Officer Goodwin's uniform, handcuffs, and the baton will be issued in a separate report.

All submitted evidence and laboratory generated evidence will be held at the laboratory pending return by normal business practice.
