The following is a summary of the events surrounding the July 1, 1998 incident at Pierson Building Center.

On July 1, 1998, at 0630 hours, I was contacted at my residence by the Humboldt County Sheriff's Department and was requested to contact the Eureka Police Department. I telephoned the Eureka Police Department and was informed by dispatch that they had an officer-involved shooting at Pierson Building Center and were requesting the activation of the Humboldt County Critical Incident Response Team.

I subsequently talked to Detective Pat Freese of the Eureka Police Department who told me that Detectives Dave Parris, Kevin Lawson, and Lynne Soderberg had been on a stakeout at Pierson Building Center, along with [REDACTED] and Lyle Russell. Detective Freese told me that as Detectives Parris, Soderberg, and Lawson were attempting to take the [REDACTED] into custody, the [REDACTED] ran over Parris and attempted to run over Soderberg and Lawson. The police officers shot at the [REDACTED] and wounded him. The [REDACTED] was taken to the hospital.

I requested Eureka Police dispatch to contact Arcata Police, Humboldt State University Police, Humboldt County Sheriff's Department, and Fortuna Police for each of their representatives of the Critical Incident Response Team to respond to Pierson's. I requested the Department of Justice criminalist to respond to handle evidence processing and collection. Additionally, I contacted Investigator Eric Olson of the District Attorney's Office, and notified Deputy District Attorneys Rob Wade and Worth

Dikeman of the information I had received.

At 0800 hours I responded to Pierson Building Center. I met with Detective Pat Freese who walked me through the crime scene. Sergeant Kitna of the Fortuna Police Department was on the scene. I requested that he respond to the hospital and stand by with the [REDACTED] to collect any evidence. The [REDACTED] address was determined. I requested Officer Cleveland of Humboldt State University Police to respond and stand by. Detective Walker of the Humboldt County Sheriff's Department was requested to write a search warrant for the [REDACTED] residence and his vehicle.

I learned from Detective Freese that Detective Dave Parris was feeling all right and was staying at the Thunderbird Lodge -- along with Soderberg, Russell, Lawson, and [REDACTED] in separate rooms.

I assigned Investigator Olson to interview Detective Kevin Lawson, Lyle Russell, and [REDACTED]. Detective Pat Freese accompanied me to the Thunderbird Lodge where I conducted a tape-recorded interview with Detective Parris, and later Detective Soderberg.

I collected Soderberg's pistol, a Glock 9mm (Serial Number [REDACTED]). Soderberg told me that the gun was still loaded and had not been touched by anyone else. I went to the room where Detective Lawson was staying and collected his pistol, a Glock .40-caliber (Serial Number [REDACTED]). Lawson stated that the gun was

still loaded and had not been touched by anyone else.

After completing the interviews with the above involved parties, Investigator Eric Olson and I returned to Pierson's. A walk-through of the incident was done with Parris, Soderberg, and Lawson. The walk-through was consistent with the separate statements given by each participant.

I returned to Eureka Police Department and located Captain Harpham. I asked Harpham for Parris' gun. Harpham handed me a Glock 9mm pistol (Serial Number [REDACTED]). The pistol was loaded, and Harpham stated that to his knowledge it had not been touched by anyone else, as he had received it from Parris.

I returned to Pierson's and went over the crime scene with [REDACTED], criminalist. [REDACTED] stated that he had collected five .40-caliber fired casings and three 9mm casings. At that time all the evidence had been collected. However, the car was still at the scene. A request had been made for a Eureka Police officer to go aboard a Coast Guard helicopter to take aerial photographs of the scene. As soon as that was completed, the vehicle was loaded on a flatbed truck by Humboldt Towing and towed to an inside storage/processing facility at the Department of Justice.

I returned to the Eureka Police Department and picked up some evidence forms, and transported the three handguns to the

Department of Justice criminalist laboratory. I turned all three firearms over to [REDACTED]. I did not unload or check the weapons in any way, only noting that the weapons had magazines in them and that the slides were closed. [REDACTED] received the pistols.

Based on the statements of Detectives Parris, Soderberg, Lawson, Russell and [REDACTED] and the physical evidence collected, the following is a chronological depiction of the events surrounding [REDACTED] arrest.

Since June 26, 1998, Detective Dave Parris had been working with Lyle Russell on a case of theft from Pierson Building Center. The [REDACTED] was the janitor, who worked for Fortuna Janitorial Service. The [REDACTED] came in after the business closed and left before morning. The [REDACTED] was identified as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] hours were sporadic; he could come and go at any time after closing and before opening. Detective Parris and Lyle Russell had information that the [REDACTED] had a storage locker and was storing therein possible stolen property.

On June 29, 1998, there was insufficient manpower for surveillance. A video surveillance was set up but proved ineffective.

On June 30, 1998, a surveillance team was set up at Pierson's to attempt to observe the [REDACTED] stealing merchandise from the store and, if so, to effect an arrest. Detectives Parris, Soderberg, and

Lawson were assigned as well as Lyle Russell and [REDACTED] Due to the size of the building and its many entrances to be observed, this was required minimum number of personnel.

The surveillance team arrived at Pierson's after 6:00 p.m. on June 30, 1998. Detective Parris positioned himself in the second-floor main office adjacent to the front gate, overlooking the main entrance and parking lot. Detective Soderberg was placed in the loft area of the hardware section. Lyle Russell was in an office area above the paint department. Detective Lawson was in the office adjacent to the garden shop. [REDACTED] was in an office area adjacent to the doors to the carpet section.

At approximately 0400 hours, Detective Lawson observed a vehicle driving up to the main gate, opening it, driving in, and parking adjacent to the front main entrance. The vehicle was facing toward the west. Lawson reported this observation to the other team members. Lawson later reported observing the [REDACTED] exit the main doors with a shopping cart containing a large grocery bag and several small items. The [REDACTED] opened the trunk of his vehicle and threw in the grocery bag; he put the other items in the front of the vehicle. The [REDACTED] returned to the inside of the store. Other officers reported that the [REDACTED] was collecting merchandise from inside the business.

At approximately 0455 hours, the [REDACTED] came out of the building

with more grocery bags and boxes, placing them in the trunk. A short time later it appeared that the [REDACTED] was completing his activity and was getting ready to leave. Detective Parris notified the other team members to get ready. Parris went out and opened the pull-down stairwell for Soderberg so that she could be in position.

Parris and Soderberg went to the downstairs office area and stood by the office door. They signaled to Lawson, who was immediately across the lot entrance from them.

The [REDACTED] exited the main entrance, got into his vehicle, turned around, and drove within approximately ten feet of the gate, to allow the thirteen foot gate to pivot back. The [REDACTED] got out of his vehicle and opened the gate.

After [REDACTED] opened the gate and started back to his vehicle, three Eureka Police Department detectives, Detective Parris, Detective Soderberg, and Detective Lawson, started to move in on [REDACTED] to apprehend him. Parris and Soderberg came out of the door at the south end of the office area on to the driveway area, and Lawson came across the driveway from the south as he had been in an office at the end of the garden shop building.

The officers ran to a point just outside the open gate where they could block the path of the vehicle exiting and apprehend [REDACTED]

The officers yelled at [REDACTED] to freeze and although the officers were wearing plain clothes, they did have on distinctive raid jackets with badges and shoulder patches. As they approached the open gate, Detective Lawson was closer to the center of the driveway, or a little more to the south. Detective Soderberg was to his right and Detective Parris was slightly to the rear. The officers had their weapons drawn. At the time the officers approached, [REDACTED] was just in the process of returning to his vehicle and was standing by the open door. When the officers shouted "Police officers", [REDACTED] jumped in the vehicle and accelerated quickly toward them. When [REDACTED] accelerated toward the officers, Lawson felt that they were in danger and fired one round, striking the right front hood slightly from the outside in. Lawson then started moving to his right to get out of the way of the vehicle, and during or about the same time, Detective Soderberg fired one round striking the left front portion of the hood of the vehicle, also at a relatively flat angle and from the outside inward. Soderberg also started moving to the right. Paint chips from the hood of the vehicle found on the ground were approximately six feet in a group inside the gate, indicating an approximate location of this occurrence.

As Lawson moved to his right, he fired a second round striking the hood of the vehicle, this one more near the back of the hood and slightly to the left of center.

At this point both Soderberg and Lawson had moved far enough to their right to clear the front of the vehicle as it sped by. Lawson fired a third round which entered the left portion of the hood from the side of the vehicle.

At this point the vehicle was still quickly accelerating and Detective Parris, who was slightly behind Soderberg, could not see the vehicle as his vision was blocked by Detective Soderberg. Detective Parris was then struck by the left front bumper of the vehicle and rode up onto the hood. Detective Parris fired one round down through the windshield of the vehicle which struck the steering column at the ignition switch, splintering in the vehicle. A fragment from this bullet strike on the steering column ricocheted inward and upward causing the wound to [REDACTED] right arm. Bullet fragments lodged in the headrest of the passenger side front seat.

As Detective Parris rolled off the left side of the hood, he contacted Detective Lawson, knocking Lawson to the ground.

As the vehicle goes past Detective Soderberg, Detective Soderberg turns and fires one round which goes through the open window in the driver's door at a downward angle. This bullet strikes [REDACTED] in the right upper leg, just above the knee. The bullet continues on and is lodged in the foot well on the right side of the vehicle.

Detective Lawson rolls to a sitting position as the vehicle is now passing him. He does not see Detective Parris and believes that Detective Parris has been hit and is underneath the vehicle. Detective Lawson fires an additional round which strikes the left front door, relatively low on the door, and near the front. The bullet comes from a relatively flat angle from the rear and is deflected out the front door seam at the front edge of the door. Detective Lawson then stands up, fires one additional round from the rear corner of the vehicle through the open window in the driver's door, from the rear, which goes through [REDACTED] left arm, striking the dash board and lodging in the instrument panel.

At this point, the vehicle rolls to a stop as during the course of being injured, [REDACTED] has taken his foot off the gas.

The officers were then able to approach the vehicle and stop it. The officers opened the door and the [REDACTED] was fighting them, attempting to keep the door closed. Detective Parris felt he was trying to escape. The officers pulled the [REDACTED] out of the car. The [REDACTED] was struggling and went to the ground, lying on his arms. The officers attempted to pull the [REDACTED] arms clear, being unaware of what he may have in his hands. The [REDACTED] was subsequently handcuffed and emergency first aid provided. The [REDACTED] was transported to St. Joseph Hospital via ambulance for medical treatment.

SERVICE OF SEARCH WARRANT

I learned that Detective Walker had obtained the search warrants both for the [REDACTED]'s vehicle and for his residence. I drove to [REDACTED] California Street, Apartment [REDACTED], in Eureka, and met with Detective Walker, Detective Freese, Officer Cleveland, and Sergeant Kitna. Detective Freese knocked and noticed. There was no answer. Detective Freese then made entry. A search of the inside revealed that no one was at home. While at the rear of the building, Detective Walker smelled fresh marijuana. He looked over the fence and saw a small greenhouse and perceived that the odor was emanating from there.

I assisted with the search of the front room, along with Officer Cleveland. Two representatives from Pierson's came to the scene and identified numerous items of property belonging to Pierson Building Center.

Detective Walker informed me that he located a rental contract for a storage facility in a bedroom drawer. The rental agreement was in the name of [REDACTED], [REDACTED], Eureka. Below that was a listing for anybody else that would have access to the storage unit -- the name [REDACTED], with an address of [REDACTED] California Street, Apartment [REDACTED], Eureka. Since [REDACTED] was the [REDACTED] and his residence ([REDACTED] California Street, Apartment [REDACTED] was the location where the contract was found, I believed the name [REDACTED] was either a misspelling of an AKA.

The address of [REDACTED] Street was directly behind the apartment where we were, and the aforementioned greenhouse was in the rear yard. Detective Walker found a Polaroid photograph of [REDACTED] sitting in a greenhouse with marijuana plants. Detective Walker identified the greenhouse as the one he observed next door.

I went next door and knocked on the door. There was no answer. A woman came out of the rear of the structure. She was later identified as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that the people in the front house were [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] worked at a care home and had gone to work. Her husband had taken their children and left. Investigator Eric Olson was assigned to go to the storage facility at [REDACTED] Jacobs Avenue, Eureka, Unit Number [REDACTED], and to stand by while I prepared a search warrant.

I prepared a search warrant for the greenhouse and for the storage facility. While preparing the search warrants I received a telephone call from Eureka Police Officer Franco. Franco stated that a [REDACTED] had come to the police department annex with information on [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that he and his girlfriend lived behind [REDACTED] at [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] told Franco that [REDACTED] had asked [REDACTED] to rent a storage facility for him, as [REDACTED] had no identification. [REDACTED] agreed. [REDACTED] additionally stated that he had been with [REDACTED] when he was cleaning Pierson's and PG&E and had observed [REDACTED] stealing things.

█████ had helped █████ unload some stolen merchandise into the storage facility the preceding day. █████ described the storage facility as being half-full of stolen property.

The search warrant was signed by Judge Cissna at 2140 hours. Investigator Olson served the warrant on the storage facility.

Detective Freese contacted the Marijuana Eradication Team for their assistance in eradicating the greenhouse. Upon walking into the yard area where the greenhouse was located, the door to the residence was opened. █████ came out. Freese explained that we had a search warrant for the greenhouse. █████ was shaking uncontrollably. █████ whispered to Freese that █████, █████, was inside. Freese recognized that █████ -- █████ as █████ referred to her -- was the cohabitant of █████ █████. Freese asked █████ if we could come in. █████ gave her consent.

█████ was in the back bedroom, sobbing. We asked her to come into the front room. I told her that we wanted to talk to her. █████ said she wanted to call her father in Oregon. I told her we would allow her to use the phone and call her father at the Sheriff's Department if she would accompany us. █████ agreed and Detective Walker drove her to the Sheriff's Department Detective's Division.

█████ was allowed to call her father in Portland, Oregon, prior to

talking with us. Detective Walker tape-recorded the call. At the conclusion of our interview, Detective Walker returned [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] residence.

Detective Walker and I went to the storage unit on Jacobs Avenue but found that Investigator Olson had left. Walker and I drove to the Eureka Police Department where we observed a large amount of property.

On July 2, 1998, I met with Investigator Olson, and together we went to St. Joseph's Hospital where we talked to [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. I advised [REDACTED] of his rights via Miranda warning and he waived same.

[REDACTED] essentially stated that he had stolen merchandise from Pierson Building Center while he was working as a janitor. Additionally, [REDACTED] stated he had stolen merchandise from PG&E where he was also employed as a janitor. [REDACTED] stated that he had given much of the stolen merchandise away to friends and had traded merchandise, stolen from Pierson's, for methamphetamine. [REDACTED] admitted he was a "meth" user.

[REDACTED] stated that he was suspicious that police were watching him steal merchandise from Pierson's. [REDACTED] stated that this was to be his final night working at Pierson's as he was going to quit. [REDACTED] stated that he had taken more merchandise than usual because he was quitting.

█████ initially asked how the officer was doing, if he was OK. █████ later denied knowing that he had hit him. █████ initially stated he didn't know they were police officers. Later he stated that he knew they were police officers and knew why they were there.

Investigator Olson and I talked to Dr. █████ █████ who advised us of the nature of █████' injuries. Dr. █████ essentially stated that █████ had an injury to his right knee, left upper arm and right arm. None of the injuries were life threatening.

CONCLUSION

Detective Dave Parris was justified in firing his handgun at [REDACTED] as [REDACTED] attempted to evade arrest, ran his vehicle into Detective Parris, throwing Parris onto the hood of [REDACTED]' vehicle.

Detective Kevin Lawson was justified in firing his handgun at [REDACTED] as [REDACTED] attempted to escape by driving his vehicle directly at Detective Lawson and colliding with Detective Parris.

Detective Lynne Soderberg was justified in firing her handgun at [REDACTED] as [REDACTED] was attempting to evade arrest and drove his vehicle towards Detective Lawson and Detective Parris, and in so doing collided with Detective Parris.

ON 07-01-98, AT ABOUT 0650 HOURS I RECEIVED A TELEPHONE CALL AT HOME FROM DETECTIVE THIEL. DETECTIVE THIEL WAS ACTING AS THE DETECTIVE BUREAU COMMANDER AT THE TIME. HE TOLD ME THAT A SHOOTING HAD JUST OCCURRED AT PIERSON'S BUILDING CENTER AND IT WAS AN OFFICER INVOLVED SHOOTING. DETECTIVE THIEL TOLD ME THAT THE EUREKA POLICE DEPARTMENT WAS THE AGENCY INVOLVED IN THE SHOOTING AND THAT A [REDACTED] HAD BEEN WOUNDED AS A RESULT OF THE SHOOTING. DETECTIVE THIEL TOLD ME THAT THE MAJOR INCIDENT INVESTIGATION TEAM HAD BEEN ACTIVATED AND THAT I WAS THE ASSIGNED DETECTIVE FROM THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT PER SHERIFF LEWIS.

I RESPONDED TO PIERSON'S BUILDING CENTER AFTER RECEIVING NOTIFICATION AND ARRIVED ON THE SCENE AT 0727 HOURS. UPON MY ARRIVAL I SPOKE WITH DETECTIVE FREESE OF THE EUREKA POLICE DEPARTMENT AS WELL AS CAPTAIN HONSALL OF THE EUREKA POLICE DEPARTMENT. THEY SUMMARIZED FOR ME THE INCIDENT AS BEST THEY COULD AT THAT TIME. I WAS TOLD THAT DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S INVESTIGATOR JIM DAWSON WAS EN ROUTE TO THE SCENE FROM HIS HOME AND WOULD BE THE COMMANDER OF THE MAJOR INCIDENT INVESTIGATION TEAM.

WHILE AT THE SHOOTING SCENE I OBSERVED THE [REDACTED] VEHICLE PARKED IN THE DRIVEWAY AT PIERSON'S BUILDING CENTER. I COULD SEE THAT THE VEHICLE CONTAINED A NUMBER OF ITEMS IN THE PASSENGER COMPARTMENT THAT APPEARED TO HAVE BEEN REMOVED FROM PIERSON'S. DETECTIVE FREESE TOLD ME THAT THE OFFICERS INVOLVED IN THE SHOOTING HAD STATED THAT THE [REDACTED] HAD BEEN OBSERVED PLACING A LARGE NUMBER OF ITEMS IN THE TRUNK OF THE VEHICLE.

BASED ON THE CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE CASE I KNEW THAT A SEARCH WARRANT WOULD HAVE TO BE PREPARED FOR THE VEHICLE AS WELL AS THE [REDACTED] PLACE OF RESIDENCE. INVESTIGATOR DAWSON ARRIVED ON THE SCENE A SHORT TIME LATER AND ASSUMED COMMAND OF THE INVESTIGATION. DAWSON DETERMINED THAT I SHOULD PREPARE A SEARCH WARRANT FOR THE [REDACTED] VEHICLE AS WELL AS HIS PLACE OF RESIDENCE. WHILE I WAS ENGAGED IN THE SEARCH WARRANT PREPARATION THE REMAINDER OF THE CRITICAL INCIDENT INVESTIGATION TEAM REMAINED AT PIERSON'S AND BEGAN THEIR INVESTIGATION INTO THE CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING THE SHOOTING.

PRIOR TO LEAVING PIERSON'S BUILDING CENTER I OBTAINED THE NECESSARY INFORMATION TO PREPARE A SEARCH WARRANT FOR THE [REDACTED] VEHICLE. I OBSERVED THAT THE VEHICLE HAD A [REDACTED] VINYL TOP OVER [REDACTED] ON THE BODY. I OBSERVED THAT THE VEHICLE HAD OREGON LICENSE PLATES [REDACTED]. I LOOKED INTO THE CAR AND OBSERVED SEVERAL ITEMS WHICH I NOTED FOR INCLUSION INTO THE WARRANT. AFTER OBTAINING THIS INFORMATION I DEPARTED THE SCENE AND PROCEEDED TO THE EUREKA POLICE DEPARTMENT TO PICK UP A COPY OF THE INITIAL REPORT WHICH DETAILED SOME OF THE THEFT WHICH HAD BEEN OCCURRING AND WHICH IDENTIFIED THE [REDACTED] AS [REDACTED]

AFTER OBTAINING THE EUREKA POLICE REPORT, #3C98-5118 I WENT TO LOCATE EUREKA POLICE DETECTIVES PARRIS AND RUSSELL FOR SOME BACKGROUND INFORMATION. I SPOKE WITH RUSSELL AND PARRIS ABOUT THEIR INVESTIGATION INTO THE THEFTS FROM PIERSON'S AS WELL AS THEIR OBSERVATIONS DURING THE SURVEILLANCE WHICH CULMINATED IN THE OFFICER INVOLVED SHOOTING.

DETECTIVE RUSSELL TOLD ME THAT HE HAD INITIALLY RECEIVED INFORMATION VIA AN INFORMANT THAT A JANITOR AT PIERSON'S WAS STEALING A LARGE QUANTITY OF ITEMS FROM THE STORE AT NIGHT WHILE HE WORKED. THE [REDACTED] WAS IDENTIFIED AS [REDACTED] IT WAS LEARNED THAT [REDACTED] WAS AN EMPLOYEE OF THE FORTUNA JANITORIAL SERVICE. [REDACTED] WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR CLEANING THE PG&E OFFICES ON MYRTLE AVENUE AS WELL AS PIERSON'S BUILDING CENTER.

RUSSELL TOLD ME THAT ON 06-24-98, HE WAS PROVIDED WITH EUREKA POLICE REPORT #3C98-5118. THAT REPORT IDENTIFIES A NUMBER OF ITEMS WHICH WERE RETURNED TO PIERSON'S BY A THIRD PARTY. THE ITEMS HAD BEEN STOLEN FROM PIERSON'S BY [REDACTED] WHILE HE WAS WORKING INSIDE AT NIGHT. RUSSELL TOLD ME THAT THE ITEMS WHICH HAD BEEN RETURNED WERE INITIALLY GIVEN TO THE INFORMANT BY [REDACTED] THE INFORMANT THEN GAVE THE ITEMS TO HER LANDLORD WHO RETURNED THEM TO PIERSON'S. AT THAT TIME PIERSON'S EMPLOYEES SUMMONED THE EUREKA POLICE DEPARTMENT AND AN INVESTIGATION WAS INITIATED INTO THE MATTER BY DETECTIVE RUSSELL.

DETECTIVE RUSSELL TOLD ME THAT DURING THE COURSE OF THE INVESTIGATION HE HAD BEEN TOLD BY THE INFORMANT THAT [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] HAD RENTED A STORAGE UNIT AT A LOCAL FACILITY AND WAS HIDING MUCH OF THE STOLEN ITEMS FROM PIERSON'S AT THAT LOCATION. RUSSELL TOLD ME THAT DETECTIVE PARRIS AND HE HAD ATTEMPTED TO LOCATE WHERE THE STORAGE UNIT WAS BUT WERE NOT SUCCESSFUL UP TO THE PRESENT TIME.

DETECTIVES RUSSELL AND PARRIS TOLD ME THAT THEY HAD TAKEN THE INFORMANT WITH THEM IN THEIR VEHICLE TO LOOK AT THE [REDACTED] PLACE OF RESIDENCE. THE INFORMANT HAD POINTED OUT A APARTMENT LOCATED ON THE

CORNER OF 14TH AND CALIFORNIA. THE ADDRESS WAS NOTED AS [REDACTED] CALIFORNIA APARTMENT [REDACTED]. THE APARTMENTS WERE DESCRIBED AS BEING GREY WITH DARK GREY TRIM. RUSSELL AND PARRIS TOLD ME THAT APARTMENT [REDACTED] WAS ON THE SECOND FLOOR OF THE BUILDING AND THE DOORWAY FACED CALIFORNIA STREET. THE DOOR WAS ACCESSIBLE VIA AN OPEN BREEZWAY WHICH PROVIDED ACCESS TO APARTMENTS [REDACTED] AND [REDACTED]. APARTMENTS [REDACTED] AND [REDACTED] WERE DESCRIBED AS BEING ON THE SOUTH END OF THE APARTMENT BUILDING.

DETECTIVES PARRIS AND RUSSELL TOLD ME THAT BASED ON THEIR INFORMATION THEY HAD ATTEMPTED TO CAPTURE [REDACTED] [REDACTED] ON VIDEO CAMERA AS HE REMOVED ITEMS FROM PIERSON'S AS HE WORKED. I WAS TOLD THAT SEVERAL SUCH ATTEMPTS WERE MADE BUT THEY DID NOT PROVE TO BE SUCCESSFUL. DETECTIVE PARRIS TOLD ME THAT FOR THIS REASON IT WAS FINALLY DETERMINED THAT A SURVEILLANCE TEAM WOULD BE ASSEMBLED AND A FULL SURVEILLANCE WOULD BE CONDUCTED BEGINNING SHORTLY AFTER 1830 HOURS ON 6-30-98.

DETECTIVE PARRIS TOLD ME THAT A FIVE PERSON SURVEILLANCE WAS ESTABLISHED INSIDE PIERSON'S BUILDING CENTER. IT WAS OBSERVED THAT THE [REDACTED] ARRIVED AT PIERSON'S TO WORK AT ABOUT 0354 HOURS. THE [REDACTED] REMAINED AT PIERSON'S STORE UNTIL ABOUT 0543 HOURS AT WHICH TIME HE BEGAN TO LEAVE AND SUBSEQUENTLY BECAME INVOLVED IN THE SHOOTING.

DETECTIVE PARRIS TOLD ME THAT HE WAS IN A POSITION TO OPERATE THE VIDEO CAMERA WHICH WAS FOCUSED ON THE [REDACTED] VEHICLE. THIS CAMERA WAS LOCATED ON THE SECOND FLOOR OF PIERSON'S OFFICE AREA. DETECTIVE RUSSELL WAS LOCATED IN A POSITION WHERE HE COULD OBSERVE THE INTERIOR OF THE STORE AND WATCH SOME OF [REDACTED] [REDACTED] ACTIONS AS HE WORKED.

DETECTIVES PARRIS AND RUSSELL TOLD ME THAT AS THEY WATCHED, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] WAS OBSERVED PICKING UP NUMEROUS ITEMS FROM THE SHELVES OF THE STORE. AS THE [REDACTED] ASSEMBLED THE ITEMS HE WOULD THEN TAKE THE ITEMS IN MASS AND PLACE THEM IN HIS CAR. THE [REDACTED] WAS OBSERVED PLACING ITEMS IN THE TRUNK AS WELL AS THE PASSENGER COMPARTMENT. DETECTIVE PARRIS TOLD ME THAT THE [REDACTED] WAS OBSERVED PLACING SEVERAL LARGE PLASTIC BAGS WHICH OBVIOUSLY CONTAINED NUMEROUS ITEMS IN THE TRUNK OF THE VEHICLE.

DETECTIVE RUSSELL TOLD ME THAT HE PERSONALLY OBSERVED THE [REDACTED] APPROACH A DISPLAY OF ADHESIVES AND REMOVE NUMEROUS PACKAGES OF WHAT APPEARED TO BE "CRAZY GLUE". RUSSELL TOLD ME THAT HE FURTHER OBSERVED THE [REDACTED] PICK UP SOME CIRCULAR SAW BLADES AND HIDE THEM BENEATH HIS SHIRT AND THEN LEAVE THE AREA. RUSSELL TOLD ME THAT HE FURTHER SAW THE [REDACTED] PICK UP AN EXTENSION POLE FOR A PAINT ROLLER OR BRUSH AND LEAVE THE STORE WITH THIS ITEM.

AFTER TALKING WITH DETECTIVES RUSSELL AND PARRIS I DEPARTED THEIR LOCATION AND DROVE BY THE [REDACTED] RESIDENCE. AT THE CORNER OF 14TH AND CALIFORNIA STREETS I OBSERVED THE APARTMENT COMPLEX AS PREVIOUSLY DESCRIBED. I SAW THAT THE APARTMENT MATCHED THE DESCRIPTION AS PROVIDED BY RUSSELL AND PARRIS. I THEN PROCEEDED TO THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT WHERE I BEGAN THE PREPARATION OF A SEARCH WARRANT FOR THE [REDACTED] VEHICLE AND RESIDENCE.

BASED ON THE INFORMATION I WAS PROVIDED AS WELL AS MY OWN OBSERVATIONS I PREPARED SEARCH WARRANT #4075. I HAD THE SEARCH WARRANT REVIEWED BY DEPUTY DISTRICT ATTORNEY WORTH DIKEMAN. AFTER THE REVIEW OF THE SEARCH WARRANT BY DIKEMAN I WENT TO SUPERIOR COURT JUDGE TIMMOTHY CISSNA AND HAD THE SEARCH WARRANT REVIEWED AND SIGNED. AFTER I HAD THE WARRANT SIGNED I RETURNED TO THE EUREKA POLICE DEPARTMENT WHERE I AWAITED THE ARRIVAL OF THE REMAINDER OF THE MAJOR INCIDENT INVESTIGATION TEAM.

INVESTIGATOR DAWSON AND THE REMAINDER OF THE TEAM ARRIVED AT THE EUREKA POLICE DEPARTMENT AFTER THEY COMPLETED THEIR INVESTIGATION AT PIERSON'S BUILDING CENTER. AT THAT TIME A BRIEFING WAS HELD TO DISCUSS THE INVESTIGATION UP TO THAT POINT. A BRIEFING WAS ALSO HELD IN PREPARATION FOR THE EXECUTION OF THE SEARCH WARRANT WHICH I HAD PREPARED.

THE [REDACTED] VEHICLE HAD BEEN TOWED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE LABORATORY IN EUREKA. AT THAT LOCATION THE VEHICLE WAS STORED IN A INSIDE STORAGE FACILITY AWAITING THE EXECUTION OF THE SEARCH WARRANT. PLANS WERE MADE TO HAVE ONE TEAM SEARCH THE VEHICLE WHILE THE SECOND TEAM CONDUCTED THE SEARCH OF THE [REDACTED] RESIDENCE.

THE TEAM INVOLVED WITH THE SEARCH OF THE [REDACTED] RESIDENCE WAS COMPRISED OF THE FOLLOWING PERSONNEL. INVESTIGATORS DAWSON, OLSON, FREESE, AND I AS WELL AS OFFICERS CLEAVLAND AND RON HARPHAM. AT APPROXIMATELY 1815 HOURS THE WARRANT WAS EXECUTED AT [REDACTED] CALIFORNIA STREET APARTMENT [REDACTED]

A THOROUGH SEARCH OF THE APARTMENT WAS CONDUCTED WHICH LASTED SEVERAL HOURS. AS A RESULT OF THAT SEARCH A SUBSTANTIAL NUMBER OF ITEMS OF EVIDENCE WERE RECOVERED FROM WITHIN THE APARTMENT AND THE GARAGE CONNECTED TO THE APARTMENT. THESE ITEMS OF EVIDENCE CONSISTED OF NUMEROUS ITEMS OF INDICIA AS WELL AS A LARGE NUMBER OF ITEMS WHICH APPEARED TO HAVE BEEN REMOVED FROM PIERSON'S STORE.

AT THE TIME THE SEARCH WARRANT WAS EXECUTED NO ONE WAS FOUND TO BE PRESENT WITHIN THE APARTMENT. IT WAS BELIEVED THAT [REDACTED] [REDACTED]

LIVED AT THAT LOCATION WITH HIS GIRLFRIEND OR WIFE. THIS INDIVIDUAL WAS KNOWN TO HAVE A FIRST NAME OF [REDACTED]. NO OTHER INFORMATION WAS KNOWN IN REGARDS TO THIS INDIVIDUAL AT THAT TIME.

DURING THE COURSE OF THE SEARCH I HAD OCCASION TO BE SEARCHING A FILE CABINET WHICH CONTAINED THE [REDACTED] FINANCIAL RECORDS AS WELL AS A LARGE QUANTITY OF ASSORTED PERSONAL INDICIA FOR HE AND ANOTHER [REDACTED] IDENTIFIED AS [REDACTED] WHEN I PULLED THE BOTTOM DRAWER ALL THE WAY OUT I COULD SEE SOME PAPERS HIDDEN ALL THE WAY IN THE BACK BENEATH THE DRAWER ITSELF. WHEN I PULLED THESE PAPERS OUT I FOUND THAT THEY WERE A RENTAL CONTRACT. I EXAMINED THE CONTRACT AND FOUND IT WAS AN AGREEMENT WITH THE RAINBOW MINI STORAGE RENTAL COMPANY. I FOUND THE STORAGE UNIT HAD BEEN RENTED ON, 6-28-98.

IN EXAMINING THE CONTRACT I FOUND THAT THE STORAGE UNIT HAD NOT BEEN RENTED BY [REDACTED] [REDACTED] BUT RATHER BY A NEIGHBOR. I SAW THAT [REDACTED] DID NOT HAVE HIS NAME ON THE CONTRACT BUT RATHER A NAME OF [REDACTED] [REDACTED] WAS LISTED AS HAVING ACCESS TO THE STORAGE SPACE. IN LOOKING AT THE ADDRESS FOR [REDACTED] [REDACTED] I FOUND THAT AN ADDRESS OF [REDACTED] CALIFORNIA STREET APARTMENT [REDACTED] WAS GIVEN.

I IMMEDIATELY CONTACTED INVESTIGATOR DAWSON AND SHOWED HIM THE RENTAL CONTRACT FOR THE RAINBOW MINI STORAGE FACILITY. I EXPLAINED THAT I BELIEVED THAT THIS WAS THE FACILITY BEING USED BY [REDACTED] I SUGGESTED TO DAWSON THAT INVESTIGATOR OLSON GO TO THAT LOCATION TO SECURE IT AND TO PREVENT ANY MATERIAL FROM BEING REMOVED FROM IT PRIOR TO THE PREPARATION AND EXECUTION OF A SEARCH WARRANT AT THAT LOCATION.

DURING THE COURSE OF THE EXECUTION OF THE SEARCH WARRANT AT [REDACTED] CALIFORNIA STREET I HAD OCCASION TO GO BEHIND THE GARAGE AREA TO CHECK FOR ANY POSSIBLE EVIDENCE RELATING TO THIS INVESTIGATION. AS I WALKED ALONG A FENCE BORDERING THAT AREA I OBSERVED A SMALL FIBERGLASS GREENHOUSE BUILT ALONG THE FENCE. I COULD SEE THAT BLACK PLASTIC HAD BEEN PLACED ON THE INTERIOR WALL WHICH BORDERED THE FENCE. AS I PASSED THIS LOCATION I DETECTED THE STRONG ODOR OF GREEN GROWING MARIJUANA EMANATING FROM WITHIN THE GREENHOUSE. WHEN I LOOKED AT THE SOUTH WALL OF THE GREENHOUSE I COULD SEE WHAT APPEARED TO BE WHITE PAINT SPRAYED FROM A SPRAY CAN PAINTED ON THE WALL IN A DISTINCTIVE PATTERN.

I TOLD INVESTIGATOR DAWSON ABOUT MY FINDINGS AND CONTINUED ON WITH MY SEARCH INSIDE OF APARTMENT [REDACTED] DURING THE COURSE OF MY SEARCH I OBSERVED A LARGE STACK OF POLAROID PHOTOGRAPHS ON THE DRESSER BESIDE THE EAST SIDE OF THE BED IN THE BEDROOM OF THE APARTMENT. WHEN I LOOKED AT THESE PHOTOGRAPHS I SAW TWO PHOTOGRAPHS WHICH DEPICTED

THE [REDACTED] [REDACTED] INSIDE OF A SMALL GREENHOUSE WHICH CONTAINED GROWING MARIJUANA. IN EXAMINING THE PHOTOGRAPHS FURTHER I COULD SEE THAT ONE OF THE WALLS OF THE GREENHOUSE HAD WHITE SPRAY PAINT IN THE SAME PATTERN WHICH I HAD PREVIOUSLY OBSERVED ON THE GREENHOUSE LOCATED BEHIND [REDACTED] CALIFORNIA STREET. I BROUGHT THESE PHOTOGRAPHS TO THE ATTENTION OF INVESTIGATOR DAWSON AND EXPLAINED THAT [REDACTED] [REDACTED] WAS PRESENT IN THE PHOTOGRAPHS.

AT THAT TIME A DECISION WAS MADE FOR INVESTIGATOR DAWSON TO PREPARE A SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL SEARCH WARRANT TO MY SEARCH WARRANT FOR THE PURPOSE OF SEARCHING THE STORAGE FACILITY IDENTIFIED IN THE PAPERS WHICH I HAD FOUND AS WELL AS THE GREENHOUSE AND STORAGE SHED LOCATED BEHIND [REDACTED] CALIFORNIA STREET.

WHILE INVESTIGATOR DAWSON WAS PREPARING HIS SEARCH WARRANT DETECTIVE FREESE AND I CONTINUED THE SEARCH OF APARTMENT [REDACTED] INVESTIGATOR OLSON WAS IN POSITION TO GUARD THE SECURITY OF THE STORAGE FACILITY FOR WHICH THE SEARCH WARRANT WAS BEING PREPARED BY DAWSON. OFFICER RON HARPHAM WAS THE EUREKA POLICE OFFICER RESPONSIBLE FOR THE EVIDENCE HANDLING CONNECTED TO THE APARTMENT AT [REDACTED] CALIFORNIA STREET APARTMENT [REDACTED].

AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE SEARCH AN ITEMIZED LIST OF THE ITEMS SEIZED WAS LEFT ON THE KITCHEN COUNTER AS WELL AS A COPY OF THE SEARCH WARRANT AND A FORM IDENTIFYING HOW THE SEIZED ITEMS COULD BE RECOVERED AT A LATER DATE. AS A RESULT OF THE SEARCH OF THE APARTMENT 69 ITEMS OF EVIDENCE WERE SEIZED. SOME OF THESE ITEMS CONTAINED NUMEROUS OTHER ITEMS SUCH AS TOOLBOXES FULL OF TOOLS ETC.

SHORTLY AFTER COMPLETING THE SEARCH OF THE APARTMENT, INVESTIGATOR DAWSON RETURNED TO THE SCENE WITH THE SIGNED SEARCH WARRANT IN HAND FOR THE STORAGE FACILITY AND THE GREENHOUSE LOCATED BEHIND [REDACTED] CALIFORNIA STREET. INVESTIGATOR DAWSON, DETECTIVE FREESE AND I WENT TO THE LOCATION AT THE REAR OF [REDACTED] APARTMENT COMPLEX. AT THAT TIME WE WERE ASSISTED BY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT PERSONNEL SGT. KNIGHT, AND DEPUTIES COOPER AND D. FREESE.

INVESTIGATOR DAWSON CONTACTED AN OCCUPANT OF THE RESIDENCE AND GAINED ADMITTANCE TO THE RESIDENCE. SHORTLY AFTER ENTERING THE RESIDENCE DAWSON APPEARED WITH [REDACTED] [REDACTED] AFTER A BRIEF DISCUSSION [REDACTED] VOLUNTARILY AGREED TO ACCOMPANY US TO THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT FOR A STATEMENT IN REGARDS TO [REDACTED] AT THAT TIME INVESTIGATOR DAWSON AND I TOOK [REDACTED] TO THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT FOR A STATEMENT. I TRANSPORTED [REDACTED] IN MY VEHICLE AND SHE WAS NOT RESTRAINED IN ANY MANNER.

A TAPE RECORDED STATEMENT WAS TAKEN FROM [REDACTED] AT THE DETECTIVE BUREAU OF THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT. PRESENT WERE INVESTIGATOR DAWSON AND I. THE INTERVIEW WILL BE TRANSCRIBED AS QUICKLY AS IS POSSIBLE AND THAT TRANSCRIPTION WILL BE INCLUDED WITH THE REPORT FOR FULL DETAILS OF THE INTERVIEW. THE FOLLOWING IS A SUMMARY OF THE INTERVIEW WHICH TOOK PLACE.

[REDACTED] TOLD US THAT SHE AND [REDACTED] HAD LIVED TOGETHER AS MAN AND WIFE FOR THE PAST SEVEN YEARS. [REDACTED] DID SAY THAT THEY WERE NOT LEGALLY MARRIED. [REDACTED] STATED THAT SHE HAD MET [REDACTED] WHEN SHE WAS 15 YEARS OLD AND HAD LIVED WITH HIM SINCE SHE WAS 16 YEARS OLD. [REDACTED] STATED THAT SHE AND [REDACTED] HAD MOVED TO EUREKA ABOUT ONE YEAR AGO FROM THE KLAMATH FALLS AREA OF OREGON. [REDACTED] STATED THAT PRIOR TO THIS THEY HAD BEEN IN THE PORTLAND AREA OF OREGON AND THIS WAS WHERE THEY HAD SPENT MOST OF THEIR TIME.

[REDACTED] STATED THAT THEY HAD COME TO CALIFORNIA TO MAKE A CLEAN START AND GET AWAY FROM THEIR OLD FRIENDS AND PAST. [REDACTED] STATED SHE AND [REDACTED] HAD BEEN IN JAIL AND IN PRISON IN THE PAST AND ADMITTED THEY WERE BOTH WANTED IN THE STATE OF OREGON ON OUTSTANDING CHARGES. [REDACTED] STATED THAT SHE AND [REDACTED] HAD BOTH FOUND JOBS AND HAD BEEN EMPLOYED WHILE THEY WERE LIVING IN EUREKA. [REDACTED] DESCRIBED [REDACTED] AS BEING A HARD WORKER AND STATED HE BROUGHT HOME ABOUT \$600.00 EVERY TWO WEEKS FROM HIS JANITORIAL JOB.

[REDACTED] STATED THAT THINGS HAD BEEN GOING WELL AND SHE FELT THEY HAD CHANGED THEIR LIVES UP UNTIL SEVERAL MONTHS AGO. [REDACTED] STATED AT THAT TIME THAT [REDACTED] BEGAN TO CHANGE AND GET INTO TROUBLE. WHEN PRESSED, [REDACTED] STATED THAT [REDACTED] BEGAN STEALING THINGS FROM PIERSON'S WHILE HE WORKED THERE. [REDACTED] STATED THAT THIS CAUSED SHE AND [REDACTED] TO FIGHT ABOUT HIM "FUCKING UP" AND GETTING THEM BUSTED AGAIN. [REDACTED] TOLD US THAT BECAUSE SHE FOUGHT WITH [REDACTED] ABOUT HIS STEALING THAT [REDACTED] WOULD HIDE WHAT HE WAS DOING FROM HER AS MUCH AS HE COULD.

WHEN DAWSON AND I CONFRONTED [REDACTED] WITH THE LARGE QUANTITY OF STOLEN ITEMS IN THEIR APARTMENT AND HOW SHE COULD BE UNAWARE OF IT SHE ADMITTED THAT PERHAPS SHE JUST DIDN'T WANT TO SEE IT. [REDACTED] TOLD US THAT [REDACTED] WAS UNABLE TO HELP HIMSELF AND HE COULD NOT RESIST STEALING THINGS WHEN LEFT ALONE IN A LARGE STORE FULL OF ITEMS TO STEAL. [REDACTED] STATED THAT HE JUST STOLE DUMB LITTLE SHIT AND SHE DID NOT KNOW WHY. [REDACTED] TOLD DAWSON AND I THAT SHE DID NOT THINK THAT [REDACTED] WAS SELLING THESE THINGS HE WAS JUST TAKING THEM TO HAVE. [REDACTED] SAID THAT SHE HAD NOT SEEN ANY UNUSUAL MONEY IN [REDACTED] POSSESSION AND THEY MADE JUST ENOUGH TO PAY THEIR BILLS.

WE ASKED [REDACTED] ABOUT ANY DRUG USAGE THAT SHE AND [REDACTED] MAY HAVE BEEN INVOLVED WITH. [REDACTED] ADMITTED THAT SHE AND [REDACTED] USED METHAMPHETAMINE. [REDACTED] WAS NOT ANXIOUS TO TALK ABOUT THE DRUG USAGE AND APPEARED TO BE MINIMIZING IT TO ME. WE ASKED HER ABOUT THE LARGE NUMBER OF SYRINGES WE FOUND WITHIN THE APARTMENT. SHE EXPLAINED THAT [REDACTED] HAD PURCHASED THEM IN OREGON ON A RECENT TRIP TO ATTEND A REUNION. [REDACTED] EXPLAINED THAT SYRINGES COULD BE LEGALLY PURCHASED IN OREGON AND [REDACTED] FELT HE COULD RESELL THEM IN EUREKA AND MAKE SOME MONEY.

WHEN [REDACTED] WAS QUESTIONED IN REGARDS TO [REDACTED] CHANGING HIS BEHAVIOR SEVERAL MONTHS AGO AND SPECIFICALLY WAS IT DUE TO USING DRUGS HEAVILY SHE DID NOT WANT TO ANSWER. [REDACTED] WAS TEARFUL AND SAID SHE DID NOT WANT TO SAY, SHE FINALLY DID ADMIT TO THE FACT IT SEEMED LIKELY THAT THIS WAS ONE OF THE PROBLEMS.

DAWSON AND I ATTEMPTED TO GAIN SOME TYPE OF INSIGHT FROM [REDACTED] AS TO THE MIND SET OF [REDACTED] IF HE BELIEVED THAT HE WAS ABOUT TO BE ARRESTED BY THE POLICE. [REDACTED] TOLD US THAT SHE DID NOT THINK [REDACTED] WOULD EVER RESIST ARREST. [REDACTED] SAID HE MIGHT RUN BUT SHE KNEW HE DID NOT HAVE ANY GUNS AND SHE COULDN'T BELIEVE HE WOULD FIGHT. [REDACTED] SAID THAT [REDACTED] WAS PARANOID AND EVEN SEEING THE POLICE WOULD MAKE HIM ACT WEIRD AND UNCOMFORTABLE. [REDACTED] SAID THAT [REDACTED] WAS ALWAYS WORRIED ABOUT GETTING BUSTED AND SENT BACK TO OREGON TO FACE HIS PENDING CHARGES. DAWSON AND I ASKED [REDACTED] IF USING METHAMPHETAMINE WOULD MAKE [REDACTED] VIOLENT AND RESISTIVE SHOULD SOMEONE ATTEMPT TO ARREST HIM. [REDACTED] TOLD US THAT SHE DID NOT THINK SO BUT SHE LATER ADMITTED SHE WAS NOT SURE WHAT WAS GOING ON IN HIS MIND LATELY.

[REDACTED] TOLD DAWSON AND I THAT SHE AND [REDACTED] WERE IN THE PROCESS OF SPLITTING UP AND SHE HAD BEEN IN THE PROCESS OF LOOKING FOR AN APARTMENT SHE COULD MOVE INTO. [REDACTED] ADDED THAT THEY WERE BEING EVICTED FROM THEIR APARTMENT AND THEY WERE BOTH GOING TO BE MOVING. [REDACTED] TOLD US THAT WE COULD SEE THAT BY THE CONDITION OF THE APARTMENT AND ALL THE CONTENTS BEING BOXED UP. [REDACTED] TOLD US THAT [REDACTED] HAD DONE EVERYTHING AND SHE REALLY DID NOT WANT TO LEAVE HIM BUT SHE FELT SHE HAD TO DUE TO HIS THEFT AND DRUG USE.

[REDACTED] TOLD US THAT SHE KNEW [REDACTED] HAD RENTED A STORAGE FACILITY RECENTLY. SHE TOLD US THAT SHE DID NOT KNOW WHERE IT WAS OR WHAT WAS INSIDE OF IT AS SHE HAD NEVER BEEN THERE. [REDACTED] ADDED THAT SHE HAD BEEN TELLING [REDACTED] TO RENT ONE FOR A LONG TIME BECAUSE THE APARTMENT WAS SO SMALL AND THERE WAS STILL BOXES OF JUNK ALL OVER AND IT MADE THE APARTMENT CRAMPED AND JUNKY. WHEN WE ASKED WHY [REDACTED] HAD SOMEONE ELSE RENT THE STORAGE FACILITY IN THEIR NAME SHE COULD OFFER

NO EXPLANATION. WE SHOWED [REDACTED] THE RENTAL CONTRACT WHICH WE FOUND IN THE APARTMENT AND ASKED IF SHE KNEW THE WOMEN WHO HAD RENTED THE UNIT. [REDACTED] LOOKED AT THE CONTRACT AND DID NOT SEEM TO BE FAMILIAR WITH THE PERSON RENTING THE STORAGE UNIT.

[REDACTED] TOLD US AT ONE POINT THAT [REDACTED] HAD TRIED TO GET OUT OF DOING THE CONTRACT AT PIERSON'S BUT HIS EMPLOYER DID NOT WANT TO TRAIN SOMEONE NEW AND THEY WOULD NOT LET HIM QUIT. [REDACTED] STATED THAT [REDACTED] COULD NOT HELP BUT STEAL AND KNEW HE WOULD DO SO AS LONG AS HE WAS CLEANING INSIDE THE STORE AND HAD THE OPPORTUNITY.

[REDACTED] WAS VERY EMOTIONAL DURING OUR INTERVIEW BUT SEEMED TO BE SINCERE AND MOSTLY TRUTHFUL. SHE EXPRESSED THE BELIEF THAT SHE DID NOT KNOW HOW [REDACTED] COULD HAVE RUN INTO THE POLICE AND BEHAVED IN SUCH A MANNER. [REDACTED] CONTINUED TO MAINTAIN THAT [REDACTED] HAD NEVER SAID ANYTHING LIKE THAT AND SHE JUST DIDN'T THINK HE WOULD DO SOMETHING LIKE THAT UNLESS HE WAS SCARED AND HAD PANICKED.

REFER TO THE TRANSCRIBED STATEMENT FOR THE REMAINDER OF OUR INTERVIEW WITH [REDACTED]

AFTER COMPLETING OUT INTERVIEW OF [REDACTED] I GAVE HER A RIDE BACK TO THE NEIGHBOR'S RESIDENCE WHERE SHE HAD BEEN LOCATED INITIALLY. DUE TO HER EMOTIONAL STATE SHE WANTED TO STAY WITH SOMEONE AND THEY WERE WILLING FOR HER TO STAY AT THAT LOCATION. AFTER RETURNING [REDACTED] TO A SAFE LOCATION INVESTIGATOR DAWSON AND I RETURNED TO THE EUREKA POLICE DEPARTMENT TO MEET WITH THE REMAINDER OF THE TEAM AND ASSES WHERE THE INVESTIGATION WAS AND WHAT REMAINED TO BE DONE.

UPON OUR ARRIVAL AT THE EUREKA POLICE DEPARTMENT WE MET WITH ERIC OLSON AND THE OTHER MEMBERS OF THE TEAM. AT THAT TIME I SAW A VERY LARGE QUANTITY OF TOOLS AND HARDWARE SUPPLIES WHICH HAD BEEN REMOVED FROM [REDACTED] [REDACTED] VEHICLE AND FROM THE STORAGE UNIT WHICH HE HAD RENTED. AT THAT TIME PLANS WERE MADE TO RETURN IN THE MORNING AND RESUME THE INVESTIGATION AT THAT TIME.

ON 7-2-98, THE MAJOR INCIDENT INVESTIGATION TEAM ASSEMBLED AT THE EUREKA POLICE DEPARTMENT. AT THAT TIME A STRATEGY WAS DEVELOPED TO COMPLETE THE INVESTIGATION AND ASSIGNMENTS WERE GIVEN. I WAS DETAILED TO HANDLE THE EVIDENCE IDENTIFICATION AND PREPARATION. I BEGAN MY INVESTIGATION BY ARRANGING FOR EMPLOYEES OF PIERSON'S TO MEET US AT THE POLICE DEPARTMENT TO IDENTIFY AND PRICE THE VARIOUS ITEMS WHICH HAD BEEN SEIZED.

I EXAMINED THE WALLET WHICH HAD BEEN TAKEN FROM [REDACTED] AT THE TIME OF

HIS ARREST. I REMOVED ALL OF THE CONTENTS OF THE WALLET AND EXAMINED EACH OF THE ITEMS. I FOUND NO MONEY WITHIN THE WALLET. I FOUND SEVERAL ITEMS OF IDENTIFICATION WHICH CONSISTED OF AN OREGON DRIVERS LICENSE [REDACTED] AS WELL AS A CALIFORNIA ID CARD [REDACTED]. ALSO CONTAINED IN THE WALLET WERE SEVERAL TELEPHONE CREDIT CARDS IN THE NAME OF [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] MOTHER. THE ONLY OTHER ITEMS OF INTEREST IN THE WALLET WERE TWO BUSINESS CARDS FROM RAINBOW MINI STORAGE. ONE OF THESE CARDS HAD THE SECURITY ACCESS CODES WRITTEN ON THE BACK. THE FRONT OF THE CARD HAD THE INSTRUCTIONS FOR ENTERING AND EXITING THE RAINBOW MINI STORAGE FACILITY UTILIZING THE CODES.

AT APPROXIMATELY 1400 HOURS THE EMPLOYEES OF PIERSON'S BUILDING CENTER ARRIVED AT THE EUREKA POLICE DEPARTMENT TO IDENTIFY ALL THE PROPERTY WHICH HAD BEEN SEIZED. THE IDENTIFICATION PROCESS TOOK APPROXIMATELY FIVE HOURS. DURING THIS TIME THE ITEMS WERE ALL TOTALLY ITEMIZED AND A VALUE WAS ESTABLISHED FOR EACH ITEM. LISTS WERE PREPARED OF ALL OF THESE ITEMS WHICH DETAIL HOW EACH ITEM WAS IDENTIFIED AND WHERE EACH ITEM WAS LOCATED IN THE EVIDENCE LISTS. COPIES OF ALL THIS INFORMATION WILL BE INCLUDED IN THE FINAL REPORT FOR SUBMISSION TO THE DISTRICT ATTORNEYS OFFICE.

A TOTAL OF 61 ITEMS WERE REMOVED FROM THE [REDACTED] VEHICLE SOME CONTAINING MORE THAN ONE ITEM. THESE ITEMS ALL APPEARED TO HAVE BEEN REMOVED BY THE [REDACTED] DURING HIS SHIFT AT PIERSON'S PRIOR TO HIS ARREST. REFER TO THE REPORTS PREPARED BY THE OFFICERS WHO CONDUCTED THE SEARCH OF THE [REDACTED] CAR FOR ADDITIONAL DETAILS OF THAT SEARCH.

AT THIS TIME FURTHER ACTION IS PENDING AND THOSE ACTIONS WILL BE MADE A MATTER OF REPORT AS THEY OCCUR.

NARRATIVE STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

MY NAME IS DAVID WALKER, I AM AN INVESTIGATOR WITH THE HUMBOLDT COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT. I HAVE BEEN A DEPUTY SHERIFF FOR 25 YEARS. I HAVE BEEN AN INVESTIGATOR FOR THE PAST 14 YEARS. DURING THE COURSE OF MY CAREER I HAVE INVESTIGATED THOUSANDS OF FELONY CASES WHICH HAVE INCLUDED MURDERS, RAPES, ROBBERIES, BURGLARIES, EMBEZZLEMENTS AND OTHER MAJOR CASES. I HAVE INTERVIEWED MANY [REDACTED] AND PREPARED A WIDE VARIETY OF SEARCH WARRANTS FOR EVIDENCE INVOLVED WITH ALL OF THE CASES WHICH I HAVE INVESTIGATED.

ON 7-1-98, AT APPROXIMATELY 0658 I WAS CONTACTED AT HOME BY DETECTIVE THIEL. AT THAT TIME HE TOLD ME THAT AN OFFICER INVOLVED SHOOTING HAD OCCURRED AND I WAS THE ASSIGNED INVESTIGATOR TO THE INCIDENT REPRESENTING THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT. THE PRELIMINARY INFORMATION I WAS GIVEN INDICATED THAT THE SHOOTING HAD OCCURRED AT PIERSON'S BUILDING CENTER AND THE EUREKA POLICE DEPARTMENT WAS THE AGENCY INVOLVED. AFTER THE NOTIFICATION I RESPONDED TO THE CRIME SCENE TO ASSIST IN THE INVESTIGATION.

I ARRIVED AT PIERSON'S BUILDING CENTER AT 0727 HOURS AND RECEIVED A BRIEF SUMMARY OF THE INCIDENT FROM DETECTIVE PAT FREESE. I WAS TOLD THAT DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S INVESTIGATOR JIM DAWSON WOULD BE IN CHARGE OF THE INVESTIGATION AND HE WAS EN ROUTE TO THE SCENE TO DIRECT THE INVESTIGATION. UPON DAWSON'S ARRIVAL I SPOKE WITH HIM AND HE ASKED THAT I PREPARE A SEARCH WARRANT FOR THE [REDACTED] VEHICLE AND HIS PLACE OF RESIDENCE.

I WAS TOLD BY DETECTIVE FREESE THAT AN INVESTIGATION HAD BEEN IN PROGRESS AT PIERSON'S BUILDING CENTER IN REGARDS TO AN ONGOING THEFT PROBLEM INVOLVING A NIGHT JANITOR. FREESE TOLD ME THAT A SURVEILLANCE HAD BEEN ESTABLISHED AT PIERSON'S ON THE PREVIOUS DAY. EUREKA POLICE DETECTIVES, PARRIS, SODEBURG, LAWSON, RUSSELL AND IDENTIFICATION TECHNICIAN [REDACTED] WERE ALL INVOLVED. FREESE TOLD ME THAT THE [REDACTED] WAS AN INDIVIDUAL IDENTIFIED AS [REDACTED] WHO WAS EMPLOYED BY THE FORTUNA JANITORIAL SERVICE.

DETECTIVE FREESE TOLD ME THAT [REDACTED] HAD ARRIVED AT PIERSONS IN THE EARLY MORNING HOURS AND BEGUN TO WORK. THE EUREKA POLICE PERSONNEL AT THE SCENE OBSERVED THE [REDACTED] REMOVING NUMEROUS ITEMS FROM PIERSON'S DURING THE COURSE OF HIS EMPLOYMENT. [REDACTED] WAS OBSERVED PLACING THESE ITEMS IN THE TRUNK OF HIS CAR AS WELL AS THE PASSENGER COMPARTMENT OF THE VEHICLE.

DETECTIVE FREESE TOLD ME THAT [REDACTED] WAS KEPT UNDER SURVEILLANCE UNTIL HE BEGAN TO LEAVE THE PREMISES IN HIS PERSONAL VEHICLE. AS [REDACTED] BEGAN TO LEAVE HE WAS CONFRONTED BY DETECTIVES PARRIS, LAWSON AND SODEBURG. AT THAT POINT [REDACTED] REFUSED TO STOP AND RAN HIS VEHICLE INTO DETECTIVE PARRIS IN AN ATTEMPT TO RUN OVER HIM. DETECTIVE PARRIS AND THE OTHER DETECTIVES WERE ON FOOT AT THAT TIME. AT THAT POINT A NUMBER OF SHOTS WERE FIRED BY THE INVOLVED OFFICERS AT [REDACTED] AND HIS VEHICLE. AS A RESULT OF THESE SHOTS BEING FIRED [REDACTED] WAS STRUCK AND INJURED AS WAS HIS VEHICLE. [REDACTED] WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY AT THAT TIME.

AT THE TIME I ARRIVED AT PIERSON'S BUILDING CENTER I FOUND THE AREA BLOCKED OFF BY YELLOW POLICE BARRIER TAPE. THE CRIME SCENE WAS FULLY PROTECTED AND THE AREA WAS SECURE. PIERSON'S BUILDING CENTER WAS NOT OPEN FOR BUSINESS AND WAS TO REMAIN CLOSED UNTIL SUCH TIME AS THE CRIME SCENE WAS FULLY INVESTIGATED. AT THE SCENE I OBSERVED A [REDACTED] PONTIAC SITTING JUST OUTSIDE THE CHAIN LINK GATE WHICH SECURES THE PREMISES. I OBSERVED THE VEHICLE TO HAVE OREGON LICENSE PLATES OF [REDACTED] I FURTHER OBSERVED WHAT APPEARED TO BE A NUMBER OF BULLET HOLES IN THE VEHICLE.

DETECTIVE FREESE TOLD ME THAT THE PONTIAC WAS THE VEHICLE WHICH [REDACTED] HAD BEEN OPERATING WHEN HE HIT DETECTIVE PARRIS. I LOOKED INTO THE PASSENGER COMPARTMENT OF THE VEHICLE AND SAW A NUMBER OF ITEMS WHICH APPEARED TO HAVE BEEN REMOVED FROM PIERSON'S BUILDING CENTER. I SAW A NUMBER OF SMALL BUTANE CYLINDERS ON THE FRONT SEAT. I ALSO SAW AN EXTENSION POLE WHICH WOULD BE USED FOR A PAINT ROLLER OR BRUSH. IT APPEARED THERE WAS A CIRCULAR SAW BLADE IN THE VEHICLE AS WELL AS OTHER ITEMS NOT READILY VISIBLE.

AFTER A CURSORY EXAMINATION OF THE VEHICLE I DEPARTED THE SCENE TO SPEAK WITH DETECTIVE PARRIS AND RUSSELL IN REGARDS TO THEIR OBSERVATIONS AT THE SCENE AS WELL AS OTHER INFORMATION THEY MIGHT HAVE IN REGARDS TO [REDACTED]

I SPOKE WITH DETECTIVE RUSSELL AND PARRIS TOGETHER AND ASKED THEM ABOUT THEIR INVESTIGATION. DETECTIVE RUSSELL TOLD ME THAT HE HAD BECOME INVOLVED IN THE INVESTIGATION ON 6-24-98. RUSSELL STATED THAT A POLICE REPORT HAD BEEN TAKEN BY THE EUREKA POLICE DEPARTMENT IN REGARDS TO THEFTS FROM PIERSON'S BUILDING CENTER. THAT CASE IS EUREKA POLICE DEPARTMENT CASE NUMBER 3C98-5118. I HAD OBTAINED A COPY OF THAT CASE AND IT HAS BEEN INCORPORATED IN THIS SEARCH WARRANT FOR FURTHER DETAILS AND REFERENCE.

RUSSELL TOLD ME THAT AFTER HE BECAME AWARE OF THE THEFT HE BEGAN AN

INVESTIGATION AND WAS SOON JOINED BY DETECTIVE PARRIS. RUSSELL STATED THAT HE LEARNED THAT ██████████ WAS EMPLOYED BY THE FORTUNA JANITORIAL SERVICE. DURING THE COURSE OF THAT EMPLOYMENT ██████████ WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR CLEANING PIERSON'S BUILDING CENTER AS WELL AS OTHER LOCATIONS. RUSSELL STATED THAT HE BELIEVED THAT ██████████ HAD BEEN CLEANING PIERSON'S BUILDING CENTER FOR ABOUT TWO YEARS.

BOTH RUSSELL AND PARRIS TOLD ME THAT THE INFORMATION THEY HAD INDICATED THAT ██████████ HAD BEEN STEALING A LARGE NUMBER OF ITEMS FROM PIERSON'S STORE DURING THE ENTIRE TIME HE HAD BEEN WORKING AT THAT LOCATION. IN RESPONSE TO THIS INFORMATION RUSSELL AND PARRIS INITIALLY ATTEMPTED TO CAPTURE ██████████ ON SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS TO VERIFY THE ONGOING THEFT. WHEN THIS ATTEMPT FAILED, A SURVEILLANCE WAS ESTABLISHED AT PIERSON'S ON 6-30-98, BEGINNING AT 1815 HOURS. THE SURVEILLANCE TERMINATED AT ABOUT 0545 HOURS WHEN ██████████ WAS CONFRONTED AND HIS CAPTURE ATTEMPTED.

DETECTIVE PARRIS TOLD ME THAT BECAUSE PIERSON'S BUILDING CENTER IS SO LARGE IT WAS NECESSARY TO USE FIVE OFFICERS TO MAINTAIN SURVEILLANCE OF THE VARIOUS AREAS OF THE STORE. DETECTIVE PARRIS TOLD ME THAT ██████████ ARRIVED AT PIERSON'S AT 0354 HOURS TO BEGIN TO WORK. PARRIS TOLD ME THAT ██████████ DOES NOT NORMALLY WORK AT THIS TIME BUT DID SO ON THIS DATE. PARRIS ADDED THAT ██████████ ALWAYS WORKS IN THE EARLY MORNING HOURS AND IS THE ONLY PERSON PRESENT AT THIS TIME.

PARRIS TOLD ME THAT DURING THE COURSE OF THE SURVEILLANCE ██████████ WAS OBSERVED PLACING NUMEROUS ITEMS IN THE TRUNK OF HIS CAR. PARRIS TOLD ME THAT DETECTIVE SODEBURG SAW ██████████ PLACE SEVERAL LARGE PLASTIC BAGS WHICH CONTAINED NUMEROUS ITEMS IN THE TRUNK OF HIS VEHICLE. PARRIS ADDED THAT THE TRUNK APPEARED TO BE TOTALLY FULL AND ██████████ HAD TO PRESS ALL THE ITEMS DOWN TO CLOSE THE TRUNK. DETECTIVE PARRIS STATED THAT IT WAS NOT KNOWN WHAT WAS CONTAINED IN THE BAGS BUT IT COULD BE SEEN THAT A VARIETY OF OBJECTS WERE WITHIN EACH BAG.

DETECTIVE RUSSELL TOLD ME THAT HE PERSONALLY SAW ██████████ GO TO THE PAINT AREA OF PIERSON'S STORE. RUSSELL STATED THAT HE SAW ██████████ PICK UP 8-10 PACKAGES OF CRAZY GLUE FROM A DISPLAY AND TAKE THEM AWAY. RUSSELL ALSO SAW ██████████ PICK UP A EXTENSION POLE FOR PAINT ROLLERS OR BRUSHES AND TAKE THIS ITEM AWAY. RUSSELL THEN TOLD ME THAT HE SAW ██████████ PICK UP A CIRCULAR SAW BLADE AND HIDE IT UNDER HIS SHIRT PRIOR TO LEAVING THAT AREA OF THE STORE.

DETECTIVE PARRIS TOLD ME THAT IT APPEARED THAT ██████████ WAS CONTINUALLY TAKING ITEMS AS HE CLEANED AROUND THE VARIOUS AREAS LOCATED WITHIN THE STORE. IT APPEARS THAT AS ██████████ ACCUMULATED ENOUGH ITEMS HE

WOULD TAKE THEM TO HIS VEHICLE AND PLACE THEM IN THE TRUNK OR PASSENGER COMPARTMENT.

DETECTIVE PARRIS TOLD ME THAT THEY ALLOWED [REDACTED] TO COMPLETE HIS ACTIVITIES IN PIERSON'S AND WERE PREPARED TO APPREHEND HIM AT THE TIME HE BEGAN TO EXIT VIA THE CHAIN LINK GATE WHERE I SAW [REDACTED] CAR PARKED. PARRIS TOLD ME THAT WHEN [REDACTED] WAS CONFRONTED HE IMMEDIATELY BEGAN TO RESIST AND SUBSEQUENTLY STRUCK PARRIS WITH HIS VEHICLE. AT THAT TIME SHOTS WERE FIRED AND [REDACTED] WAS WOUNDED.

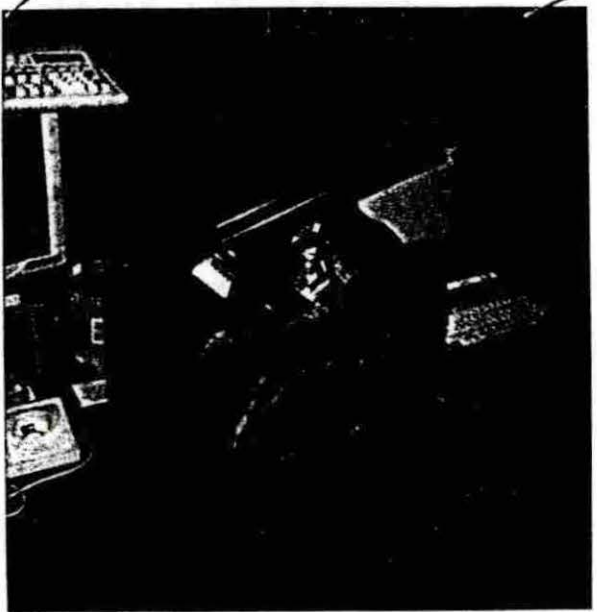
